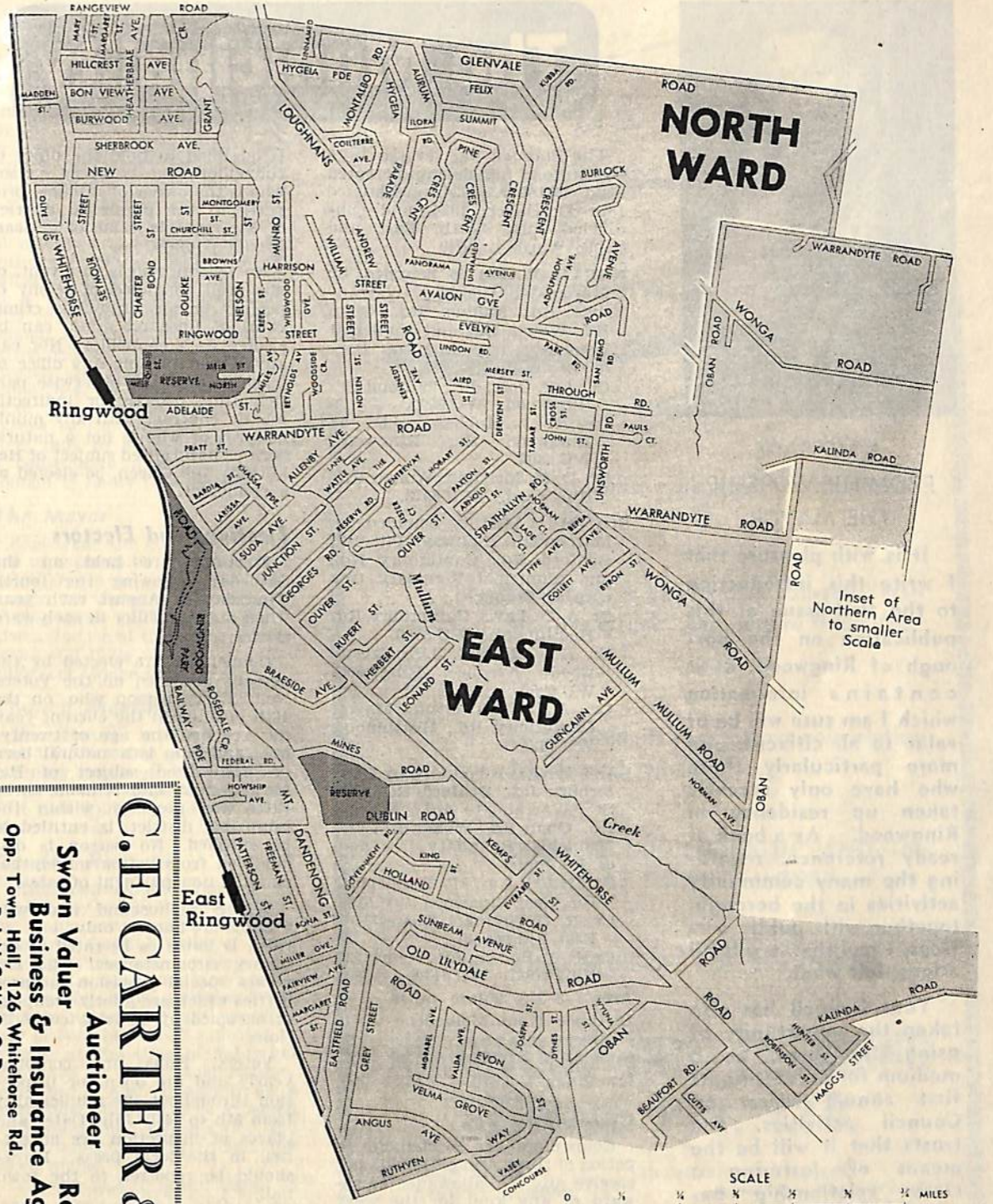
