Mayor's Message

This year promises to be one of challenge and change in Local Government.

At State level there are several important matters being introduced which will result in changes here in Ringwood. Adult franchise will be introduced to local elections and not only ratepayers but all those registered in State or Federal rolls may vote in Council elections. Also the oath of allegiance will no longer be taken by incoming Councillors and this will mean Councillors may not necessarily be an Australian citizen. Also legislation regarding access to information at local government level and concerning the extension of the powers under which local government may act will further affect the local scene.



Changes in work patterns with fewer people being employed, changing technology and different work times for many brings demands on our "people" services, both voluntary and those provided by Council. This year several Council grants will be made to assist the work of volunteer organisations, and the work of our Community Services Department will be aided by the addition of the services of an Outreach Youth Worker.

The development of the New Ringwood Market and Target Square last year has done much to enhance the commercial life of the city. Progress continues this year with the opening of the Staley Gardens adjacent to this site. This will provide a beautiful green area for passive recreation right in the heart of our city. Several handsome office buildings have been opened and make a valuable contribution to the commercial life of Ringwood.

The development of the master plan for the Ringwood Lake is well advanced. The Elizabeth Penny Sound Shell was recently dedicated and soon the Miner's Cottage and a small museum will be constructed.

Despite the hushed economic climate, services will not be reduced in frequency or quality, but this year will be one of growth.

Many of the schemes being undertaken will proceed without much fuss, but will affect the appearance of our city. Schemes are being undertaken with neighbourhood shopping centre representatives to upgrade treed areas. A new planting of flowers in the median strip along the Maroondah Highway will enhance the main street. An extensive review of the planting and maintenance of our street trees is being undertaken.

Because of its closeness to the people it serves, local government is able to work effectively and respond promptly to the residents.

I urge you to take further interest in the work and issues confronting local government, especially those concerning us in Ringwood.

Elections for Council

At the 20th May each year the Municipal Roll is compiled from the names of the following persons appearing in the rate records :-

- (a) Owner or Joint Owners (first two named).
- (b) Occupiers (not exceeding three).
- (c) Spouse of owner or occupier and who resides at the property. **PROVIDED** the Rate Collector has been advised in writing.
- (d) Company Nominees.

REMEMBER - ALL RESIDENTS WHO ARE ENROLLED MUST VOTE

Notice of any Election will appear in the local press. Persons not able to be present on Election Day should apply for Postal Ballot Papers. The date of the 1983 Council Election will be Saturday, 6th August.

VOTING IS COMPULSORY!!!

Property Records

The rate office maintains the property records for the City, amendments to these records are only made after formal notification has been received.

Rates

Each year Council strikes the rate based on the amount of revenue required to meet Council's expenditure for the year. The rate on each individual property is calculated by multiplying the rate in the \$ by the site valuation shown on the rate notice.

If paying by one annual payment is required by 10th April, or if paying by instalments :-

- 1st instalment — no later than 31st December
- 2nd instalment — no later than 28th February
- 3rd instalment — no later than 31st May
- 4th instalment — no later than 31st August

Any payments received after the above dates will attract interest penalties of 14% per annum calculated from 10th December.

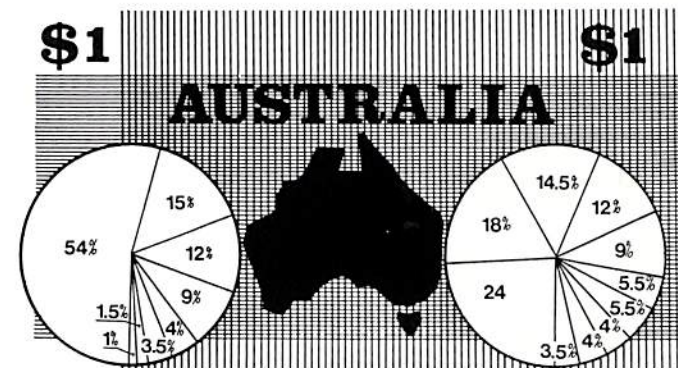
Deferment of Rates

The Council may from time to time, upon the application of any person who is liable for the payment of any such rate and who, in the opinion of Council, is in necessitous circumstances, defer the payment of the rate or any part thereof and the interest thereon for such time as the Council thinks fit. The amount unpaid and the interest thereon shall remain a charge on the property. Application forms available on request from the Rate Collector.

Pensioners Rate Assistance Scheme

Ratepayers in receipt of a pension and who are holders of a Pensioner Concession Card are eligible for a rate remission of up to one half (50%) with a maximum of \$135.00 off Municipal General Rates and \$67.50 off Municipal Sanitary Charges (where applicable) on the ratepayers sole or principle place of residence and which is used exclusively for residential purposes. Ratepayers who have received a rebate for the year ending 30th September, 1982 and who are still eligible will automatically have the rebate deducted from their rate notice. Persons who have recently become eligible can complete the required application form at the Rate Office. Applicants are requested to produce their Council rate notices and their concession card when making application.

