Dear Friends in Christ, we give thanks to God for the personnel of the Royal Australian and Merchant Navies who serve on our seas.

We pray for the world's fishing fleets, for safety as they go about their work in often-time dangerous conditions.

We pray for those men and women who serve in our naval and defence forces today; those who are parted from family and friends and who make sacrifices to ensure our safety and wellbeing.

Our Father in heaven,


