Gentlemen:

Further to the request of our recent Deputation for the provision of Street lights in this locality, I desire to intimate that owing to the refusal of the Railway Department to consider the lighting of Heathmont Railway Station at present, it has become necessary for the local residents to increase their contributions to the proposed guarantee to £126/-/-, which they have undertaken to do.

This amount, with the provision by the Council of six Street lights, leaves a deficit of £9 which we anticipate will be waived by the Commission in view of the possible development of the scheme in the near future.

I am directed by my Committee to intimate that everything possible has been done locally and that the granting of our request by the Council will, subject to final acceptance by the Commission, enable us to complete the scheme.


Dear Sir,

HEATHMONT PROGRESS LEAGUE.

The original estimated cost of the proposed Heathmont Railway station was £3,392, which amount did not include the cost of a Care-taker's residence, after consultation with the representatives of the local residents, the Departmental Officers were able to reduce the estimate by approximately £2,000 at this time, however, it was announced that in addition to the cost of the platform, the residents would have to find £1,000 for a residence.

At our last interview with Mr. Clapp, we were informed, that the residence must be provided, but that the estimates would be reviewed with a view to any possible economy to the residents, the result of the review of the estimates was an increase in the cost of £400 making the amount required to be raised approximately £2,800.

The Department have been advised that the residents are prepared to pay for the Station at the increased cost, viz:- £1,792, but that they are unable to raise the amount required for a residence.

This latest offer has not yet been acknowledged.

It is no other centre at which the residents have been required to contribute, has the amount to build a residence been asked for.

Ringwood East is being operated as it was suggested the proposed Heathmont Station should be conducted.

It is confidently claimed that once established the Heathmont Station would soon pay, falling which no objection would be raised to it being closed.

