MINDARI - (An Aboriginal Word), is a District Monthly Meeting of all Scout Leaders in Ringwood, at which the leaders discuss the forthcoming District Events.

SCOUT EMERGENCIES COURSE - The course is for Scouts wishing to pass their EMERGENCIES BADGE and is run for 4 weeks commencing 25/5/81.

PARENTS COMMITTEE - The Parents Committee look after the needs of the Group - Fund Raising, Purchases of Equipment, General Management of the Group and acquiring NEW LEADERS.

DISTRICT ASSOCIATION - This is the governing parent body of Ringwood Scout District comprising of eight Scout Groups (1st., 2nd., 3rd., 4th., 6th. & 7th. Ringwood and 1st. & 2nd. Heathmont). The District Association is made up of two Group Representatives, a District Commissioner and Assistants.

GROUP COUNCIL - This is a meeting of all leaders in the Group each month, where requests are made for help, equipment, etc. to Parents Committees. Planning and information is carried out for the following month.

SEEONEE - Same as Mindari except Cub Leaders in Ringwood attend.

GROUP LEADERS OF EACH GROUP & DISTRICT STAFF MEETING - They meet with the District Commissioner monthly, present report, discuss policy and problems in the Groups and the District.

THE WORST SHIP.

Between 1953, when it was built, and 1976, when it sank, the "Argo Merchant" suffered every known form of maritime disaster.
In 1967 the ship took eight months to sail from Japan to America. It collided with a Japanese ship, caught fire three times and had to stop for repairs five times.

In 1968 there was a mutiny and in 1969 she went aground off Borneo for 34 hours. In the next five years she was laid up in Curacao,

grounded off Sicily and towed to New York.

In 1976 her boilers broke down six times and she once had to travel with two red lights displayed, indicating that the crew could no longer control the ship's movements because the steering had failed. She was banned from Philadelphia, Boston and the Panama Canal.

To round off a perfect year she ran aground and sank off Cape Cod depositing the country's largest oil slick on the doorstep of

Massachusetts.

At the time of the final grounding the ship had been "lost" for 15 hours. The crew was 18 miles off course and navigating by the stars, because modern equipment had broken down. What is more the West Indian helmsman could not read the Greek handwriting showing the course to be steered.

It was a cool Friday night (the 24th of October to be exact), when four Venturers - Andrew Nickholds, Robert Byatt, Adrian Gervaseni and myself - set off from the 1st. Mooroolbark Scout Hall on an 80 km hike.

The catch with this excercise was that we had 16 hours to do it in. A late start and a slight geographical embarrasment caused us to lose a lot of time but this was made up between jogging and fast walking. This soon took its toll. The first check point after 20 kms was at Seville where we were greeted with lots of sandwiches, cordial and encouragement. After 1/4 of an hour it was off again with a lot less competition. The next 3hours saw a lot of sore muscles and tired Venturers but once again we reached our goal. This time Monbulk where we were weclomed by more sandwiches, cordial and encouragement. It was a tired group that left Monbulk for Upwey, 3 long weary hours away. After about an hour disaster struck. Adrian pulled a muscle in the back of his knee, which prevented us jogging. We continued at a slower but steadier pace until 6 0'clock, when a combination of the cold, pre-dawn chills and my shorts and T-shirt forced me to leave the group and commence jogging. Andrew came with me and Robert staved with Adrian.

Andrew and myself arrived at Upwey as dawn was breaking and waited for Robert and Adrian until the cold forced us on the road again. We set off with much encouragement on the last strenuous 25 km stretch. It is hard to remember anything about those 25 tortuous kms, except the endless step after step. Paradise, in the form of 1st. Mooroolbark, was acheived at 10.15 a.m., just 14 hours and 15 minutes after we set off.

Adrian and Robert acheived the unexpected, with what was an amazing feat of endurance on the part of Adrian, who walked about 39 kms with an incredible pain in both knees. They arrived at 3 minutes to 12, just 15 hours 57 minutes after their departure the night before (only 3 minutes to spare).

It is a credit to our perseverance and endurance when we consider that out of roughly 120 competitors only 26 people made the distance, 4 of whom were from 2nd. Ringwood representing over 1/7th. of the successful entrants.

' 8TH. GIPPSLAND CORROBOREE '

The 8th. Gippsland Corroboree was held at camp "CARINGAL" via Tyer's Junction, 50 years since the first corroboree was held at Inverloch in 1931. "Caringal" now has assets of over \$120,000 and was developed for the Scout Association along the lines of Gilwell Park for the Mc Donald District in the Latrobe Valley.

The Journey to "Caringal" commenced from Heathmont Railway Station at 9.00 A.M. on Good Friday morning. We arrived at 11.30 A.M. and were allocated a site by the river amongst dead blackberries, which we commenced to clear in order to put up the tents.

After lunch the dining fly and fireplace was constructed together with tables, gadgets and seats. Later that afternoon Bartley Kelly went to the activity centre and booked us into the various activities which consisted of:

SECTION 1. COMMANDO COURSE, WOOD BURNING, BRICK MAKING AND CHURCH PARADE.

Compulsory - 10 points each.

SECTION 2. TIMBER TRAMWAY WALKS, ABSAILING, TOURS, POTTERY,
SCREEN PRINTING, HIKING, WELDING, MINI GOLF,
BLACKSMITHING, GRAFFITTI WALL, RADIO.
Challenge Activities - 5 points each.

EACH BOY WAS TO ATTAIN 40 POINTS IN ORDER TO GAIN THE CORROBOREE AWARD.

After tea 9.00 P.M. we went to bed! But managed to stay awake most of the night.

Saturday was the official opening of the Corroboree by the Chief Commissioner for Victoria, Mr Neil Westaway, on the main arena at 1.45 P.M. and at 3.30 P.M. our first activity, the "COMMANDO COURSE", everyone got wet. That evening the film "Zulu" was shown in the arena. We slept that night.

Sunday started with breakfast followed by church then three activities, BLACKSMITHING, ABSAILING AND BRICKMAKING. The afternoon was then spent BADGE SWAPPING and TOURING the site.

Monday morning before breakfast we packed up, had breakfast and gathered in the main arena at 11.00 A.M. for the closing ceremony which lasted about 45 minutes. We then had lunch prior to our parents arriving to take us home.

LEADER SHORTAGE IN GROUP.


