
GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITORS

- 1. All entries must be in writing on the Society's Entry Form and accompanied by fee and stamped, addressed envelope. All correspondence must be addressed to the Secretary, Mrs. L. GOWERS, 6 Lena Grove, Ringwood. Phone WU7006.
- 2. The Committee reserves the right to award only one prize in the event of there being six or under entries.
- 3. All Open Section competitors must state on Entry Form the title of piece to be given. No alterations will be allowed without the consent of the Adjudicators.
- 4. In all competitions which are subject to an age limit, the age at closing of entries on July 21 will be deemed the competitor's age.
- 5. Copies of Own Choice items must be provided for the Adjudicator and must be in the hands of the Secretary 48 hours before commencement of competitions.
- 6. Competitors will receive a timetable showing date and time of appearance.
- 7. Any competitor not appearing when called upon may be subject to disqualification.
- 8. The Adjudicators' decision will be final. All other disputes will be dealt with by the Committee.
- 9. A Grand Concert will be given on August 26 when first prize winners will render the selections with which Sections were won. Non-appearance of prize winners may render them liable to forfeiture of prize money.
- 10. Official Accompanists will be provided by the Society, but a competitor may bring own accompanist if desired. Such accompanist must, however, pay for admission. Advice is desired if own accompanist is to appear.
- 11. Stamps will not be accepted as Entry Fees. All Postal Orders must be made payable at Ringwood Post Office.
 - 12. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.
 - 13. All Vocal items will be sung in English.
- 14. In the event of a tie in any section, prize moneys will be divided at the discretion of the Committee.
- 15. No person will be permitted on stage with accompanists during the Ballet sections.
