Parent Committee Chair Report on Year 2002

We have had the raffle and sausage sizzle to help these costs so that the burden was not necessarily forced on the parents. It is important that the fees for your child are paid as and when they fall due. This helps the troop and also ensures further availability of funds to allow the troop to develop and grow.

The hall is now maintained by Maroondah Council with the troop responsible for the interior maintenance. To this end there was a working bee to allow the painting and general maintenance items to be completed. These tasks require everyone's assistance and we look forward to greater attendance at future working bees.

The troop needs the support of the parent committee and this year the numbers of parents on the committee has fluctuated and we are in need of a strong committee for the forthcoming year. The troop are now well organised with the leaders providing the stimulus to the trop and an excellent activity program. The year ahead will be busy with the Jamboree in Adelaide in January 2004 and various other activities throughout the year.

Thank you to the members of the parents committee for 2002 for help and assistance. The members were Chris Dwyer, Aletha Sbizzirri, Julie McMillan, Graham Dower, Alex Kolevich, Geoff Naughtin and Gary Whittle. I would also like to say a big thank you to the leaders from Joey's, Cubs and Scouts, for their amazing efforts in 2002 and the on going work for the coming year. GROUP LEADERS REPORT 2002

Welcome. Over the last year, many of the goals were achieved. They were to increase the Scout numbers, Adult Leaders and to finalize the Hall Lease Agreement with Maroondah City Council. The numbers have increased. The Scout Troop along with the Great Ryrie Joey Mob and Kurrajong Cub Pack has increased in youth and Leaders. However Waratah Cub Pack was slow to gain Cub Scouts.

Recruitment still remains critical to Scout Group, even though in recent years we have gained in membership. Let's not become complacent. It's the duty of everyone at 2nd Maroondah to recruit new members. Currently we are seeking the services of two Cub Leaders for Waratah Cub Pack, because the current Leader is unavailable on weekends.

On a better note, the signing of the Hall Lease and Maintenance Agreement between the Scout Association and Maroondah City Council, committed 2nd Maroondah Scout Group to a 5 year Lease of \$22.00 per year. The Scout Group is to maintain the internal areas of the Hall and the Council is to complete major works and maintain external areas. You would have noticed the external walls have been painted, spouting and down pipes have been replaced, plus emergency door openers have been installed to external doors by Council. Next financial year other works will be undertaken. A Parent working bee painted the main hall walls and doors. This agreement will save us many thousands of dollars in the years ahead. However failure to complete the maintenance would result in the loss of the lease. It's up to us to make sure the maintenance program is completed as per the schedule.

It should be noted Hall Hire remains our main source of income, without which we would have been hard pressed to balance this year. The added cost of insurance \$880.00 strained resources in many Scout Groups. This was the chief cause for the finances to record only a small gain.

Towards the end of the year, Scout Leader Bruce Dickie transferred to District, to become District Leader Scouts. This caused changes to the Scout Troop. Alan Yule became Scout Leader and Cameron Glover joined as an Assistant Scout Leader. I would like to thank Bruce for his enthusiasm and guidance of the Troop over the past years.

To night marks the beginning of our 50th Birthday year, which runs until the next Annual Meeting in 2004. Already people have put their hands up to attend our Birthday on Saturday 13th September 2003. It will be a busy year with the Jamboree in Adelaide and fundraising as well.

I would like to extend my thanks to Leaders, Parents Committee and everyone connected with 2nd Maroondah Scout Group.

Youth Members (Scouts)

The year began with 12 scouts in the Troop, plus 1 new recruit on the first night. A good beginning. At the close of the year the Troop contained 17 scouts, with the maximum during the year 19.

During the year two new members joined from outside the Scouting association and two others transferred from other troops. Matt Sbizzirri went up to Venturers, and one scout resigned.

From a membership viewpoint 2002 was a successful year however recruitment of new members and retaining current Scouts continues to be a major focus for the Scout Leaders.

Activities.

The Troop participated in a wide range of activities at Group, District and Region level during the year. The activities included ;-

Wet Night – waterfight. Achieving Scouting Awards. Formula Bike. Patrol Camps. Visit to Ringwood Fire Station. District Camp (M.O.C.). Lasseters Hike. Murray River Rescue. Canoe Training.

Night Hike. Swimming. Cohen Shield. Venturer Night. Rock Climbing. Cooking Night. Whitehorse Showtime. Ice Blocking.

Highlights of the Year.

All scouts within the Troop advanced within the Award Scheme. Some achieved new levels such as completing their Pioneer Badge and Cord, 3 others achieved the Explorer Badge and Cord. Well done. Matt Sbizzirri earned his WOMBACAT Award, having had it approved at District level in March.

At Formula Bike, our team rode throughout the night. There was a short break of under an hour just before dawn where we didn't have a rider on the track. In all, the team covered 512 kilometres (80 team laps).

At Ringwood fire station, all scouts nearly had to change their underpants when the Station Alarms went off and the main door automatically opened. Even the firemen

panicked until a control informed us that it was just a demonstration for our purposes. The leaders have never seen the scouts move so fast.

During canoe training, 2 leaders and 4 scouts achieved their level 1 charge certificates. It was hard work paddling down stream in the lower Yarra against the incoming tide. We thought we would never reach our landing point. The trip, thanks to the tide took two hours longer than expected.

At Lasseters Hike, our scouts performed well and the leaders won the best stunt award for the 4^{th} year in a row.

As a troop, we undertook tree planting for the Murray River Rescue.

At Cohen Shield our Patrol gained a Silver Pennant. It would have been Gold except one scout forgot to wear uniform.

Two Patrols attended MOC and survived the experience. Considering the weather, this was quite an achievement. Platypus patrol won the Gadget Award.

We finished the year up at Lilydale Lake where we went ice blocking. For those that went, a great deal of fun was had. Never have we seen scouts go so far, so fast with so little effort.

Leaders.

Towards the end of third term, Bruce Dickie transferred from the position of Scout Leader having accepted the role of District Leader – Scouts. Alan Yule took on the role of Scout Leader and continues to be supported by Assistant Scout Leaders, Robyn Rowe, Allan Dugan and new to 2nd Maroondah, Cameron Glover.

During 2002 Allan completed his Basic Training, Robyn and Alan completed Advanced Scout Training, and Cameron having already completed the Advanced modules focused on the specialty training area of working with youth with disabilities.'

At a First aid course conducted by Allan during August, Bruce, Alan and Cameron completed their level 2 first aid certificates and emergency asthma management.
