Presidents report on Year 1999

The role of the parents committee is to support the uniformed leaders, particularly the Group Leader. The parents committee ensures that the hall, equipment and other resources are maintained in a safe condition and available for use by the kids and that money is available to meet the needs of the Scout Group.

1999 was a busy year for the parents committee.

- The Ballet school continued to be the major source of income and particular care was taken to ensure that the schools needs were being met. The school has confirmed that they will continue at the hall in 2000.
- No fundraising other then hall hire was undertaken at group level in 1999, although the Scouts undertook fundraising to offset the cost of their own activities. The result was that the groups bank balance declined by \$1300. The Committee will need to review its fundraising strategy for year 2000.
- Termites were found in the main hall and the Committee agreed with Council to maintain the floor in a safe condition until Council could replace the entire floor. This work is on Councils proposed 2000/01 works program, but has not yet been approved.
- Council initially disputed ownership of the hall, but finally accepted responsibility and we are currently negotiating a more appropriate lease and maintenance agreement.
- A register of all equipment owned by the group was completed.
- An induction package was drafted and should be available shortly to inform new members about the group, its history, key interests and information on hall and equipment hire.

The committee had many members with Trevor Barter, Robert Simpson and Garry Whittle leaving part way through the year and Lyn Hilton joining as secretary. Despite her best intentions, Rhonda Rattenbury was unable to join the committee as she intended.

As you can appreciate, the activity of these people was essential in ensuring the smooth running of the group.

I would also like to mention the work done by parents of the joeys, cubs and scouts who offer their support and help regularly at working bee's, provide transport or assist Leaders in running various activities.

The group could not operate without the support of the committee and the parents of the group and on behalf of the group I would like to thank them for their hard work and devotion this last year.

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1999.

1999 for the Scout Troop started with the traditional 1st Night 'Water Fight'. It also saw two scouts Craig Dickie and Jason Hudson drop out of the troop for other activities.

On Sunday the 14th of February two leaders, one parent and nine scouts canoed 10 windy kilometers (Ivan Jones did about 20 kilometers) on the Yarra. The trip was from Spadoni's Reserve in Coldstream to Lower Homestead Road, Wonga Park, All scouts were awarded their River Trail, Yarra Valley Activity badges.

The wet theme was followed by a swimming night on Wednesday the 24th of February at the Ringwood Aquatic Center. Sarah Dickie and Kirsten Morrow showed up the boys, qualifying for their Red Dolphin Swimming Badge by swimming one mile -1500 meters non-stop.

February concluded with the 1998 Annual General Meeting on Sunday the 28th of February with Alan Yule being invested as ASL, Sarah Dickie being invested as a Scout and Matthew SIBIZZIRRI coming up from cubs and making his promise as a scout.

In March we had a bring a friend night at the Heathment Golf Park, followed by a Weekend sleeping two nights at the Cowes Scout Hall at Phillip Island from the 12th to the 14th of March. The weekend was full of activities, visiting the Koalas, Penguin Parade, a 10 kilometer hike to Cape Woolami and a visit to historic Churchill Island on the way home on Sunday.

Lassetters weekend was held at Old Tynong Camp, east of Gembrook. The troop fielded all three leaders and 10 of its 12 scouts. Even through the weather was bitterly cold with hail and sleet , the two patrols put in and obtained above average scores. The theme for the weekend was Scottish with the scouts dressed and armed as Highland Worriers. Wombat Patrol won best dressed followed second by Scorpions.

The end of May saw Matthew Walsh awarded his Pioneer Cord and Kate Rowe her Explorer Cord.

Following a Troop Council on the 9th of June, James Latimer, Michael Hilton and Steven Jones stepped back from their PL and APL roles due to their age and so that other scouts could also perform those roles before they too went to Venturers. The new PLs were Kate Rowe and Phil Yule with APLs Bridget Irving and Matthew Walshe.

On the 16th of June the troop went indoor rock climbing at Nunawading and the following week we `entertained the masses' by being on the `Scout'n'about' segment on the Eastern Community Broadcasters FM radio. Our end of term dinner at Pizza Hut followed this.

June also saw the start of our sausage sizzle fundraisers organized and run by ASL Robyn Rowe. Monies raised goes to the Jamboree or other scout activities. Robyn is our chief fundraiser and organized 4 sausage sizzles in the second six months of the year and also arranged chocolates to be sold. Funds raised are credited to each individual scout depending on the time they put in at Sausage Sizzles or amount of chocolates sold.

On the 19th and 20th of June Bridget Irving and Matthew Walshe attended P.L. training at the 1st Ringwood Scout Hall.

On Sunday the 14th of August, the troop was invited by 3rd Croydon to join them on a day trip to the snow at Lake Mountain. Two leaders, one parent and six scouts displayed various techniques for Cross-Country Skiing and a good day was had by all.

The beginning of August saw some of our older scouts fully plan, arrange and embark on their 3 day Explorer Level hike. Jarrod Hodgson joined Steven Jones, Micheal Hilton, and James Latimer from the 1st to the 3rd of August in hiking the Murrindindi area. The scouts navigated and hiked alone but were visited occasionally by a parent for the first half and the SL for the second half of the hike.

With the end of August came the performances of Whitehorse ShowTime. This is the culmination of six months of learning lines, dances and songs. Our trio of Kate Rowe, Bridget Irving and Phil Yule did us proud at each of the six performances.

On Wednesday the 1st of September, Cub Scout Daniel Rattenbury finished his link badge and was invested as a scout.

We camped at Clifford Park on Saturday the 11th of September as a practice for M.O.C and the next day the scouts participated in the Cohen Shield competition.

The end of term function was held on the 15th of September at Sidetracked Entertainment Center in South Huntingdale, where we drove go-karts, dodge-em cars, played mini golf and fought in the Laser Zone.

The school holidays saw 9 scouts in two patrols participate in the 5 day M.O.C camp at Clifford Park, where, in addition to many varied activities, scouts learnt the finer points of Jelly-Wrestling.

On Wednesday the 20th of October Jarrod Hodgson was awarded his Explorer Cord.

The scout troop participated in the Group display at Our Lady's Fete on Saturday the 23rd of October.

Over a number of weekends in November Alan and Robyn did their Hike Skills Course. It culminated in a weekend Hike over the Mount Baw Baw plateau.

The scouting year ended on the 12 of December at Dark Zone in Box Hill. This was followed by a going up ceremony in the gardens in Whitehorse Road for Scouts Michael Hilton, Steven Jones and James Latimer who went onto Venturers with the 3rd Ringwood Group.
