

A BRIEF OUTLINE OF EARLY DATES AND EVENTS

Prior to 1850 this district was known 'The Park' It was a native bushland of wattles eucalypts and wildflowers, inhabited by Kangaroos, Echidnin's, Wombats, Bandicoots native birds and Possums.

The first Crown Allotments here were purchased by Charles Heape & Francis McDonnell in 1854

In 1902 Tom Petty and his wife Eliza purchased 500 acres of this land and established eighty orchard blocks with rows of pine trees as wind breaks and with 10 dams.

Eva & Minnie Gibb later acquired this property (1914) with William Sell as caretaker.

By 1920 more orchards had been established and a small community resided in the locality. Some of the families living here were: Mitchell, Domeney, Brown, Milne, Zoch, Tortice, Sell, Coleman, Johansen, Brownlie, Grant, Morrow and Porter.

The 'Park Orchards Country Club Estate' was launched in 1926 by Timber Merchants Sharp & Taylor. They purchased all of the Gibb & Sell land. Tuxon & Miller who had worked with Walter Burley Griffin surveyed the estate and subdivided most of it into half-acre blocks following the contours of the land - similar to Canberra. This subdivision eventually became the village of Park Orchards. 'The Estate' consisted of a Cricket Ground, Croquet Lawn, Tennis Courts, Swimming Pool and a Club Hall (Chalet). A nine hole golf course was added in 1931. Gates were positioned at the entrance to the estate and a covenant was placed on all lots to preserve residential status. At this time Sharp and Taylor cleared sections of the estate surrounding the Golf Course to plant Pine Plantations. These trees eventually self-seeded to produce the pines we see today.

In 1940 The Australian Army Signals acquired the Chalet and adjacent property for a Wireless Communications Centre. Power and water mains were brought in and four hundred army personnel were accommodated here in tents and huts. Large rhombic antennas were erected pointing to the pacific. The Chalet and Golf Course became temporary recreational facilities.

After the war the Army moved out and in 1947 Sharp & Taylor sold the estate land to a jewellery store in Bourke St.- Edments as a staff provident fund and recreation facility. The Army sold the Chalet and six acres to V.R. Jones who opened it as a Cabaret. The Edwards family later purchased it and established the Chalet Restaurant we know today.

Over the next ten years the population of Park Orchards grew slowly. Some significant events were:

1958 Milk Bar was opened.

Post Office was opened

1961 Park Orchards Primary School (P.O.P.S) was opened

1962 **Bushfires** came through Warrandyte and swept through Park Orchards to Mitcham.

1965 Council purchased **Domeney Reserve** and constructed a pavilion.

1966 Tennis Club was formed

1967 Park Orchards Ratepayers Association was formed

1968 Council purchased '100 Acres' from Julius Grant.

1969 The **private street scheme** was approved and constructed.

1978 Community Leisure Time Activities (P.O.L.T.A) established.

1980 St Anne's Primary School opened.

1982 Council purchased the property for the Community House.

1986 The Community House was Incorporated – POCHI