Council Finance



A Council Financial Year is from the 1st October to the 30th September.

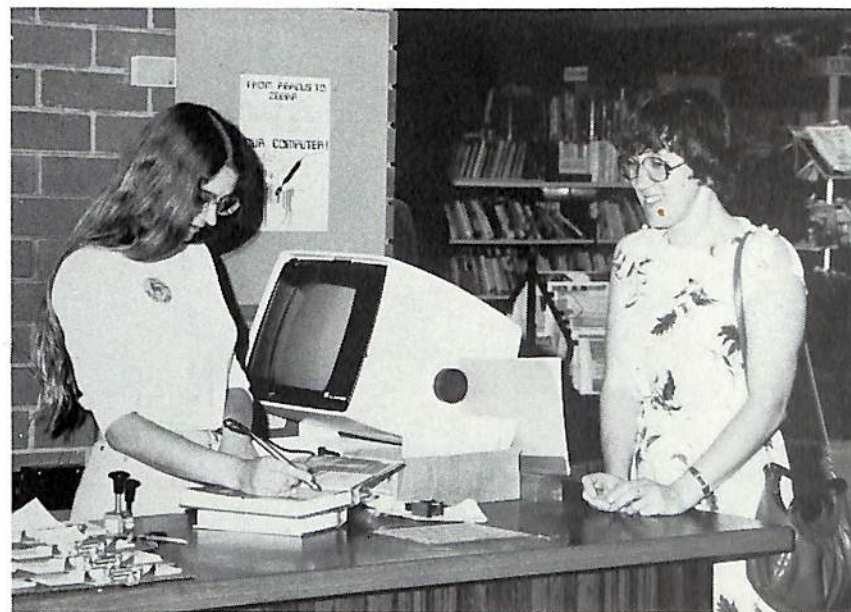

Leisure Areas

STALEY GARDENS

Staley Gardens evolved in two stages, the first stage was a small triangular parcel of land given to the Council in the fifties by Holeproof Limited for a childrens' playground. The Gardens were named Staley Gardens after the then Managing Director of Holeproof.

The Council subsequently purchased a substantial additional area to complement the original playground, to increase the size of the Reserve as it was considered that in that location it had the potential to ultimately become a community focus for the developing commercial area.

In addition to the two parcels of land earlier referred to, a short section of Charter Street was closed and added to the overall area available.



With the two major projects of Target Square and the New Ringwood Market, the Council's earlier plans were seen as having the opportunity of bearing fruit. An approach was made both to Myer and to the New Ringwood Market developer, Redbridge Pty. Ltd., as to their preparedness with the Council to be involved in the planning and development of the upgrading of Staley Gardens. Initially, it was agreed that each party would contribute \$50,000 to the project.

The overall objective was to provide a community focus for the commercial area, with an emphasis on passive activity where shoppers and/or workers could relax, barbecue a lunch, or somewhere for the children to play while parents shopped.

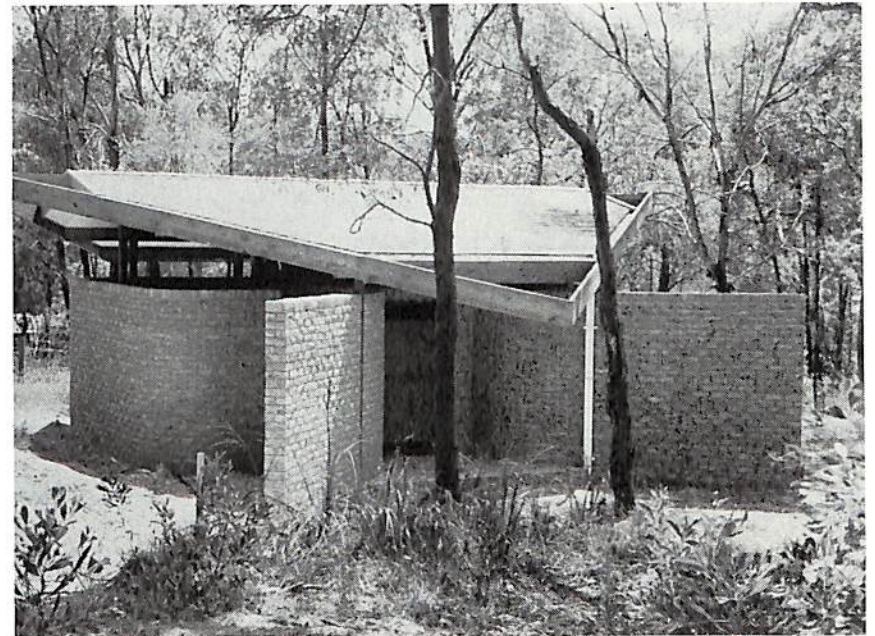
WOMBOLANO PARK

Following last year's preparatory work in the removal of alien plants, the fencing of the cells for restoration, and the laying of the primary access paths, the toilet block has now been built using materials that blend with the natural environment.

