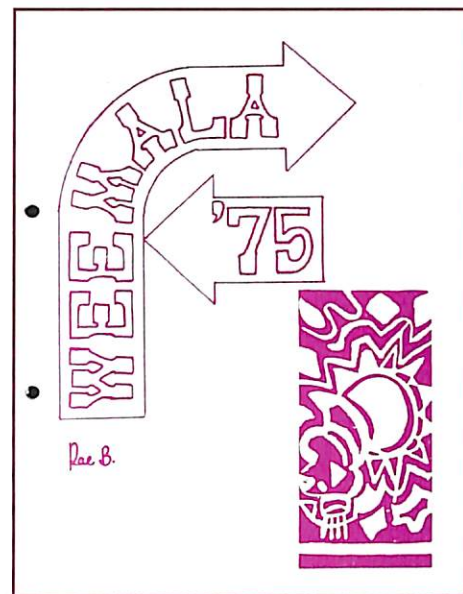

FLASHBACK WEEMALA 1975



In 1975, Norwood welcomed to its teaching ranks some of its most well-known and long-serving staff: Pam Webb, Krissy MacLellan, Helen Greenfield, and Danny O'Connor.

The school was still finding its identity and, much like today, new buildings and renovations were underway.



Literature and art was a big focus of the time, as was the threat of a nuclear winter - in fact a whole page of the '75 Weemala debated the pros and cons of this revolutionary nuclear energy.

Four decades later, at the advent of new green energies, we can look back and see how far we as a school and society have come.

MR. ANDREW SLOANE SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

Ancient Greek philosopher Heraclitus of Ephesus noted, around 500BC, that "Change is the only constant in life". The wisdom in his epithet remains true to this day. While the essence of Norwood has continued through 2015, there have been some significant changes to many aspects of the College. Some of these changes have been quite visible and others less so. The celebration of student achievements, for example, has become a formal part of each semester and parents of the students being recognised are included in the events at school.

We developed a significant program for Year 9 students in conjunction with Deakin University which sees our students learning and working at Deakin for a full week. Feedback from the students was overwhelmingly positive – all felt they were treated as university students...not Year 9. Students in Year 10 and 11 have, in increasing numbers chosen to study a VCE subject above their year level. The Music program continues to grow and thrive.

We are nearing the moment when we will have a design for our Gymnasium. We trust that most of the items on our 'wish list' will be able to be incorporated into the new building. Having waited 58 years to have a purpose-built PE and Sport space, the College deserves to have one that will meet our needs into the future. Construction will take place during 2016 and the site is being cleared of portables over the Christmas break.

Our next goal is to complete our Master Planning for the construction of a revitalised Norwood Secondary College. It is a long-held goal to have facilities that complement the outstanding programs and teaching that are a feature of the College. The moment when the process commences is nearing.

The nature of schools sees staff change over time. We saw the retire



ment of some long-term and valued members of staff during 2015. Jenny Mason commenced at Norwood in 1990 and was an Assistant Principal from 1998. Her contribution to the College during her 26 years was immense and her relationships with staff and students endure beyond her retirement.

Three highly valued staff will join Jenny in retirement, at the end of 2015. Paul Bartholomeusz, who commenced at the school in 1988 when it was known as Norwood High School, Anne O'Donoghue, who joined Norwood Secondary College in 1989 and Harbans Sekhom, who joined Norwood in 2013, following 10 years at Parkwood Secondary College will all say their farewells at the end of the year. The College community has benefitted greatly from the contributions of these staff and they will be sorely missed by students and colleagues, alike. We wish all a long and productive retirement.

It is particularly appropriate to pass on thanks to a number of the Norwood team, as we reflect on the past year. Assistant Principals Geoff Castles and Jackie Harris have contributed enormously to the experiences of students and the culture of the college. Their involvement in life of the College has been significant.