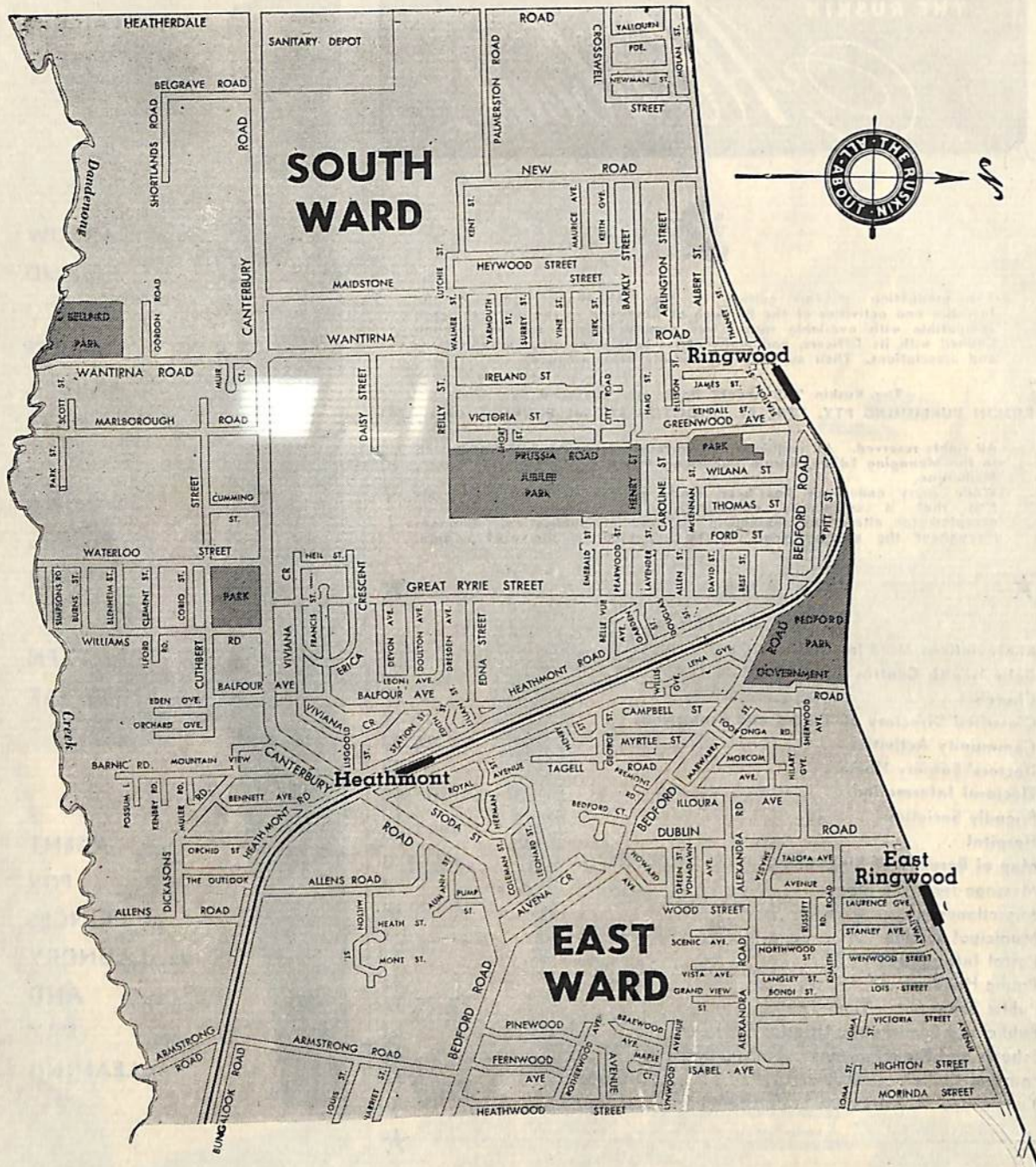

