



Many of the artists working in the fringe are highly trained and wellqualified to take a place in more commercial areas, but have chosen not to do so for creative reasons.


We would like to strass that "fringe" is not synonymous with "amateur." Many of our best ideas and new directions filter through to the mainstream but we receive
