GENERAL RULES FOR COMPETITORS

- All entries must be in writing on the Society's Entry Form and be accompanied by fee and stamped self-addressed envelope. STAMPS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS ENTRY FEES. All postal orders to be made payable to the Ringwood Eisteddfod and all correspondence addressed to the Secretary of the respective sections.
- 2. The Committee reserves the right to award only one prize in the event of there being six or less entries in any one section.
- 3. In all sections which are subject to an age limit, the age at closing of entry, viz: 19th June, 1968, will be deemed the competitor's age.
- 4. Copies of own choice items must be provided for the Adjudicators (NOT MANUSCRIPT).
- 5. Competitors will receive a timetable showing the date and time of appearance.
- 6. Competitors MUST appear in the order in which they are shown on their timetable and no competitor will be permitted to change the date on which he or she is to appear in any section.
- 7. The Adjudicator's decision will be final, all other disputes will be dealt with by the Committee.
- 8. A Grand Concert will be given on the 8th September, 1968, when all Prize Winners must be available if called upon by the Committee. Contestants performing at the final concert will render the selections with which sections were won. Non-appearance of prize winners may render them liable to forfeiture of prize money at the Committee's discretion.
- An Official Accompanist will be provided by the Society for the Vocal Sections, but a competitor
 may bring own Accompanist if desired, such Accompanist must, however, pay for admission.
- 10. Teachers are NOT permitted on stage during rendition of items and must pay for admission.
- 11. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.
- 12. All vocal items to be sung in English (with the following exceptions:—) (a) Competitors in the Lieder section may sing in the original language if they so desire, (b) Finalists in the Aria may sing their second choice Aria in any language.
- In the event of a tie in any section, prize monies will be divided at the discretion of the Committee.
- 14. The Committee reserves the right to substitute another Adjudicator in any section in the event of the Adjudicator being unable to fulfil his or her engagement. NO entry fees will be refunded.
- 15. All competitors entering in The Ringwood Aria must sing in at least one other section.
- 16. The Ringwood Aria will not be included in the Aggregate Points.
- 17. For the Aggregate Trophy, points will be allocated as follows: First, 5 pts.; second, 3 pts.; third, 1 pt.