The Ringwood Apex Club have, at their own cost, provided two Information Shelters from which it will be possible to make provision for the distribution of information relating to the Park.

The Ringwood Rotary Club is developing a concept plan for the provision of a Sensory Trail, particularly for handicapped people, but of interest to all.

The Park is already attracting interest from a wide area, and signs of tree re-generation are already apparent.

MULLUM CREEK OPEN SPACE

The Council has now adopted a master plan for the progressive upgrading of the open space reservation adjacent both sides of the Mullum Creek, between approximately Suda Avenue and Kalinda Road. The emphasis is essentially on passive activity. Ultimately, there will be provision for pedestrians and cyclists to travel along the ribbon of open space, together with substantial re-planting of indigenous native trees.

As a preliminary to the work commencing, arrangements are currently in hand for the more adequate provision of drainage from the abutting properties to drain to the Creek.

To improve the water quality in the Creek, efforts are being made to speed up the connection of all properties in the catchment to the M.M.B.W. sewer.

Council's Health Department promotes a highly successful PREVENTATIVE HEALTH CARE program for the benefit of the public.

FOOD STANDARDS

Council's Health Surveyors are responsible for controlling standards in premises used for the sale or manufacture of foods to ensure that these premises comply with regulation standards, are kept clean and food handling methods are hygienic.

Samples of food and drink are bought for analysis to check that products meet the required standards. Food labels are also examined.

Complaints about food should be reported promptly to enable an immediate thorough investigation of the problem to safeguard the health of other consumers.

INSPECTION SERVICES

As well as checking standards in food delivery vehicles, food shops, cafes, restaurants and factories, regular inspections are made of hairdressers, chiropodists, beauty parlours and ear piercing establishments.

Fire prevention, eating houses and accommodation standards in motels, hotels and boarding houses are inspected.

Water samples are taken at public swimming pools. Septic tanks are inspected.

Investigations are made into drainage discharges, rubbish dumping and rodent infestation.

RATS

Fortunately, as more and more areas of the Municipality become sewered the incidence of rats is decreasing. Council engages a rodent control contractor who regularly services trouble spots in streets and other public areas. Residents experiencing the nuisance of rats on private property may obtain rat bait free of charge on application to the Health Department.

SEWERAGE CONNECTIONS

It is the responsibility of ratepayers to connect their premises within 12 months of the Board of Works sewer becoming available. This is in your interests as well as that of the neighbourhood. When the Boards sewers are available you pay sewerage rates whether using this facility or not.

When your property is connected to the sewer it is important that the old septic tank is pumped out by an authorized contractor and demolished before backfilling the area with clean soil.

Facilities for Disabled Persons

BUS SERVICE

A bus service for disabled people has been arranged by Ringwood Council. The service operates every Wednesday and collects people from their homes. Passengers are driven to Eastland and the Ringwood Library and other places en route and later returned home.

TELEPHONES

Special public call boxes are located:

- immediately south of Ringwood Post Office, Ringwood Street.
- on footpath outside Ringwood East Post Office, Railway Avenue.
- in Eastland carpark parallel with Ringwood Street.

Other aids for private telephones are available from Telecom including special alarms, visual signals, hearing aid couplers and gliding tone callers.

TOILETS

Public toilets which include special facilities for the disabled are located:

- in Myer Eastland on 2nd Level adjoining the hairdressing salon (one male and one female toilet for disabled).
- at Ringwood Lake, Ringwood Library, Wombolano Park and Ringwood Cultural Centre.

PARKING

Reserved parking spaces for disabled motorists are located at:

- Eastland, outside Lower Mall between Myers and Woolworths.
- two at the lower level near the north-west corner of the building, and
- two at the upper level near the Commonwealth Bank.
- rooftop carpark above Safeway corner Warrandyte Road and Maroondah Highway.
- North Ringwood, in service road behind shops (enter from Oban Road).
- Burnt Bridge Shopping Centre, Maroondah Highway, in service lane.

PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS

Audio tactile pedestrian crossing signals have now been installed at the following intersections:

- Bond and Ringwood Streets, Ringwood.
- Maroondah Highway and Railway Place, Ringwood.
- Wantirna Road and Station Street, Ringwood.
- Bedford Road and Warrandyte Road, Ringwood.
- Railway Avenue at Railway Station, Ringwood East.
- Canterbury Road to Heathmont Road, Heathmont.
- Canterbury Road west of Allens Road, Heathmont.