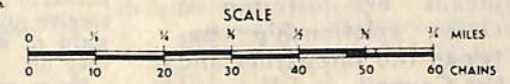

The Municipality

The Borough was severed from the Shire of Lillydale and created 22nd October, 1924, proclaimed 13th December, 1924, and subdivided into North, East and South Wards in 1949.

Councillors

Councillors are elected for a period of three years. They do not receive any fee, allowance or reward of any kind for the work they do.

Every person liable to be rated in respect of property in the municipal district of the rateable value of at least twenty pounds, and who has been liable for at least three months immediately before nomination day for the election for which he is standing,

is qualified to hold the office of councillor. So is every person who is the owner of rateable property in the municipal district, of the rateable value of at least twenty pounds.

No person who is insolvent, or has been convicted of felony or perjury or any infamous crime, or is of unsound mind, can be elected as a councillor. Nor can any person holding any office or place of profit or otherwise participating, directly or indirectly in any contract with any municipality, or who is not a natural born or naturalised subject of Her Majesty the Queen, be elected as a councillor.

Elections and Electors

Elections are held on the Saturday following the fourth Thursday in August each year, when one councillor in each ward retires.

Councillors are elected by the persons inscribed on the Voters' Roll. Every person who, on the 10th of June in the current year, has reached the age of twenty-one, and who is a natural born or naturalised subject of Her Majesty and who is liable to be rated for property within the municipal district, is entitled to be enrolled. No person is disqualified from voting merely because of non-payment of rates.

Where a husband and wife occupy a house, only one of them is liable to be rated in ordinary circumstances. The law makes special provision for properties which are jointly occupied, or occupied by business corporations.

Voters' Rolls are compiled yearly and are open for inspection throughout the municipality from 8th to 14th July. Dates and places of inspection are advertised in the local press. Errors should be reported to the town hall.

Rolls are prepared for each ward separately, so a person who is liable to be rated for property in more than one ward can be on more than one ward roll. At the 1953 election there were 1,667 voters enrolled for North Ward, 2,584 for South Ward, 2,160 for East Ward, total 6,411.

Councillors' Responsibilities

Councillors are prohibited by law from having any interest, directly or indirectly in any contract which the council may let. They are individually responsible for the actions of the council, so that, for example, in some cases council debts may be recovered from councillors personally.

Every councillor who behaves in a disorderly manner at council meetings and who refuses to withdraw or apologise when called on by the Mayor, is liable to a penalty. Every councillor who votes on or discusses in the council any subject in which he or his partners has directly or indirectly any financial interest, is liable to a penalty. Every councillor who without reasonable excuse to the council's satisfaction, fails to attend more than 3 consecutive meetings of the council is liable to a penalty.

The Mayor

Each year the councillors elect one of them to be chairman, and he is known as the Mayor. The mayor, by virtue of his office, is a magistrate of the city. He is also a Justice of the Peace for his term, and if he remains a councillor, for twelve months after.

Council Meetings

The council meets every 1st and 3rd Thursday at 8.15 p.m. at ordinary meetings. It is also empowered to hold special meetings. The public may attend any meetings.

Council Revenue

Ringwood Council obtains its revenue by the Unimproved Capital Value system of rating. Unimproved Capital Value of Land means that sum which the land, if it were held for an estate in fee simple, unencumbered by any mortgage, might in ordinary circumstances, be expected to realise at the time of valuation if offered for sale on such reasonable terms and conditions as a bona fide seller might be expected to require and assuming that the improvements, if any, had not been made.

Unimproved Capital Value at 30th September, 1953, was £1,233,225. General Rate for 1953-54 is 9d. in £1 of Unimproved Value.

Council Committees

To help the council in the conduct of its business at meetings, and to investigate detailed mat-

Committees are responsible to the full council and their decisions are brought to the Council as recommendations which the Council adopts, modifies or rejects as it sees fit.

The council elects one or more of its members to represent it on these bodies, or in some cases, groups of cities elect a representative.

City Services

Town Clerk and Treasurer: Alfred Kelly, F.I.M.A.

