ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1998.

Jamboree.

The troop was represented at the Jamboree in Queensland held at Ipswich just outside the metropolitan area of Brisbane. The scouts who attended were Stuart Holley, James Latimer, Philip Yule and Craig Dickie. They traveled by bus leaving on the 1st of January and returned on Sunday the 11th of January. Although the scouts found it hard to acclimatize to the hot humid tropical weather, they managed to enjoy all the Jamboree activities on site plus attend the outside attractions on the Gold Coast, Brisbane and at the Amberley air base.

Explorer Hike.

On the 7th and 8th of March Steven Jones, James Latimer and Craig Dickie did their 18 kilometer Explorer Hike in the Mount Tanglefoot and Mount St. Leonard area north of Healesville. The Saturday was fine but the rain came down overnight. With the wet the scouts were able to study the action of leeches as they loped along the outside of their tent and Bruce Dickie found out that his thirty year old hike tent was no longer up to standard.

Lasseter's Weekend.

The 1st to the 3rd of March saw all 14 scouts in the Troop participate in 'Lasseters', which is a competition weekend wherein during the day, scouts hike from one activity to another where they compete for points. The weekend is organized and run by the Lasseter Rover Crew as a District activity. It is at a different location and has a different theme each year. Showtime.

Once again 2nd Ringwood Scouts starred in 'Whitehorse ShowTime.' Each year more of our members participate. The show is a major commitment with a least 9 rehearsals starting in May, culminating in over six shows presented in September. At the end of each 'ShowTime' the scouts participating are always enthusiastic and want to 'come back next year'. In 1998 we had Kate Rowe, Stuart Holley, Philip Yule and Bridget Irving. They had strong support from all their parents, with a special mention for the 'back stage' efforts of Robyn Rowe and Lorraine Yule.

Maroondah October Camp.

The Maroondah October Camp (MOC) was again held at Clifford Park for five days, being the 30th of September to the 4th of October. The camp is a mixture of scouting and other activities including 'bike bungle', archery and Sumo wrestling run by the 'Grand Poobah' Buddy (Graham) Holley, who was resplendent in his red Mikado dressing gown. The camp was preceded with the usual Practice Camp beside the Scout Hall on the 18th and 19th of September. Both patrol acquitted themselves well with the Wombats coming within a whisker of being Camp Champs. They only missed out by a small percentage.

Pedal to the Metal.

The Victorian Branch ran a post jamboree program entitled 'Pedal to the Metal' which rewarded scouts with various stripes to pin on their epaulets. The program was centred around bicycle type activities including bicycle maintenance & safety, 'wheelie bin' races and culminated in an organized cycling event. The troop participated in the annual Knox 'OPPY RIDE' on the 1st of November. Phillip Yule, Stuart Holly James Latimer, David Latimer and Sarah Dickie were followed by the 'oldies' Alan Yule, Graham Holley, Bruce Dickie and Steven Latimer. It was a pleasant 18 kilometre pedal around the Knox Bicycle paths. Most of us had an instant recollection of the event whenever we sat down during the following few days.

Explorer Hike.

The second overnight explorer Hike was held at Murrindindi on the 21st and 22nd of November. Some of the older scouts also came along as they had now acquired a taste for light-weight camping. The first day we started at the Murrindindi Cascades and followed old timber tramway/ walking paths downstream to our camping spot beside the river. On Sunday we hiked up-hill past the spectacular Willhelmina Falls to the top of the ridge (a climb of 370 metres). We then walked along the ridge with views across the Murrindindi and Yea River valleys. Then down and back up the Murrindindi River to the Camp site. We hiked a total distance of 20 kilometres over the two days in absolutely beautiful weather. Air Activities

During the year we worked on the Air Activities Badge. On the 13th of May the troop visited the R.M.I.T. Aerospace Technologies Laboratories at Fishermans Bend. We saw how materials are tested for strength and stress and also experienced the inside of a wind tunnel. They had lots of aircraft and we were allowed to climb in and out of them. They had helicopters, fighter aircraft and different aircraft engines including engines from the 'Buzz Bombers' of the Second World War.

On the 29th of November the whole troop (plus some fathers) visited the Scout Air Activities Center at Morrabbin Airport. We were taught about the theory of flight, flight controls, weather, and had a short 20 minute flight. This was followed by a visit to the Aircraft Museum at the airport.

Emergencies Day

On Sunday the 6th of December Graham Holley conducted an Emergencies Day. Firstly we went to the Knox SES and then to the Fern Tree Gully Ambulance Station where first aid was learnt. After we had perfected our resuscitation technique on the plastic mannequins, Graham took us for a ride in an Ambulance.

Other events.

These are just some of the events the scout troop engaged in. Needless to say there were sleepovers, swimming and roller skating nights, visits to Time-zone, Dark-zone and a few end-of-term nights at Pizza Hut.

Buddy steps down.

The end of the year came all too quick and 'Buddy' (Graham Holley) insisted it was time for a rest. After over five years of being at the helm he has decided to be an occasional/emergency ASL when available. He will help in such things like conducting an Emergencies Badge courses and assisting at camps and sumo wrestling. Both Robyn and I greatly appreciated his leadership and experience in running the troop. His constant presence will be greatly missed but we look forward to his assistance where he can help.
