This species is scarce within Maroondah and only occurs as scattered specimens in other reserves and roadsides. Also Hakea ulicina present and possibly still some orchids along Cuthbert St., towards Sunset Drive.

NAME: Scott Street Reserve (Lots 19, 20, 21)

SIZE: 1.199 ha

LOCATION: Scott Street, Heathmont (off Marlborough Rd.)

CONDITION: Degraded with a large amount of Watsonia meriana and other exotic ground flora, but many fine specimens of Eucalyptus viminalis and several E. ovata with habitat hollows. A billabong with lots of Triglochin procera and Carex appressa, and a single plant of Carex fasciculatis is sited towards the south-western corner. It is not visible from the road because of the growth of exotic grasses, but it provides invaluable habitat for amphibians and water birds. Its potential for development as a wetland, picnic area, playground and passive recreation area is enormous. A very valuable area.

CONSERVATION VALUE: Local Significance

MANAGEMENT PLAN: Nil

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT: Some planting by local schools and CCRISPP Nursery.

Other areas of remnant vegetation

Dexter's Bush, 46 Dickasons Rd., Heathmont - In 1956, Liz & Mick Dexter bought 5 acres between Dickasons Rd. and Dandenong Creek. In 1980, they sold about .6 ha to Council for public open space, and leased it back so they could maintain it. In 1988, they gave 2.5 acres to the Victorian Conservation Trust. In 1992, VCT took over the lease of the public open space. In 1993, Dexters took on another piece of Council land along the creek, adjacent to the leased area. Council removed the major weeds. The VCT land and Dexter's remaining property are separately classified as Land for Wildlife.

Harper's Bush, 200 Canterbury Rd., Heathmont - Harpers purchased 14 acres just before WW2 and in 1988 gave 10 acres of this to the VCT. Joan Harper and her son manage this land and on behalf of the VCT, as well as maintaining their own section.

Dandenong Creek - some very good, some very degraded areas.

Mullum Mullum Creek - including Mullum Mullum Reserve - some good tree canopy, but little remaining understorey. Some small pockets in fairly good condition. There is a 'Friends of Mullum Mullum' group.

Heathmont Station and railway line - some quite significant areas and species, including Banksia marginata, which is uncommon in Maroondah. Also along Heathmont Rd., from Canterbury Rd. to H E Parker Reserve. Separate report has been completed on Lot 17, which the Scout Association leased some years ago for the construction of a car park. This proposal prompted enormous public consternation because of the value of the flora on the site - which includes at least 11 orchid species and the exceedingly uncommon Sphaerolobium minus. The Scout Association did not proceed with the proposal and is now willing to relenquish the lease. Council is considering leasing the area as a flora reserve. It is maintained by Heathmont Bushlink, which also assists with Harpers, Dexters and the Dandenong Creek.

Brushy Creek Wetland - includes part of the grounds of the Village School (Holloway Rd., Croydon North) - tree canopy present, and some understorey species not found elsewhere in the municipality - Calystegia sepium, for example. Has 'Friends of the Brushy Creek Wetlands' group.

Mt Dandenong Road median strip - the Croydon end, particularly from the old Ringwood boundary to Ross Rd. contains a variety of eucalypts and understorey species, and some restoration work has been carried out by the Croydon Conservation Society. This area requires very little maintenance, just being slashed a couple of times per year. By contrast, the Ringwood end is very degraded, with only mature eucalypts surviving. This is a result of the constant quest for neatness and an 'English style' appearance.

The area has been mown frequently and, therefore, needs frequent mowing, since it is now dominated by exotic grasses. Mowing also prevents the growth of young eucalypts which are needed to replace the older ones as they die out. Considerable damage has been done recently during the installation of new street lighting. Root damage through trenching will cause a number of the trees to die within the next two years.

A small area of interesting wetland vegetation exists behind the Manhattan Hotel, towards Cadburys.

Scott Street - 3 blocks which back onto Dandenong Creek. This site is not designated a reserve, but it has importance as part of the Dandenong Creek corridor and some planting has been done in the past by Southwood Primary School students.

Several schools within the municipality have small areas of remnant bushland. Many are starting to appreciate the value of such sites for study. Schools with bushland include:

There are several other areas which justify consideration for their significant vegetation. The Healsville freeway reserve, particularly between Bayfield Rd and Dorset Rd, contains several locally and regionally rare species, such as Bracteantha bracteata, Amphibromus archeri and Brachyscome cardiocarpa. Such plants should be propagated and planted in other suitable areas, such as the Bungalook Conservation Reserves, to expand their range and ensure their long term survival.

There is some good quality vegetation in Merrill Cres. in front of 57-69 which has been recognised as 'Significant Roadside Vegetation' and also some interesting species at the corner of Merrill Cres, and Kerry Rd. The main problem here is an infestation of Hypericum perforatum, a species which was considered 'Noxious' under previous legislation, and is an extremely serious threat to the flora on public and private property in the area. Kerry Rd, particularly the eastern side, has valuable remnants. Among the species present are Cassytha glabella, Astroloma humifusum and Daviesia leptophylla.