The Ringwood Town Hall is on Maroondah Highway, Ringwood. Telephones WU 6616-7.

All enquiries and payments for municipal services should be made at the town hall during office hours: 8.40 a.m.-5.15 p.m. Monday-Friday. Duty Officer attends Saturday mornings 8.40 a.m.-12 noon.

All correspondence should be addressed to The Town Clerk, Town Hall, Ringwood.

Your Address

Within 21 days of becoming the occupier of any premises in the municipality, you must, as the law requires, give the town clerk in writing your full name, occupation, description of the premises, last place of residence, and advice as to whether you are occupier only, or also owner.

The occupier is responsible for numbering his house correctly and legibly on the front gate or gatepost. You may obtain this number from the town hall.

Buildings

Buildings must conform to the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria. All architects and builders are familiar with these.

The borough has zones for light industry, homes and shops. When buying land you should check that you will be able to use it for your purpose.

You cannot legally build in the borough without a permit from the council. All building problems should be referred to the Building Surveyor, Mr. D. R. Steele, who attends at the town hall Monday to Friday, 9-10.30 a.m.

The master plan prepared by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works is now available for inspection at the town hall.

Roads, Drains, Etc.

All enquiries and complaints should be made to the Borough Engineer's department at the town hall. After hours Borough Overseer may be reached at WU 6636.

The Local Government Act prescribes that vehicles are not

permitted to cross channels and footpaths without a proper crossing being constructed to the council's approval. If you desire a crossing apply to the Borough Engineer's Department.

Rubbish

Collection from within the declared garbage area is weekly. An annual charge is made for collection. Garbage tins must not hold more than 3 cubic feet. They must have close fitting fly- and rat-proof lids and proper handles.

Rubbish may not be dumped on vacant land, roads, or rights-of-way. For disposal of rubbish other than household garbage, apply to Borough Engineer's office; a vehicle for the collection of heavy refuse is at various points in the Borough from time to time.

Although strictly speaking no person may light a fire in the open without a permit from the council, this is not insisted on for the burning of clean garden rubbish in a properly made incinerator. However, no rubbish may be burned on Sunday or Monday, or so as to inconvenience neighbors. No person may fire rubbish or grass other than in an incinerator, without first obtaining the necessary permit and notifying the Fire Brigade.

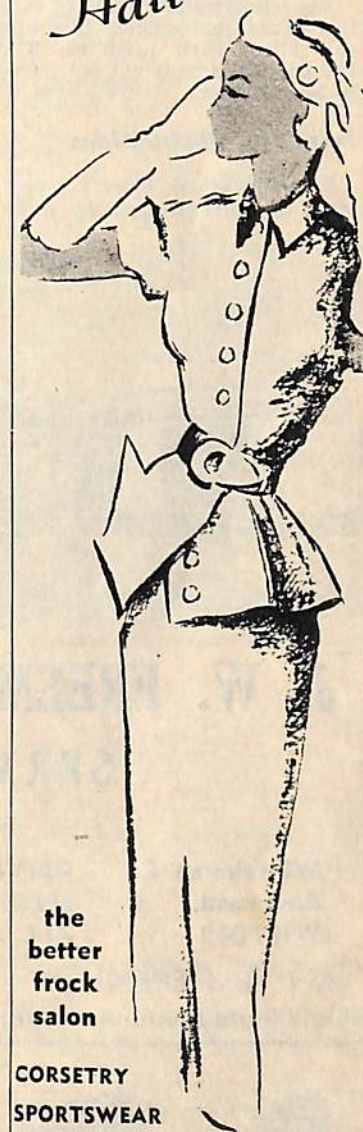
Animals

The Dog Inspector and Ranger is Mr. L. C. Steeth. The pound is on Maroondah Highway, Ringwood. WU 6286.

You may not keep any animals contrary to provisions of the Health Act or prescribed regulations. You may not keep noisy animals or birds likely to annoy neighbors. Cattle must be kept within a substantial fence, and may not be grazed on roadways or open land.