They have been integral to the many developments and innovations seen during 2015 and they will, equally, be involved in further initiatives and facilities development in the future. The Leadership Team (composed mainly of our Leading Teachers) has been increasingly involved in the strategic direction of the College and the broadening of input to planning and reflection has proven to be a most appropriate direction to take. Business Manager, Jane Arnold, continues to offer keen oversight of our finances and leadership of our Administration Team. I am very grateful for the wonderful work of our Administrative staff. Whether 'Front of House', support staff or Integration Aide, their professionalism and enthusiasm in the work they do for staff and with students may sometimes not be seen, but is always appreciated.

Finally, we anticipate the coming year being rich with change – facilities, innovative classroom practices, a broadening of possible experiences for students and more – as our focus on ongoing improvement leads the development of Norwood Secondary College into the future.

Best wishes to all in our community for the coming break. We look forward to hearing of the journeys of our Class of 2015 in the coming years.

our participation in the Alliance Française competition in the middle of this year. We had over 90 students in Year 7 and 8 participate and over 30 students in Years 9 and 10.

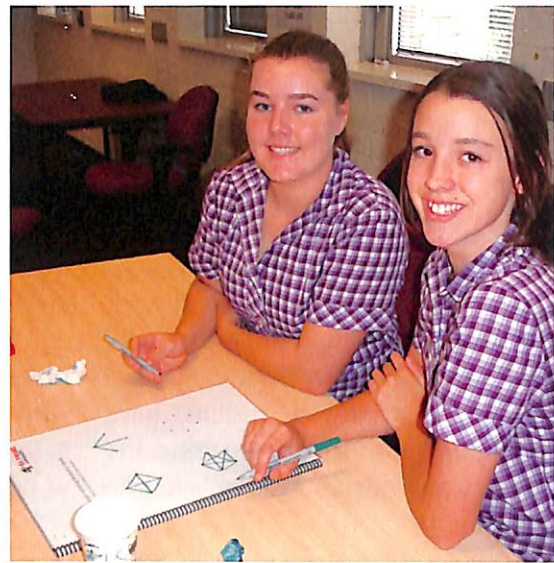

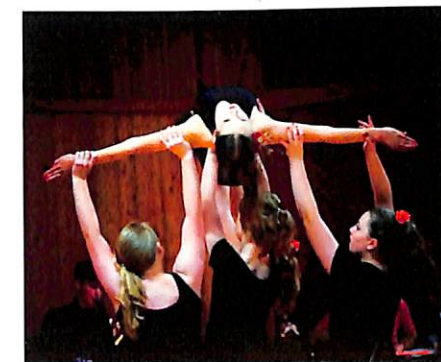

We also have the proposed 2016 New Caledonia study tour, where students will meet many of these pen pals

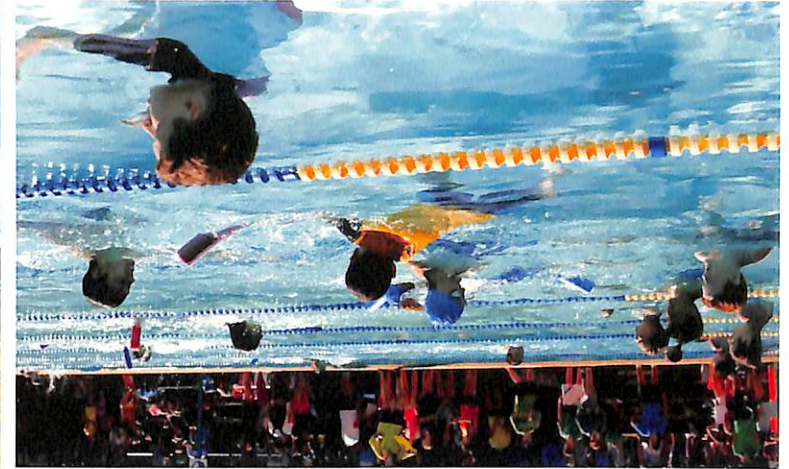

In 1996, the AFL chose Norwood to represent Victoria against the champion NSW team in a 9-a-side competition at AFL Park Waverly, as our Junior team had been undefeated in the first

