

JACK MONTGOMERY — Historical Artist

- Qualified in art at Caulfield and Melbourne Technical Colleges (A.T.C., D.T.S.C.) 1944.
- Commissioned A.M.F. 1945.
- Worked under War Artist, Len Bennie, and water-colourist, C. C. McNamara, 1946-47.
- After experience in architectural rendering commenced art teaching in 1948.
- On loan from the Education Department to the Commonwealth Government in Northern Territory 1951.
- Received Parliament House, Canberra, in connection with Jubilee Celebrations 1951.

Devoted to recording only fast vanishing Australian landmarks and by-gone history, Jack Montgomery has learnt much of Australiana by cycling, hitch-hiking, and jackerooing in the outback.

In 1950 he cycled from Melbourne to Perth across the Nullabor Plain and since then has covered 20,000 miles of "off the track" Australia.

Now in residence at Upwey, in the Dandenong Ranges, Jack's early experiences in Central Australia has aided recent compositions.

In 1962 he won the Bright Centenary water-colour award.

He is at present the senior art teacher at Ringwood Technical School, having served on the art staffs of Melbourne, Prahran and Caulfield Technical Colleges.