Dogs must be registered each year before the 15th March. Licences are available at the Town Hall for 5/- a year, or £2/15/- for Alsatians. Not more than 2 dogs may be kept on any premises without the written consent of the council. Dogs may not be taken into any garden (so designated by the council) or into any shopping area or reserve unless on a chain or a leash. Grey-

hounds or whippets must be muzzled and on a leash when taken into any street.

The council will remove stray dogs and animals killed in the streets. Ring the Dog Inspector.

Pests

Householders are urged to control as far as possible flies and rats about their premises. The council will supply rat baits free to householders.

Footpath Obstructions

Penalties are provided for persons allowing hedges or other

plants to overhang footpaths so that passers-by may be struck. Hedges within 10 feet of corners must not be more than 3 ft. 6 ins. high.

By-laws forbid depositing building or other material on streets. Such material when delivered must be put on the property or, if left in the street, quickly removed.

Parking Vehicles

Do not form a double line. Do not leave vehicles parked on roads or nature strips all night. Parking is restricted on part of

Maroondah Highway, but a free car park is available in the recreation reserve behind the town hall.

Posters

Posting on footpaths, council buildings or electric light poles is prohibited. So is writing, painting or otherwise defacing or marking such surfaces.

Reserves and Gardens

Equipment provided in children's playgrounds should not be used by other than children. Playing football in gardens is prohibited, and so is the grazing and riding of horses. Dogs must not be taken into reserves unless on a chain or leash.

Street Lights

Immediate advice of street lighting faults should be given to the S.E.C. so that they can be given prompt attention. Ring WU 6621, or after hours WU 6727, 1121, 6238, or 6404.

Diphtheria Immunisation

This service is free, and available to children over the age of 6 months. Full information may be obtained from the Health Inspector.

Removing or Damaging Trees

It is an offence for any person to remove or damage any tree on streets or roads under council control, but when this is necessary, application should be made to the council. If permission is granted, the work will be done by council employees and at council expense.

The past financial year had to bear ever increasing costs, which were beyond the control of your Council. The basic wage rose 11/- or 4.8%. This increase was also reflected in the services and materials your Council bought. The present steadying of wages is welcome, and should be reflected in more stable costs during the current year.

FINANCIAL:

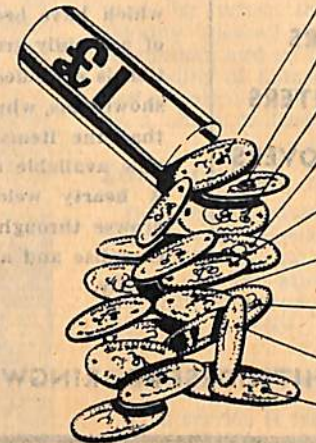
INCOME: During the year income was £76,063, and when compared with £66,311 received in 1951-1952 shows an increase of £9,752. The increase in costs and additional service supplied to Ratepayers necessitated a greater income.

The surplus is indeed gratifying. It has enabled your Council in the coming year to slightly reduce the general rate in spite of a considerable increase in costs when compared with a year ago and to provide correspondingly greater facilities during the coming year.

HEALTH:

Vaccination — During the year 667 children of school and pre-school age were vaccinated for Smallpox.

Immunisation—1,133 children of school age were immunised against Diphtheria, and 129 children of pre-school age were treated.

TREES: In the past year, approximately 420 additional trees were planted in streets and parks.

BATHS: During the past season 43,438 adults and children patronised the baths, of which 4,600 local school children were granted free admittance together with 1,108 attendances by Swimming Club Members, who were also admitted free.

Visits by school children outside the Municipal district totalled 3,408 and in all representatives of 17 schools patronised the baths.

LOOKING AT 1954:

New Shopping Area

Your Council proposes to widen the right-of-way at the rear of the north side of Maroondah Highway between Melbourne and Adelaide Streets.

New Infant Welfare Centre

As the result of sterling efforts over the years on the part of the Infant Welfare Centre Auxiliary, with the help of the local Militia Unit, in raising funds, your Council is now in a position to proceed with the erection of a new brick Centre.

