



Real estate partners Allan and Richard Carter explain the fundamentals of real estate to staff writer Harald Nichoson.

Because of their current diamond jubilee I took the opportunity the other day to talk to second and third generation partners of C.E. Carter and Son, real estate agents, 122 Whitehorse Road, Ringwood.

Allan Carter, second generation, and son, Richard, third generation, talked to me informally about real estate as a profession and its future.

Commencing at an historical stage when practically anyone could be asked to sell your property, the stage was eventually reached when some regulative process had to be introduced and a system of

licensing was given legal force. The original system was simple and a licence could be obtained provided the applicant was recommended by worthy people.

Turning to Mr Allan Carter, I asked him what were the qualifications required to make a successful estate agent.

Speaking from long experience, Mr Carter said that first and foremost a man or woman entering the real estate business should be prepared to work a 60 hour week.

Furthermore, and this was emphasised by both senior and junior, real estate is a job that pays by results. It's a job that

doesn't carry passengers.

It was also pointed out to me that real estate involves matters which are becoming increasingly complex. Town planning, law and finance, to mention three of the broad headings that encapsulise the complex matters to which I have referred.

Both Allan Carter and son, Richard laid emphasis on the fact that while knowledge was necessary everything must be based on professional integrity which includes truthful presentation in selling.

Looking to the future, Richard Carter said that while in-

creased general knowledge in the community might encourage property vendors to do their own selling, he believed that because of the growing complexity to which I've referred those who try to do their own real estate buying and selling will discover very quickly the value of the expertise built up by the real estate profession over many years.

As I listened to what the two partners had to say I felt that their words heavily underlined the reason why the Carter organisation had survived in a highly competitive field and why they had earned and retained respect in the community of our eastern suburbs.

C.E. Carter & Son celebrate sixty years

The Ringwood-based estate agency of C.E. Carter & Son is celebrating its 60th anniversary.

The firm, which has become somewhat of an institution over the years, was founded by the late Charles Ernest Carter in 1923. "C.E." was previously a storekeeper operating the general store at Vermont in the early 1900's. His trips by horseback to the receiving office of the old E.S. & A. Bank in Ringwood led him ultimately to set up business in that town.

"C.E." had some prior experience in real estate back in the depression of the 1890's following the collapse of the land boom. He saw houses which cost 250 pounds to build being sold for a fraction of their cost for removal. There seemed little profit in this and he did not return to the industry until after the First War, when he backed his judgement that Ringwood — because of Its location — had a great He saw houses which cost future

When he set up shop in 1923 — on Main St near what is now Safeway Cor-ner — Ringwood was a quiet orchard based town-ship and was still part of the Shire of Lillydale.

"C.E." must have been game then, because at 45 years of age with 6 children to support, he had to compete with about six other estate agency firms. He survived whereas not all the others did.

C.E. Carter ran the busi-ness with his daughter Peg during those early years and what tough times they were, with the Depression, the Second World War, Land Sales Control and numerous smalltown problems to contend with. Years later he was heard to remark that "the first 25 years were the hardest!"

C.E. was joined by his son Allan Ballard Carter in 1947. Whilst A.B. Carter had had some experience working in the business whilst at school, he had

become caught up by the War and served six years in the British Army. Growth

It was during the time the firm was run by A.B. Carter — particularly after the retirement of C.E. Car-ter in 1955 — that Ring-wood's tremendous wood's tremendous growth took place. Ring-wood changed during this period from an orchard district to a dormitory sub-urb of Melbourne.

The third generation, Richard Allan Carter, joined the firm in 1972 after completing an econom-ics degree at Monash University. The firm is now run jointly by Allan and Richard Carter.

It has a work force of nine. The Caters are both licensed estate agents, registered valuers and auctioneers. The sales de-partment also contains Kent Longmate and Del-mar Helland, both of whom have had over ten years experience in real years experience in real estate, mainly locally. Both are also fully licensed agents.


The firm has one of the largest property manage-ment departments in the area. It is headed by lan Booth, a registered valuer who is assisted by Graeme Kelly.