"ON SITE" WHEELCHAIRS

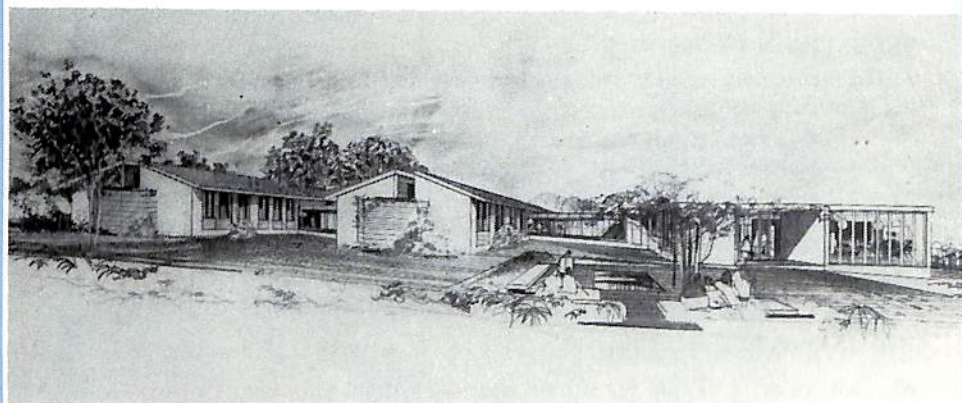
Ringwood Centre for the Frail Aged

The Council has submitted a proposal to the Department of Crown Lands and Survey that the parcel of land at the corner of Everard Road and Maroondah Highway, which is at present unreserved Crown land, for its reservation for the provision of aged care accommodation, with the Council as a Committee of Management.

The proposal is that the Council, with financial support from the management of Lionswood Village in Kirk Street, and Wilana Village in Wilana Street, (projects of the Ringwood and Richmond Lions' Clubs), develop a 32 bed hostel with supporting paramedical facilities as Stage One.

Application has been made to the Department of Social Security for financial support for the project.

The Joint Committee's objective is for the project to commence April/May 1983. The accompanying illustration depicts the concept for the site.

Ringwood Festival

The third annual Ringwood Festival will be conducted over two periods this year. The Ringwood Fun Festival will comprise of the Family Fun Day to be held at Mullum Reserve on Sunday, 20th March, which will include Scout activities and a display by the Victorian Emergency Rescue. Meals on Wheels

Ringwood's Meals on Wheels service delivers home-style three course meals to persons who are unable to cook for themselves due to illness or age. Our meals, which are cooked and packaged in the Nunawading Regional Meals on Wheels kitchen, are served Monday to Friday. Recipients need a doctor's referral for home delivered meals. Senior Citizens who desire can eat in one of our Meals on Wheels dining rooms located in the Ringwood and Ringwood East Senior Citizens Clubs. Reservations for the dining rooms must be made in advance by phoning 870 6757 after 9.30 a.m. Monday to Friday. We are able to cater for special diets : diabetic, low fat, etc. in addition to our regular menu.

Meals are delivered by volunteers, using their own cars, who are reimbursed with a 5 litre petrol voucher every time they drive. **VOLUNTEERS ARE URGENTLY NEEDED.** Rostering is on a weekly, fortnightly or every four week basis. Home Help Service

Council provides Home Help for the aged and infirm, with the object of keeping them in their own homes as long as possible. This help is available between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. Monday to Friday.

To qualify for this service a letter from their doctor is necessary, stipulating that for health reasons or infirmity of age, they can no longer cope with their household duties. Although there is no time limit over which the aged can receive this help, the doctor's letter must be renewed at six monthly intervals.

Two years ago Council introduced a Male Home Help service, his duties are to take over those heavy jobs that our ladies cannot manage. The aged have found the service to be a great help.

Council provides Home Help to all families when the mother is incapacitated, or after a confinement. The role of the Home Help is to take over the duties of the mother, until she is well enough to cope. This service to the young is available on request from their doctor.

Home Help is also available to parents of mentally and physically handicapped children and adults. This service was started in 1974 to help the parents to take their place in society. The staff who are fully trained in the care of these children and adults are available daily, evenings and weekends.

The Home Help Services are administered by the Council Welfare Supervisor - Mrs. May Harvey, telephone 870 4311.

Library Service for our Senior Citizens

Seven years ago Council commenced this service with the aim of bringing the elderly out of their homes and at the same time enabling them to enjoy our very good library service.

The elderly and infirm are called for at their homes at 11.00 a.m. by volunteer drivers and taken to the library, where they select their books from large print books as well as the normal print and also talking books. They then have tea - coffee and sandwiches, prepared by the Red Cross ladies, catch up on the news of the other elderly and are driven home around 12.30 p.m.

These outings take place every second Friday. At present 45 elderlies are participating in this programme.

The service is administered by Council's Welfare Supervisor - Mrs. May Harvey who may be contacted by those interested in joining the group, at the Civic Centre - 870 4311.

By-Laws — Regulations

FIRE HAZARDS

It is your responsibility to keep your property free from fire hazards. Council can arrange clearance at your cost. Further details can be obtained from Council's Proper Officer, Mr. G. Hargreaves - 870 4311.

