




MR. SCOTT DIXON YEARBOOK EDITOR

orwood prides itself on the com-N mitment of its staff and the results they achieve in the classroom. Here, a few faculties reflect on the year that was and share with us some of their standout moments...

ENGLISH

Year 12 students worked hard all year to hone their skills for the exam in November. We consolidated the study of the context 'Identity and Belonging', which involved students writing about what it means to belong to a group and to be comfortable in your own skin.

In Year 11, we reintroduced 'Macbeth' and continued with the engaging context 'Future Worlds'. Year 10 students produced some exciting versions of scenes from 'Romeo and Juliet' and Year 9 students explored two new texts, 'The Hunger Games' and the graphic novel 'The Hound of the Baskervilles'.

Year 8 students studied 'Whale Rider' and in Year 7 we introduced the novel 'Coraline' and studied how the story changed when produced as a film and a graphic novel.

Debating-wise, 2012 was massive. We fielded two Year 10 teams and a Year 12 team, with the younger students lifting our position from near the bottom in 2011 to knocking on the door of the finals.

Kate Borzym, Izabelle Chabierski and Max Rivadera were among the standouts, displaying amazing oratory and organisational skills. Well done to them all.

HUMANITIES

History and Geography, together with Economics and Civics at Junior School, make up the areas of study for the Humanities Department at Norwood. As fieldwork is a major component of Geography studies, our pupils were involved in many excursions this year.

Students in Year 7 went to Edendale Farm in Diamond Creek, where they completed fieldwork at four different

For their Local Neighborhood Study, Year 8 students went to Richmond, Toorak and Kilsyth, comparing the demographics of three very different suburbs, and finding major differences in the way we live in Melbourne.

Year 9 students had their wonderful City Experience, getting to know the heart of Melbourne, and VCE History students had a tour of the City Centre investigating how Melbourne began and developed, looking at the lan Potter Centre, the Immigration Museum, the spectacular dome of the State Library, and of course the Shrine.

SCIENCE

Complementing the class work students undertook for science, students also participated in a variety of other activities designed to extend their class room studies and abilities. Year 7 and 8 visited IMAX and Andrew Plant, visiting palaeontologist, author and artist brought dinosaurs to life for the year 8 students and taught them how to guickly draw a dinosaur.

Year 10 advanced science students received intensive hands on workshops in genetics/microbiology and chemistry at GTAC and Box Hill institute respectively as well as smaller sojourns for selected students to other tertiary institutions such as the La Trobe University Biochemistry Department.

7 ACE science had a consistent start to the year, finishing on a high with a special visit to Healesville Sanctuary for hands on classification activities to compliment and extend their studies in classification and ecology.

VCE students attended a plethora of excursions including physics of Angry Birds and the synchrotron (physics), GTAC, Melbourne Zoo and microscopy department at Melbourne University (biology), Cunningham Dax at Melbourne University (psychology) and Melbourne Aquarium and Latrobe University Chemical Science.

On a whole school level, many distinctions and credits along with increased participation rates were recorded for the International Science Quiz and the Australian Chemistry Quiz.

Among the 200 odd students involved in the quiz, those with distinctions received prizes during assemblies and all students received a detailed breakdown of their abilities and results. Congratulations to all of the students who participated.








ATHLETES AFOOT!

Congratulations to these students and their families, and to all of the graduating class of 2012 for a memorable year.


