Frederick Ely was born in Cowlinge Suffolk, in 1838, to George Ely b1793 and Sarah Poulter b1792, both were born in Cowlinge. He came to Australia on the "Ocean Monarch" in 1856 with, most likely, his brother George, aged 34 his wife Elizabeth (Piper) aged 22 and daughters Elizabeth aged two and Harriet aged one.

George and his family settled in the Harcourt area in Victoria, as did his brothers William and Henry.

In 1857, Henry, his wife Mary Anne (Parker) and a daughter came to Australia, and settled in Greensborough for a short time, then moved to Harcourt, taking a large amount of apple tree cuttings and plants from Greensborough, where he, brother William, William Eagle, a childhood friend from Cowlinge, and a Nathan Vick, planted and started apple orchids.

Fred settled in Greensborough, and in 1866 married Elizabeth Poulter also born in Cowlinge Suffolk. Their marriage is registered under the name Elley. Elizabeth and her parents arrived in Australia in 1852.

Fred and Elizabeth lived in Main Street; Fred was a miner, until 1914, then a gardener.

Family History

He and a friend, Fred Passey worked a couple of gold mines in Green Hills/Briar Hill, and it was reported that, "They did very well". Frederick Jeff was living with his parents when he enlisted in 1916.

Fred died in 1915 and Elizabeth in 1916, both are buried at Greensborough Cemetery.

<u>Daughter</u> Mary Ann and husband Henry Splatt, lived in Grimshaw Street, Henry was a carter.

<u>Daughter</u> Betsy Emma and husband Charles Staines, lived in Greensborough, Chas was a cutter.

<u>Son</u> John and wife Melinda(Iredale), lived in Main Street, then Grimshaw Street, John a labourer, later an assistant.

Children, Allen R. m Maisie Love, Phillip O. m Linda Skewes.

John owned land in Grimshaw Street, where he built their home, he subdivided the land, this was when Eldale Avenue came to be, a combination of John's and Melinda's surnames.

He sold a block of land, to Dr. E.R. Cordner, this is where the Cordner house, "Ashmead" was built.

John and Melinda's house later became a Medical Centre, "Ely House". Alan and Maisie's a Physiotherapy Centre.

John died in 1966 and Melinda died in 1952.

Families from Cowlinge, Suffolk (an apple growing area) who came to Australia and settled in Greensborough. Aldridge, Bailey, Buck, Butcher, Chapman, Ely, Foster, Frost, Godwill, Jarvis, Jolly, Limmer, Murking, Palmer, Poulter, Roberts and Rose.
