GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITORS

1. All entries must in writing on the Society's Entry Form and accompanied by fee and stamped addressed envelope. All correspondence must be addressed to the Secretary, Mrs. W. P. BURGESS, "Charmwood," Warrandyte Road, Ringwood, WU 7211.

2. The Committee reserves the right to award only one prize in the event of there being six or under entries.

3. All Open Section competitors must state on entry form the title of piece to be given. No alterations will be allowed without the consent of the Adjudicators.

4. In all competitions which are subject to an age limit, the age at closing of entry on July 13th will be deemed the competitor's age.

5. Copies of Own Choice items must be provided for the Adjudicator and must be in the hands of the Secretary 48 hours before commencement of competitions.

6. Competitors will receive a time-table showing date and time of appearance.

7. Any competitor not appearing when called upon may be subject to disqualification.

8. The Adjudicators' decision will be final. All other disputes will be dealt with by the Committee.

9. A Grand Concert will be given on August 25th, when first prize winners will render the selections with which Sections were won. Non-appearance of prize winners may render them liable to forfeiture of prize money.

10. Official accompanists will be provided by the Society, but a competitor may bring own accompanist if desired; such accompanist must, however, pay for admission. Advice is desired if own accompanist is to appear.

11. Stamps will not be accepted as entry fees. All Postal Orders must be made payable at Ringwood Post Office.

12. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.

13. All Vocal items will be sung in English.

14. In the event of a tie in any section, prize moneys will be divided at the discretion of the Committee.