East Ringwood Community Hall

The East Ringwood Progress Association recently donated to the Council the sum of £600 toward the cost of a new hall to be erected on the Knaith Road Reserve.

Private Street Construction

With the Ford Street, Thomas Street, group of streets almost completed and the East Ringwood group well under way, your Council now seems assured of obtaining finance for the construction of the William Street (North Ringwood) group of streets.

Rates — General

As previously mentioned, your Council finished its financial year with a small surplus, which has enabled it to reduce the rate in the £ from 9.125d. to 9d. on the Unimproved Capital value of rateable property for the year 1953-1954.

In conclusion, may I say that your Council will, during 1954, endeavor to provide its ratepayers with such additional amenities and services as it is able to supply having regard for its overall financial obligations and limitations.

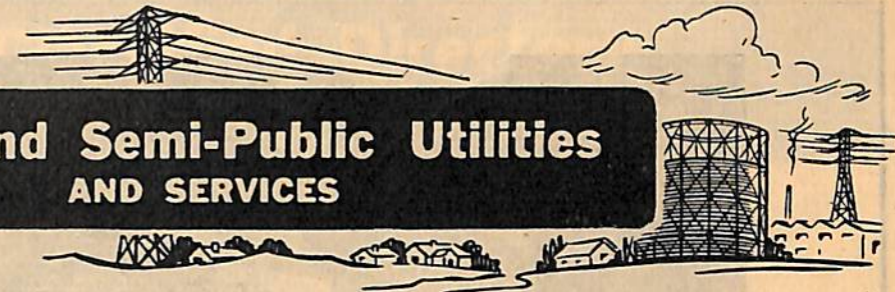

Water

The council has an agreement with the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works whereby the Board supplies and reticulates water to those parts of the borough needing it. The water rate is 15d. in £1 on the Net Annual Value of assessable property in the borough supplied with water from a main or abutting on that part of any road or street in which a main is laid. Minimum rate payable is 23/-, except for land abutting as aforesaid, on which there is no building, and which is not supplied with water, in which case the minimum rate payable is 10/-.

The council takes 2d. of every 15d. (except for excess water) to offset costs of collecting the water rate. The balance goes to the M.M.B.W. in quarterly payments.

The council has from time to time conferred with the board about extension to Ringwood of the lower Metropolitan water rate, but so far without success. Efforts to obtain this rate are continuing.

Sewerage

Ringwood is in an unsewered area, and until the borough is sewered by the M.M.B.W., residents may use pan closets, bacteriologic or septic tanks (disposal area of 5,000 sq. ft. required), septic closets, or chemical closets. Ringwood soil is unsuitable for septic tanks, and the council advises the use of the septic closet, which has the approval of the Health Department and is working well in Ringwood.

It is desirable for householders to discuss the matter with the Health Inspector before installing their sewerage system. A council permit is necessary before installation.

Electricity

Electricity in the Borough is supplied by the State Electricity Commission. Enquiries should be made at the Ringwood office, WU 6621; after hours WU 6404, 6727, 1121, 6238.

Ambulance

It is anticipated that as a result of Croydon, Ringwood and Nunawading people raising a substantial sum, the Victorian Civil Ambulance Service will soon erect an Ambulance Station on land given by the borough at Lot 47 Pitt St., Ringwood. Until this service is available the Service may be phoned at FB 2222. From a public telephone and without charge you may call M 079 Emergency Service.

Minimum charge for an ambulance is £1/5/- within a 4-mile

radius each way, and 3/- per mile thereafter. A 24-hour service is available.

Fire Brigade

Ringwood Station is on Maroonah Highway near Pratt St. WU 6106. It works with the Box Hill and Croydon Stations, and is part of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade. There is one vehicle at the station, fitted with two-way wireless.

Police

Ringwood Police Station is in Pratt St. WU 6377. Officer in charge is Senior Constable Esler.