FOLIAGE OVERHANGING FOOTPATHS

Owners or occupiers of properties are required under the provisions of Section 559 of the Local Government Act 1958, to keep all streets and footways completely clear of all foliage up to a height of 3 metres above the pavement surface.

HOUSE NUMBERING

Your co-operation is sought in ensuring that the correct street number is prominently displayed on your property, preferably close to the front gate to enable easy identification.

KEEPING OF DOGS

All dogs (aged six months or over) must be registered with the Council by 10th April each year or upon attaining the age of six months.

Fees:

Unsterilized	\$10.00
Sterilized	\$ 5.00
Kennel Control Council (Victoria) registered	\$ 5.00

50% reduction for dogs owned by Pensioners holding a Pensioner Concession Card.

Residents are reminded that the Dog Infringement Regulations came into effect on 1st March, 1979, and the owners of dogs found wandering at large (not under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash) during the daytime may be issued with an 'on the spot' fine for \$25.00.

Other 'on the spot' fines that may be incurred include :-

Dog wandering at large between sunset and sunrise - \$50.00.

Failure to register - Twice the registration fee.

German Shepherd Dog outside owner's premises and not muzzled or under effective control - \$50.00.

Council also has a By-Law which limits the number of dogs which can be kept. Further details available from Council's Ranger, Mr. H. Slaughter - 870 4311.

MINI BIKES

Council's By-Law No. 103 prohibits the riding of mini bikes on ANY land within the City of Ringwood without permission previously granted by the Council. Penalties of up to \$400 may be imposed on any person who contravenes the By-Law. Further information may be obtained from the Senior By-Laws and Traffic Officer, Mr. B. Williams - 870 4311.

Building — General Information

A Building Permit is required for all buildings, additions, alterations, out-buildings, demolitions, permanent swimming pools and fences where they abut upon a street. Dividing fences are a civil matter between the adjoining property owners.

The set back from side boundaries for dwellings is governed by the height of the walls and there is a minimum set back of 7.6 metres from the front boundary.

A new dwelling has a minimum of five inspections by the Building Department during the course of its erection.

It is required that footpath levels be obtained from the City Engineer's Department prior to buildings being commenced to determine that proper access to the property can be obtained.

From the 1st October, 1981 to 30th September, 1982 (Council's financial year) permits were approved for the building of 206 houses, 92 flats, 64 other buildings and 676 additions, alterations or outbuildings for a total value of \$21,430,450.00. Information regarding Regulations governing buildings can be obtained from the Building Surveyor's Office between the hours of 9.00 a.m. to 12 noon, Monday to Friday and 5.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. Mondays.

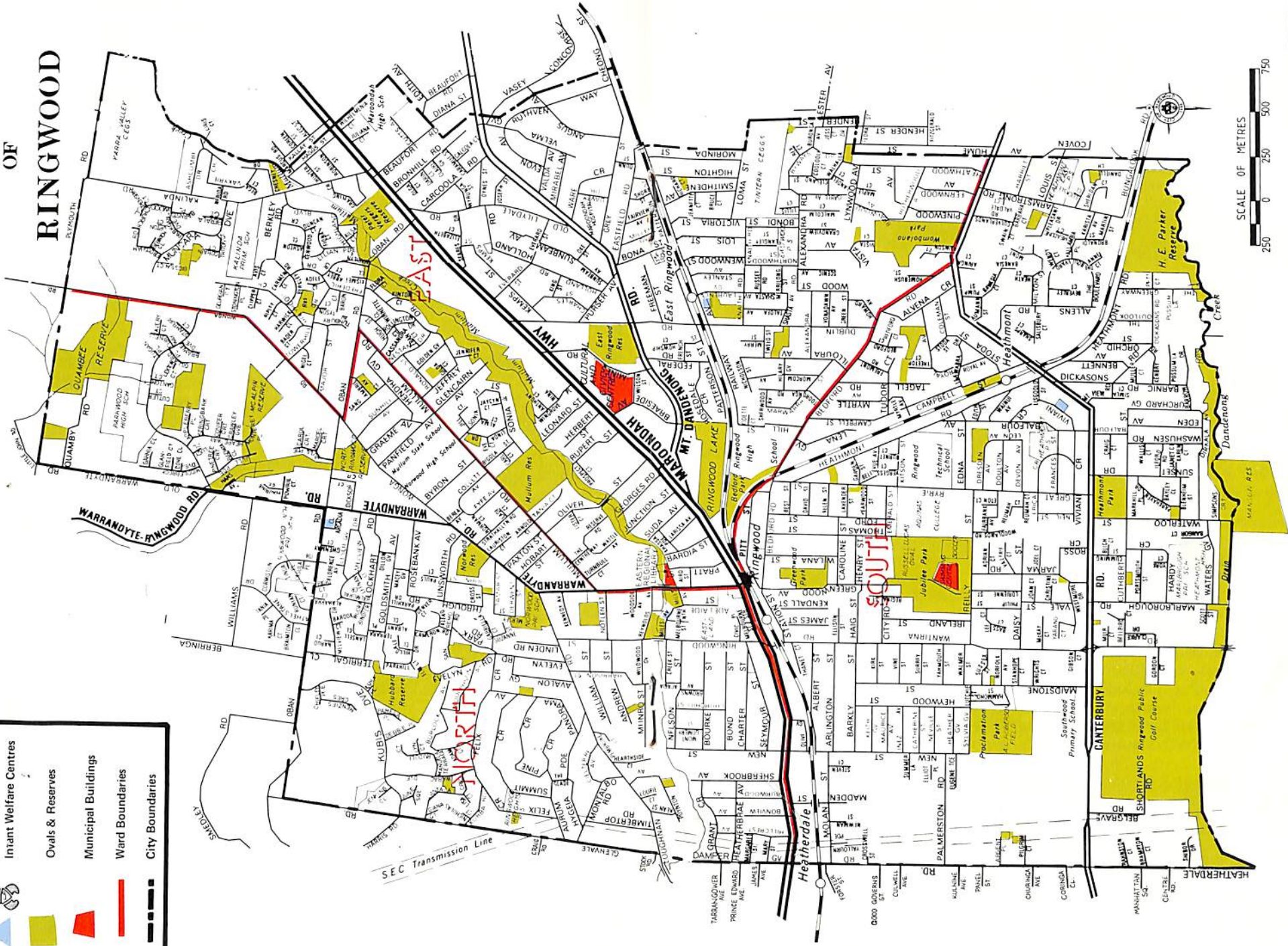
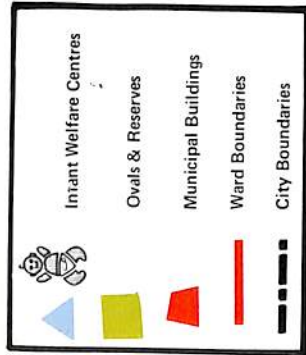

