GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITORS

closing of entry on July 11th will be deemed the competitor's age.

5. Copies of own choice items must be provided for the Adjudicator and must be in the hands of the Secretary 48 hours before commencement

6. Competitors will receive a timetable showing date and time of

appearance.

7. Any competitor not appearing when called upon may be subject to disqualification.

8. The Adjudicators' decision will be final. All other disputes will be

dealt with by the Committee.

- 9. A Grand Concert will be given on August 26th, when first prizewinners will render the selections with which sections were won. Nonappearance of prizewinners may render them liable to forfeiture of prize money.
- 10. Official Accompanists will be provided by the Society, but a competitor may bring own accompanist if desired; such accompanist must, however, pay for admission. Advice is desired if own accompanist is to

12. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.

13. All vocal items will be sung in English.

14. In the event of a tie in any section, prize moneys will be divided at the discretion of the Committee.
