SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR RINGWOOD RIFLE RANGE.

1. No person shall be allowed to load his rifle until he has taken his place at the firing point and is about to fire. While adjusting sight and while loading, the muzzle of the rifle must be held toward the target. Should any interruption in the firing take place, every shooter whose rifle is loaded shall at once unload.
2. After his last shot each shooter must go through the unloading motions with the muzzle of his rifle pointing towards the target and must leave the mound with the breech of his rifle open and draw the attention of the range officer to the fact that the rifle is unloaded.
3. Change of Markers:- Markers to use path along fence going to and from the butts. New markers to stay out of line of fire until called into butts. Shooting to be stopped and all rifles unloaded before markers are changed.
4. All non shooters and children to keep behind barricades while shooting is in progress.
5. When shooting is taking place from 600 yd. mound all cars are to be parked behind 600 yd. mound.
6. ~~When shooting is taking place from 600 yd. mound all foot traffic between parking area and but to be made along the fence between the fence and the first row of trees.~~
7. When shooting is taking place from 600 yd. mound children are to be kept behind mound ~~or in the hut~~ at all times.
8. When 25yd. targets are being used from 500 or 300 yd. mound, targets must only be inspected or changed under instructions from the range officer.
9. No unauthorised persons or children to enter butts.

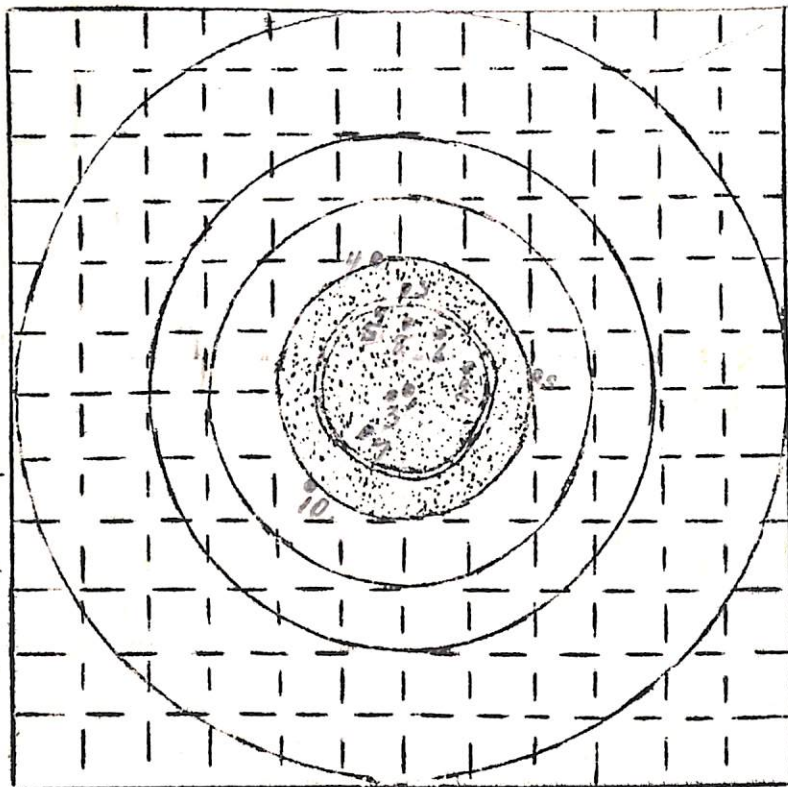

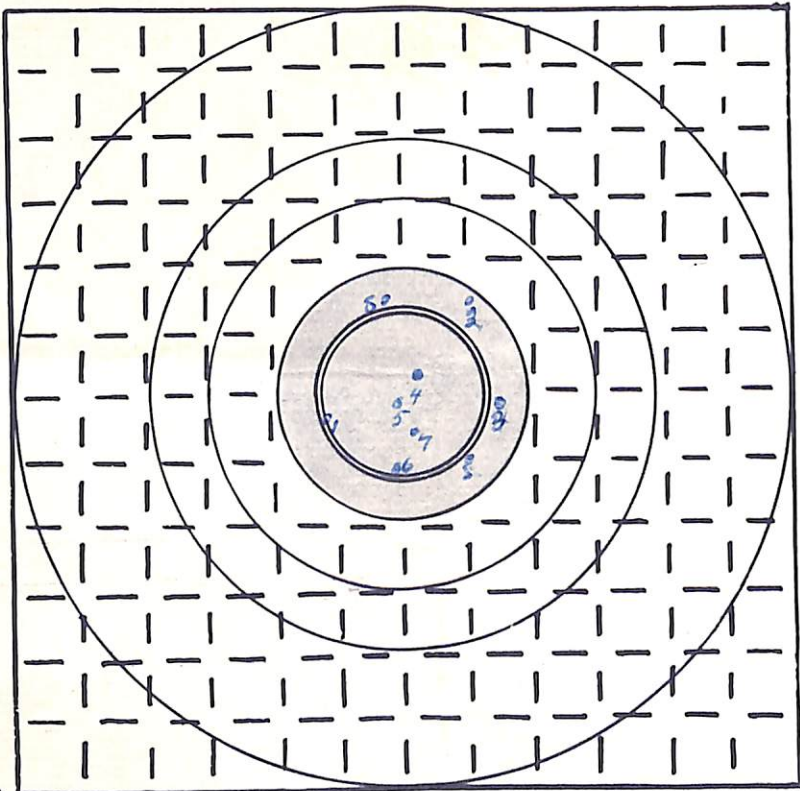

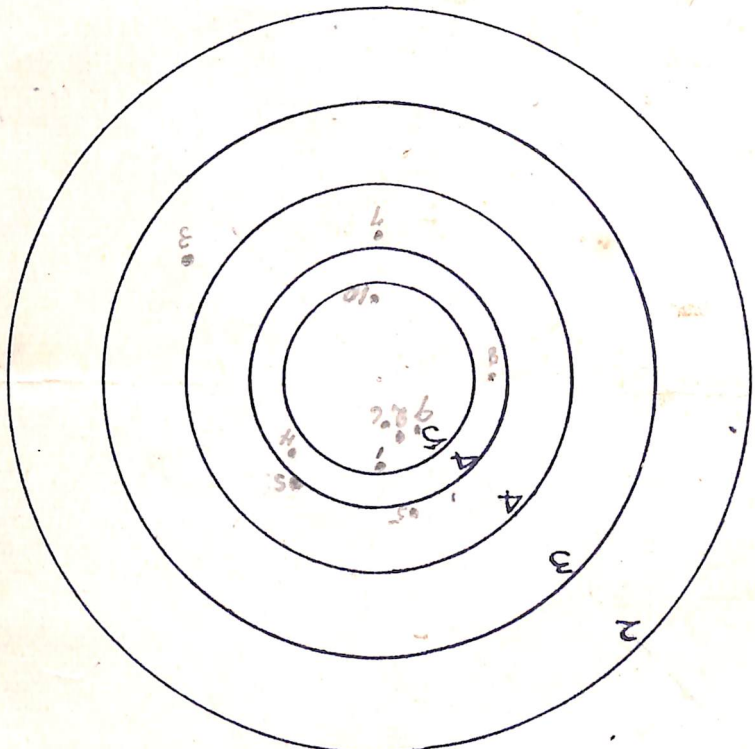

He was an honorary member of the Police Rifle Club. He leaves a wife and son.

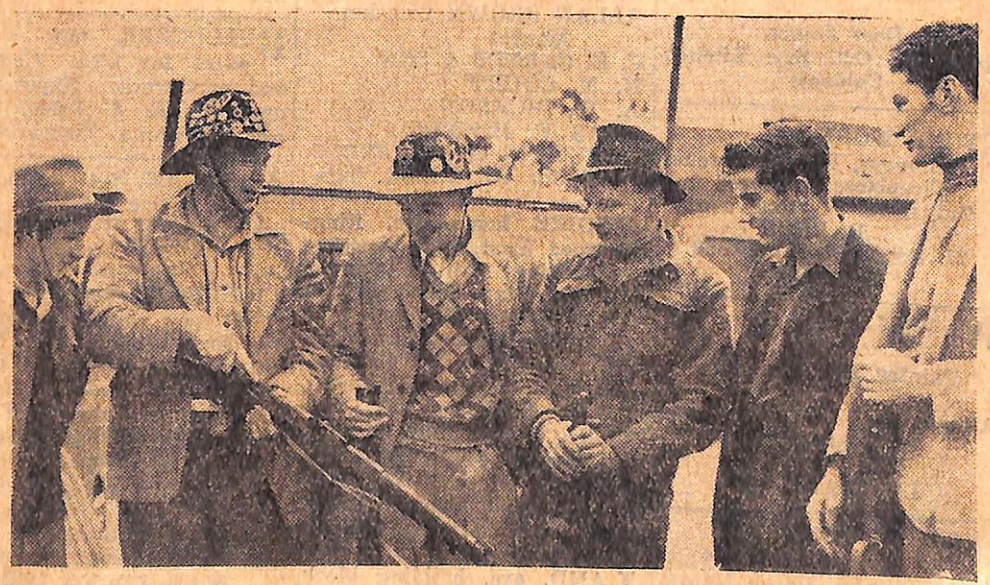