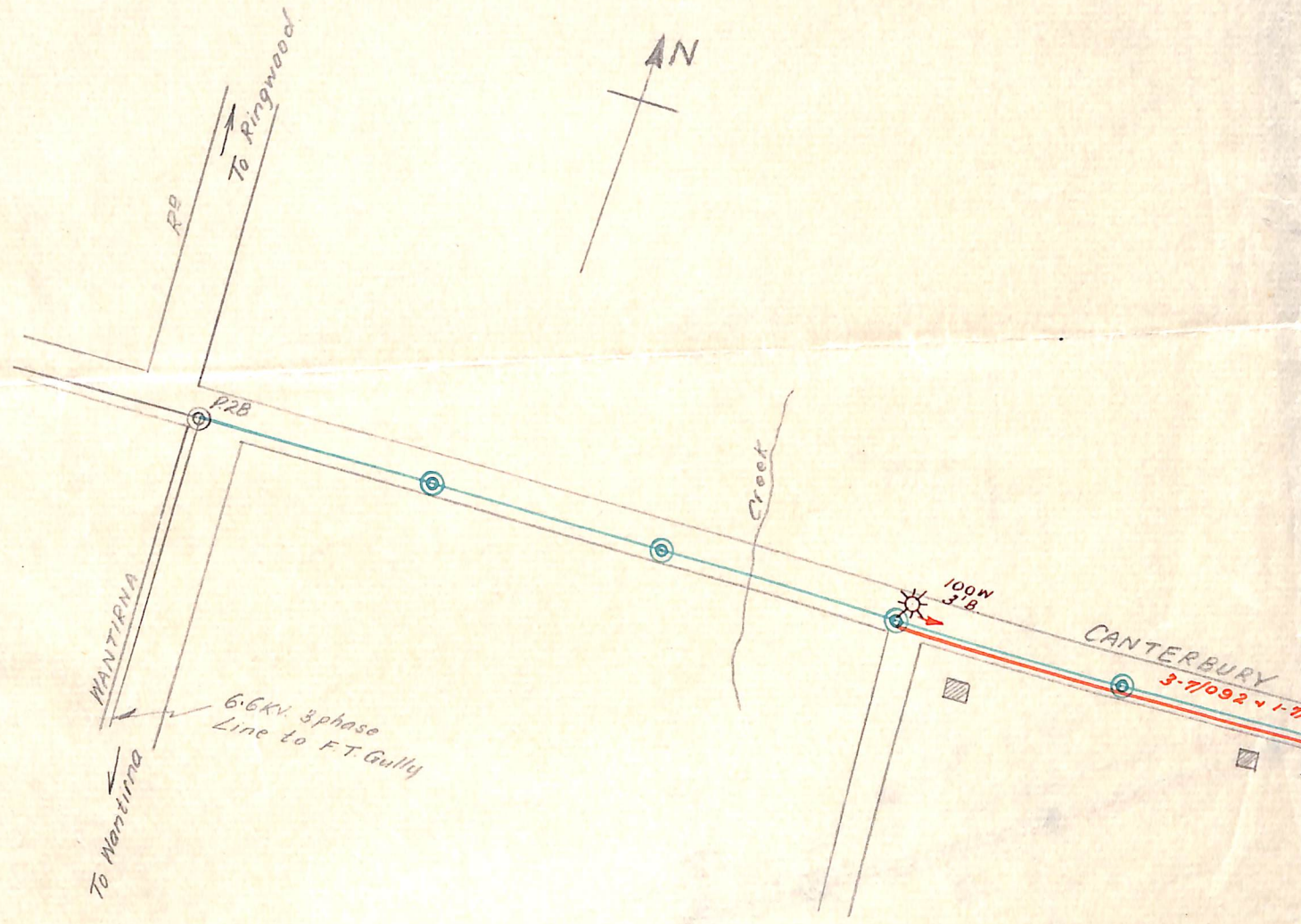

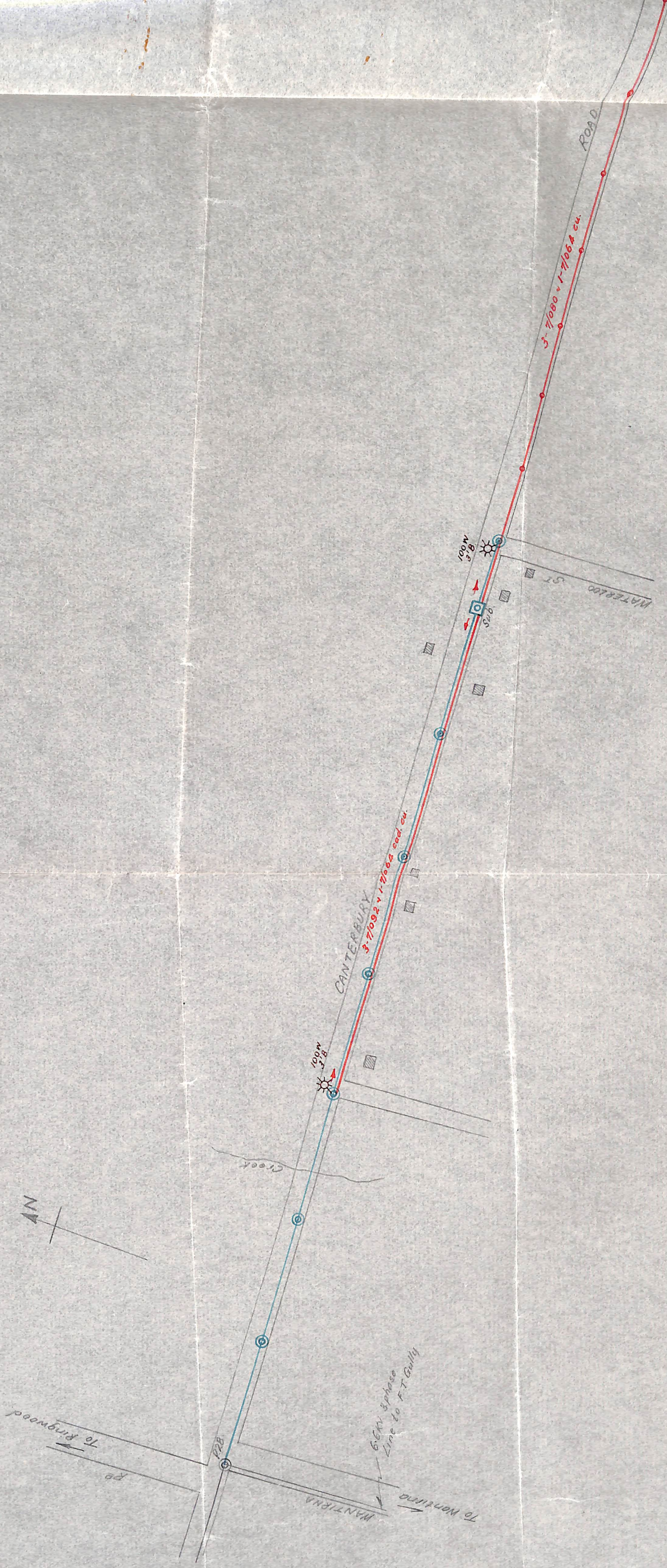




LEGEND.

- Dwellings 









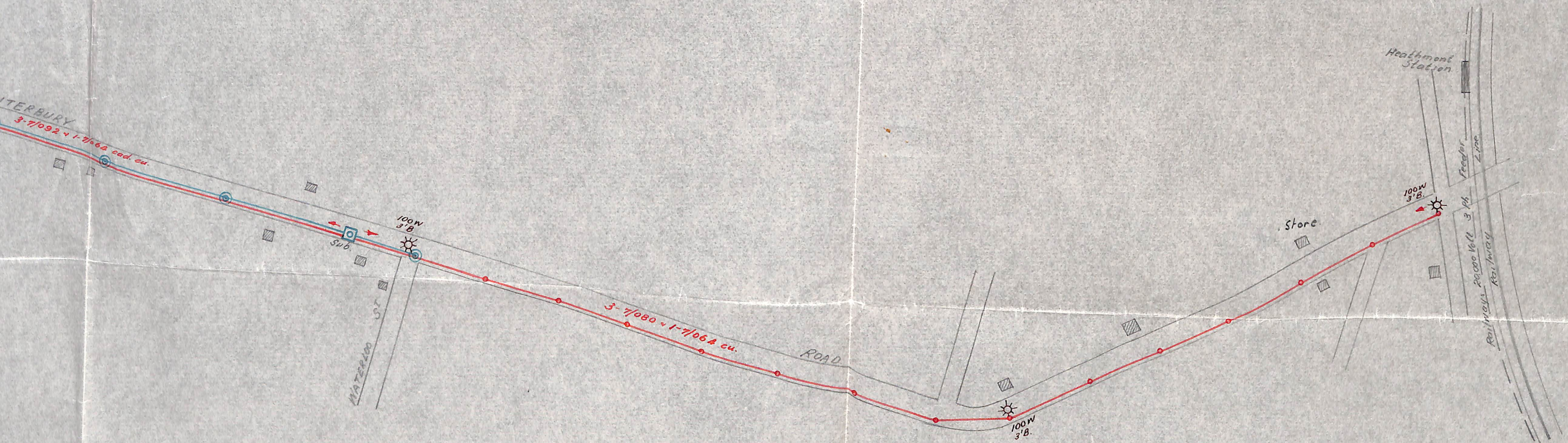
PROPOSED SUPPLY TO HEATHMONT
