RULES OF COMPETITION

1. All entries must be in writing on the Society's Entry Form and accompanied by fee and stamped addressed envelope. All correspondence must be addressed to the Secretary, Mrs. K. JENKYN, 22 Greenwood Street, Ringwood.
2. The Committee reserves the right to cancel any section if insufficient entries are received and the adjudicator has the right to withhold any prize.
3. All Open Section competitors must state on Entry Form the title of piece to be given. No alterations will be allowed without the consent of the Adjudicators.
4. In all competitions which are subject to an age limit, the age at closing of entries on July 1 will be deemed the competitor's age.
5. Copies of Own Choice items must be provided for the Adjudicator and be in the hands of the Secretary 48 hours before the commencement of the competitions.
6. Competitors will receive a time table, showing date and time of appearance.
7. Any competitors not appearing when called upon may be liable to disqualification.
8. Adjudicators' decision shall be final. All other disputes shall be dealt with by the Committee.
9. Prizes may be collected on the night of competition.
10. Official accompanists will be provided by the Society but a competitor may bring own accompanist if desired. Such accompanist must, however, pay for admission. Advice is desired if own accompanist is to appear.
11. Stamps will not be accepted as Entry Fees. All Postal Orders must be made payable at Ringwood Post Office.
12. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.
