BOX COTTAGE MUSEUM HOME OF CITY OF MOORABBIN HISTORICAL SOCIETY

CMHS was established by a group of local residents to preserve the history and heritage of the (now former) City of Moorabbin in 1960. At the time the municipality began at North Rd & Thomas St and stretched south along Nepean Hwy to include Cheltenham with Clarinda & Heatherton to the east. The City of Moorabbin was dissolved in 1994 and integrated into the new cities of Bayside, Glen Eira, Kingston and Monash.

When Sir Stanley Argyle, 32nd Premier of Victoria, proclaimed Moorabbin a City on 10 October 1934, he noted that Moorabbin [*Mooroobin* in Bunurrung, various spelling] indicated "a resting place". He then went on to say:- "it must not be thought that Moorabbin is by any means quiet". Visit CMHS at the Box Cottage Museum on Open Days or our website and find out why he made that comment.

K G PUTT MEMORIAL CENTRE BENTLEIGH SENIOR CITIZENS' CLUB

City of Moorabbin Historical Society congratulates the KG Putt Bentleigh Senior Citizens' Club in Arthur Street, who recently celebrated the 60th anniversary of their foundation on 27 October 2014. (The club was officially opened by Sir Henry Bolte in 1957.) Club Secretary, Cheryl organised a gala luncheon for the occasion and, with her team of helpers, transformed the club hall into a festive setting for the event.

There was a big turn-up of current members of the many interest and activity groups supported by the club as well as past members, including Mr Keith Duckmanton. Neil Pilling, then Mayor of Glen Eira, said some words. Clr Oscar Lobo spoke briefly, and local Liberal MLA, Ms Elizabeth Miller donated \$200 towards the club. The glittering *Aurora* (of Morning Melodies fame) channelling Shirley Bassey and Liza Minnelli, provided the entertainment. And, everyone commented on how much they enjoyed the occasion thanks to Cheryl and her team.

The club was named after local realtor and Iceberger, Clr KG Putt, J.P., Mayor of the (former) City of Moorabbin from 1954–1955.

During the luncheon, KG's nephew David Jane (also a realtor) spoke of his unde, and donated a cheque for \$1000 to the dub in KG's

memory. David went on to reminisce that back in 1954 hardly anyone had television sets. Robert Menzies was PM. The NZ horse, *Rising Fast* won the Caulfield Cup, the Cox Plate plus the Melbourne Cup, and Footscray won the VFL Grand Final.

A current club member, who was a child in 1954, recalled the excitement over the visit to Melbourne by Queen Elizabeth 11 and Prince Phillip ... how the streets from Essendon Airport to the city were so tightly packed that hundreds fainted. She added, 'back then many women still wore hats, gloves and seamed nylons. Men wore suits, ties, chesty bonds and... could dance.'

LOCAL AVIATOR

Aviation pioneer Harry George Hawker, 1889-1921, who was born in South Brighton (renamed Moorabbin), was inducted into the Australian Aviation Hall of Fame at Wagga Wagga, on 8 Nov 2014. Sir Reginald Ansett and four others "who have made outstanding contributions to the development of aviation and the fabric of Australian life" were inducted along with Harry Hawker.



From 1913 onwards Hawker worked as a designer and test pilot with the Sopwith Company (UK) and he later founded the Hawker Siddeley Engineering Company. However, apart from a plaque at Moorabbin (Harry Hawker) Airport and in primary schools he attended — his accomplishments during WW1 and afterwards are not widely known or prominently memorialised here in his place of birth.

McKinnon Secondary College

McKinnon S.C. celebrated their 60th birthday on 31 August 2014. Their milestone was marked with the launch of a pictorial book, *The Tradition of Excellence*, written by Mr Andrew Newton 'a stalwart of the school'.

The book, with over 500 hundred images and documents, traces the college from its beginnings in 1954 through to the present day. The photographs, both black and white and more recent colour shots, reveal much about each decade and the history of the local area.

UNVEILING OF NEW DISPLAY CABINET