Items of Interest

FLASH FLOODING

From time to time, intense thunderstorm type rainfall will produce localised flooding. On Monday, 15th November, 1982 one such storm occurred, of such intensity as to exceed the capacity of the underground drainage system, which is designed to cope with a storm that might be expected statistically once every five years. It therefore stands to reason that where rainfall is heavier than the once in five year storm, or where a drain becomes blocked, overland flooding must occur.

While Council carries out a regular preventative maintenance programme to remove blockages, such a programme can only be completely successful if residents ensure that rubbish is not placed where it can enter drainage pits.

Where properties are located along the natural gullies, care should always be taken to ensure that any overland storm flow is directed away from or around buildings, to reduce possible damage to a minimum.

Houses built on slabs are particularly vulnerable unless care is taken to ensure:—

- (a) that the floor of the house is at least 150 mm above the surrounding area, and
- (b) that there is a free outlet for any drainage which may accumulate around the building.

In the recent November storm, the considerable amount of hail that fell aggravated the problems by obstructing downpipes from roofs and entries to underground drainage systems.

A further hazard which was discovered in more than one drainage pit, was bundles of advertising material which had evidently been dumped sometime prior to the storm.

In summary, we can expect occasional storms which will cause overland flooding, but by care in line with the foregoing, resulting damage can be minimised.

NEIGHBOURHOOD SHOPPING CENTRE STUDY

Because of the Council's keen interest in the provision of commercial facilities within the City, as well as supporting the expansion to the district centre which resulted in the recent Target and New Market developments, the Council is progressively setting up study groups within each of the neighbourhood shopping centres, with the objective of stimulating the vitality of these important local centres. The study is already well advanced at the North Ringwood Shopping Centre. Obtaining the attitude of the people that shop at the centre, as well as those that don't, have formed an important part of the study.

Early in the New Year, a meeting will be held with the traders to present the findings of the Committee with a view to implementing a number of suggestions for the improvement of the centre.

SHUTTLE BUS

In association with the opening of the Target Square and Market developments, the Shuttle Bus was introduced to link the terminal at the Ringwood Station with Target, the Market and Eastland. While Council initiated the scheme, the three businesses concerned contracted with Invicta Bus Service to operate the Shuttle Bus on a trial basis until at least January next. As well as giving the opportunity for bus and train passengers to be transported around the shopping centre, the "Road Runner" as the bus is known, allows shoppers to leave their cars in any one of the car parks, and proceed to one or more of the three centres quickly and easily. The bus operates on a 15 minute timetable, and at a nominal charge of 20 cents.

