

The Great War 1914 -18 and Anzac Day Commemorations.

On February 3rd 2014, I had a meeting with Glen Eira History Co-ordinator, Elisabeth and Ann, from the Glen Eira Historical Society, to talk about funding and ideas to commemorate the beginning of the First World War, next year's commemoration of the Gallipoli landings and the first Anzac Day in Glen Eira. To start, we can provided streets or place names that have WW1 connections in the Ormond, McKinnon, Bentleigh and East Bentleigh area. Valma and Joan have given us a few names to start with.

Works at the Cottage

Harry Hawker events.

It has been an interesting exercise while also disappointing. As we returned to contact Chris Hawker we found that the food show he had he piggy backed onto to help us with the commemoration of Harry Hawker's flight out of Caulfield racecourse had fallen through and, without any time to recover the situation, it had to be abandoned. However, a group at Lilydale has contacted Chris and, an event will be held to commemorate Monash's Victorian Militia Forces, at Lilydale in 1914.

The scheduled meeting with His Excellency Alex Churnov, the Governor of Victoria, went ahead on February 3rd, with myself, Chris Hawker, Dale Hawker and David Inglis. Chris Hawker presented the Governor with two engraved glasses and a plaque engraved with a poem to Harry Hawker by Banjo Paterson. This visit commemorated Harry Hawker's flight to Government House, Melbourne, on February 2nd 1914.
