**RICHMOND**—A City located on the eastern boundary of the Central Business District consisting of prime residential areas together with light and general industrial areas. Forty four per cent of Richmond's population is born overseas and

one in three of the Municipality's population is made up of migrants from non English speaking countries.

The City has many fine examples of Colonial and Victorian architecture in both residential and commercial properties. The City is well served with Educational Institutions with three primary schools being Richmond Community Primary School, Brighton Street and West Richmond; three Catholic schools, being St. James, St. Ignatius and the Vacluse Convent; secondary education centres being the Richmond Secondary College and Richmond Girls High School. Richmond T.A.F.E. provides vocationally oriented courses.

There are several pre-school facilities including kindergartens at Booroondara, St. Ignatius, Dame Nellie Melba, South Richmond, Duke Street and the Richmond Creche, Child Care Centres in Victoria and Lord Streets.

Infant Welfare Centres are located in Church Street, Tudor Street and South Richmond. A Senior Citizens' Centre is located in Hosie Street together with a dining room for Council's Meals on Wheels service. A Community Health Centre and Family Planning Clinic are located in Church Street. There are two main hospitals in Erin Street being Bethesda and Epworth, both hospitals being acknowledged on a national level as being leaders in the provision of specialist medical services. Many specialist medical professional rooms are located in Erin Street, a street now recognised as the metropolitan home of specialist medical service. The Melbourne Clinic is located in Church Street. The North Richmond Family Care Centre for Community Health and Welfare is situated in Lennox Street.

A wide range of recreational facilities are available including—

The City Baths in Gleadell Street with a covered heated swimming pool, gymnasium and sauna; a nine hole public Golf Course in Loyola Grove; a two green Bowling Club situated in Gleadell Street and nine separate ovals catering for cricket, football and soccer. Passive recreation areas include the Barkly Gardens and Melba Park. Carringbush Regional Library located at the corner of Charlotte and Church Streets is recognised as a leader in its field catering for many different languages and with an extensive range of audio visual equipment. The Library also promotes many community arts activities being based at the Library and "The Stables" located in Duke Street.

Many notable companies are located in Richmond, amongst them being Siemens, Cussons and GTV9.

The City is well served by public transport with both extensive rail and tram networks which in conjunction with the Municipality's location being just 10 minutes from the centre of the Central Business District makes the City an ideal location for commercial and residential purposes.

RINGWOOD—Primarily a residential area with an expanding population being located approximately 25 kilometres from the centre of Melbourne.

Included within Ringwood is the major commercial centre for the Lilydale Corridor. The centre is mainly retail in nature, but also includes private and semi-government offices. Carparking is readily available.