RINGWOOD CITY CIRCUIT BUS

Ringwood City Circuit No. 666 is a result of co-operation between Council and Invicta Bus Service, aimed at providing a public transport route linking a number of areas within the municipality. The service operates Monday to Friday (except public holidays) in both clockwise and anticlockwise directions, giving effectively half hour service over the following route:—

From Ringwood Station through Eastland Shopping Centre and along Warrandyte Road, Mullum Road and Oban Road to the North Ringwood Shopping Centre, Wonga Road, Cherrydene Estate, Kalinda Road, Old Lilydale Road, Grey Street, Railway Avenue, Lawrence Grove, Dublin Road, Alexandra Road, Illoura Avenue, Bedford Road to Canterbury Road and the Croydon boundary. Thence returning along Canterbury Road through Heathmont Shopping Centre, along Great Ryrie Street and Reilly Street past the Swimming Centre, Greenwood Avenue, thence returning to Ringwood Station.

The route is aimed particularly at linking cross-country a number of points such as Shopping Centres, Elderly Citizens' Clubrooms, Ringwood, Ringwood East and Heathmont Stations, Maroondah Hospital, Ringwood Library and the heated Swimming Centre.

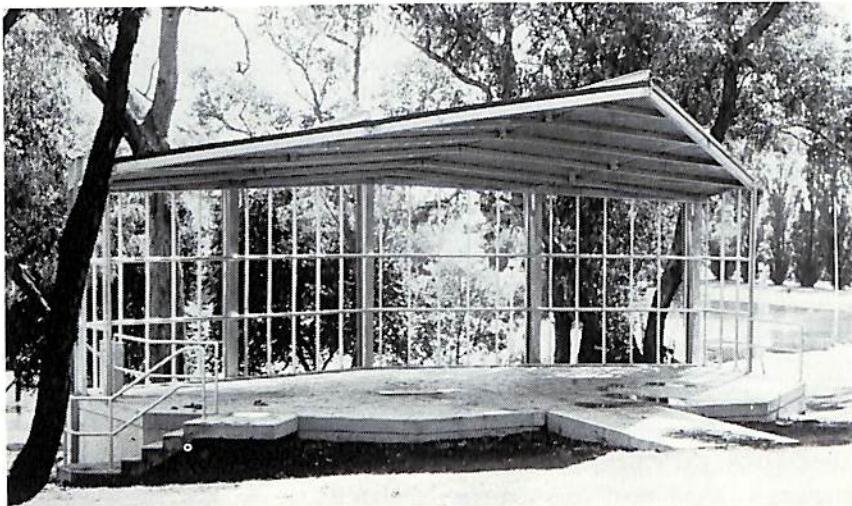

ELIZABETH PENNY SOUND SHELL

Community groups are looking forward to using the new facility to bring a wide range of activities to the Ringwood community.

HISTORICAL MUSEUM, RINGWOOD LAKE

The Council's major project at the Ringwood Lake this year will be the development of Stage One of the Historical Museum at the Lake Reserve, adjacent the car parking area. This will take the form of a replica of a miner's cottage that used to be located at 367 Maroondah Highway.

The Council's Engineering Design staff have carefully prepared plans to make it possible to start on the construction of the building early in February, 1983.

The Ringwood Historical Research Group has provided valuable information in the planning of the facility, and will be heavily involved in manning of the cottage when it is opened for public inspection, and for the furnishing of it.

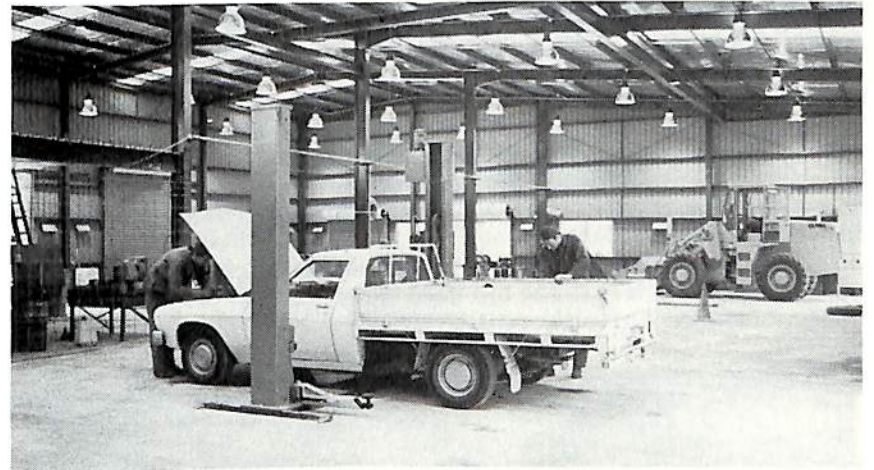
WORKS DEPOT

The old Maintenance Workshop is currently in an advanced stage of replacement which will provide for the Council's construction and maintenance plant to continue to be maintained to the required standard.

The Works Depot has two arms, the maintenance and construction. Preventative maintenance, whether it relates to the Council's drainage network, roadways, street furniture, traffic signs, etc., is extremely important to minimise the possibility of accidents and/or damage.