Glenvale Rd, between Barnsdale Way and Oban Rd has some remarkable vegetation, and some species present do not occur elsewhere in the municipality. These include Pomaderris prunifolia and Solenogyne sp. (not yet positively identified to species level yet). This area is classified 'Significant Roadside Area'.

Lincoln Rd has some interesting vegetation and its current maintenance regime should be reexamined. The eastern corner of Caromar St is particularly interesting for its small population of Bulbine bulbosa, which has nearly been annihilated by slashing. There are also many Arthropodium strictum present on the embankment on the southern side of Lincoln Rd at this point. A more thorough vegetation survey is required to determine what is present and where.

The southern side of Tereddan Drive has some excellent vegetation, including Patersonia occidentalis, Commesperma ericinum, Goodenia lanata, Thelymitra sp. and others. Any spraying of the open unformed drain at the road edge should only be done under close supervision.

The northern end of Dorset Rd, with its Eucalyptus melliodoras is also of value, and should not be disregarded. Considerable damage has been done to these trees by Council, Melbourne Water and private contractors during trenching and road works. Replanting should be considered.

The railway embankment along Sherlock Rd also has some significant species, including Prasophyllum pyriforme, and should be surveyed to determine precisely what is present. Graeme Lorimer has done some work on the site and may well suggest fencing some sections to prevent further slashing.

Brysons Rd has some good tree cover, and would be worth assessing for any special maintenance needs.

Knee Lane used to have virtues, but most of its values have been destroyed by residents clearing understorey illegally and without prosecution or recompense.

The western side of Bayswater Rd, between Tintern Avenue and Canterbury Rd contains some valuable remnants which we continue to slash, we could at least wait until the grasses, Dillwynias etc have set seed before we behead them.

Canterbury Rd, west of Dorset Rd, (Significant Roadside Area) is in dire need of weed control work and some replanting, but we will have to know the status of the De Felice development first. We may lose this piece of swamp gum - silver-leaf stringybark community for access ways if we are not careful.

Gibson Rd still has some understorey species and a reasonable upper canopy.

Cecil Circuit/Vasey Concourse/Montana Parade/Cheong Street/Ruthven Way/Angus Avenue area deserves not just to be maintained at status quo, but, with the help of local residents, to be revegetated where practical. Although Ruthven Way and Angus Avenue are private streets, Council has been known to spray the unformed drain at the road edge and, in the process, spray out a band of indigenous grasses and herbs on the nature strip more than a metre wide. This irritates the residents considerably.

Cecil Circuit road reserve, a closure of the road not considered a reserve as such, and its boundaries are ill-defined. A concrete path and rock retaining wall have been installed on the eastern boundary to allow access from Montana Parade. One public planting has been held, several years ago. Vegetation quality is not high.

The all-purpose trail around Dorset Golf course is just over 3 kilometres in length and harbours some good overstorey, particularly along the northern boundary of the golf course, where the trail passes Larissa Court and Edward Court. This area is slashed and, as a result, is losing understorey species. If slashing was reduced, good regeneration would result, including Microlaena stipoides, which, in shaded and relatively undisturbed areas, will out compete exotic grasses.

DEXTER'S BUSH 46 Dickasons Road, Heathmont (729 5231)

In 1956, we bought 5 acres running down to Dandenong Creek and, over the years, we maintained the bush by the creek.

In 1980, we were obliged to sell to the Council the "Proposed Public Open Space" by the creek (about 0.6 acre), but we immediately leased it back and continued to look after it.

In 1988, we gave 2.5 acres to the Victorian Conservation Trust as a nature reserve; part was mature bush next to the Council land, part had pine trees on it. The pines were removed (80 of them), the area fenced and we have had wonderful regeneration of indigenous species, some significant to the Heathmont area. We are managing this on behalf of the Trust.

In 1992, we agreed with the Council and the Trust that it would be better if the lease on the bush by the Creek were transferred from us to the Trust. This was done and again we are managing this on behalf of the Trust (and Council).

Just on two years ago, we agreed informally with Ringwood Parks and Gardens to look after a further piece of Council land on the creek adjacent to the leased area. This was in a terrible mess. Undesirable species were removed by Council staff at our direction and the area was fenced. Natural regeneration is occuring, Council staff have given great support by way of indigenous plants and chemicals and the area is looking good. We have just finished planting a further 100 shrubs and trees.

All the langed - the two council areas, the Trust area and our home block of just under two acres have been approved individually by "Land for Wildlife". Our birds are back, including blue wrens.

Liz and I would like to invite Steve Goble to look at the whole area, including the land next door which we all hope can be preserved.

HARPER'S BUSH 200 Canterbury Road, Heathmont

The Harpers purchased 14 acres in the centre of Heathment just before World War II. In 1988, they gave 10 acres of this to the Victorian Conservation Trust and Joan Harper and her son David manage the area on behalf of the Trust.

This is a very significant area of bush with some wonderful species including orchids. There is a weed problem and Heathmont Bushlink works on it on a regular basis.

There is now a wildlife corridor along Dandenong Creek from Alexander's (next to ours), through our bush and the Council areas, along Dandenong Creek to the Parker Reserve, through this to the railway line and so to the Harpers.