The Council's construction equipment is supplemented by hired plant to carry out a wide range of construction projects throughout the Municipality.

CHILDRENS' PLAYGROUNDS

Within the limited resources available to it, the Council is progressively upgrading the children's playgrounds facilities throughout the Municipality.

Work recently completed includes Heathmont Reserve and Staley Gardens, and plans are in hand for the Ringwood Lake.

NATURESTRIP MAINTENANCE

As is the practice in most municipalities, the mowing of naturestrips in front of properties is the responsibility of the property owner. If Council accepted the mowing, considerable costs would be incurred which would be reflected by an increase in rates.

The majority of residents maintain the front of their properties out of pride for their domain or in their City. Council appreciates the attitude adopted by residents in this respect.

Ringwood Cultural Centre

1982 has been a year of change at the Ringwood Cultural Centre.

The City of Ringwood has been fortunate in obtaining the services of a new Manager for the Cultural Centre. Mr. Des Malouf, with his vast experience in the hospitality industry here and overseas, is expending his energies in promoting the Centre.

The Management team has been further enhanced by the appointment of a Convention Co-ordinator whose duties are to market and co-ordinate the non-theatrical functions.

The major increase in theatre bookings has necessitated the employment of more technical staff resulting in increased theatrical expertise which in turn broadens the value of the Centre to the community. The theatre has also given approximately twenty local secondary students an opportunity of work experience.

Wedding receptions are very much on the increase and the Centre is also obtaining a large percentage of its revenue from large business organisations outside the City of Ringwood. These businesses are utilising the Centre for promotions, i.e., General Motors Holden and Ford car releases.

In March 1983, Garden Week will be held in the complex and surrounding gardens. Special parking will be organised as over 100,000 people are expected to visit Ringwood during that period.

Garbage

Weekly garbage collection — Each rateable property is provided with a weekly garbage collection, and as well as the normal 86 litre bin, each householder may put out a 43 litre bin of garden waste such as lawn clippings, leaves, weeds etc. Household waste must be placed in a proper bin. Waste left in anything but the appropriate bin (e.g. plastic bags, paper bags, boxes etc.) will not be collected.

Hard rubbish collection — In approximately March and September, Council operates a hard rubbish collection, each property receiving a notice indicating the type of material and when it will be collected, just prior.

Council's own Tip at Quambee Reserve operates to the following timetable and at the charges listed, for people who may wish to deposit their own rubbish.

No fill material will be accepted from now on.

Recycling — While Council does not operate its own Recycling Depot, it encourages through co-ordination, assistance with signs etc., and regular clearing of rubbish, a number of community organisation operated depots. In this manner not only is Council encouraging greater saving of a valuable resource, but is also helping those community groups to raise more funds for their operations.

The Ringwood Lake Reserve

Since its creation in 1929 the Ringwood Lake and its contingent Reserve have become an important local and regional resource for passive recreation in the eastern Metropolitan area.

It comprises an area of about 10 ha and is located on the natural valley that drains the East Ringwood area. The bank of the Lake was constructed by filling that became available, associated with the laying of two large water mains that run through the Reserve.

In 1976 the Council adopted a master plan for the development of the Reserve with an emphasis on passive recreation. During the last six years the Council has progressively implemented the various strategies adopted within the master plan. The major expenditure has included :—

- * The provision of rock edge treatments at the water's edge.
- * The provision of board walk treatment on the eastern side of the Lake, which is very popular with children fishing, and with children feeding the ducks.
- * The provision of sealed primary access paths.
- * The provision of two electrically fired barbecues surrounded by quarry tiles which were individually designed and subsequently "fired" by school children during the International Year of the Child.
- * The provision of a water cascade and fern gully using recycled water from the Lake.
- * Substantial tree planting.
- * The reticulation of water to various locations to maintain the grassed areas.
- * The closing of the old carpark fronting Maroondah Highway and the re-sowing and planting of this area.
- * The construction of a carpark to serve the Lake with access from Mt. Dandenong Road.
- * The provision of a small Sound Shell for use by community groups, including the Annual Arts Festival and the Annual Carols by Candlelight.

Work is scheduled to commence on the first stage of a Historical Museum toward the eastern end of the Lake Reserve. Stage One will provide for a replica of the original miner's cottage that used to be located on Maroondah Highway. The miner's cottage was associated with the antimony mine that used to operate on the site of the current Civic and Cultural Centre.

It is anticipated that the provision of a poppet head will follow fairly closely on the completion of the miner's cottage. The Council is seeking financial assistance through the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation toward these latter projects.

As well as the wild ducks and some tame ducks that have migrated to the Lake, which are very popular with the children, arrangements have been made to release a number of black swans which we hope will breed there.

Next time you have an hour or two to spare, could we suggest that if you haven't visited the Ringwood Lake before, that you make the effort. You will find it a very rewarding experience.