year of Girls Footy. We defeated Hay H.S. 7.7 (49) v 1.1 (7). We were invited back in 1997 and defeated Narrandera H.S. 6.4 (40) v 3.4 (22) and again in 1998 when the scores against Narrandera were 4.4 (28) v 0.0 (0). In 1999, the AFL decided that it would choose the top private school for us to tackle in the last event of this kind at AFL Park, and we scored 5.5 (35) v Ballarat and Clarendon College's 0.0 (0). The girls were thrilled to play in front of impressive and impressed crowds. In addition over these 4 years, we were invited by the AFL to play 4 exhibition games against quality teams from Victoria and NSW at half time during the VFL preliminary finals at Port Melbourne.

Being pictured on the front page of The Maroondah Mail, being interviewed by Garry Lyon on television at the MCG studio, being featured in the Education Gazette and being on the front cover of Education Age were also highlights for a variety of our pioneering, successful girls. Thank you to all players, officials, staff and parents who assisted and encouraged the teams. Thank you, also, to the 1994 contingent who paved the way by playing matches after school against private schools in our area. May the next 21 years be just as rewarding for all concerned!

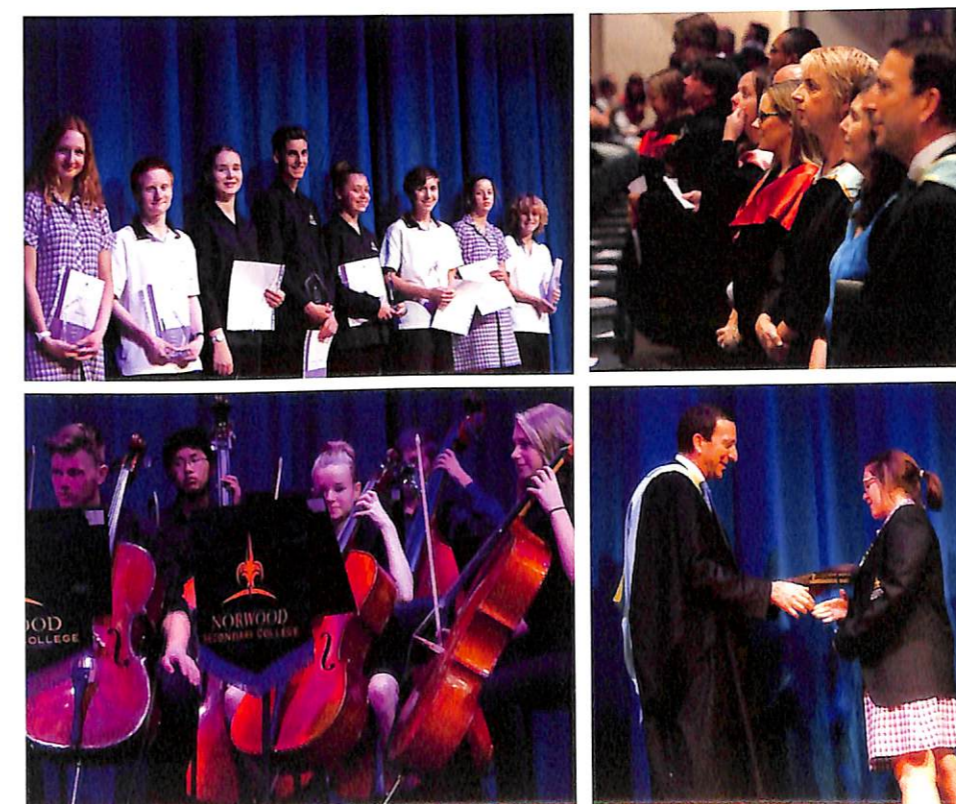

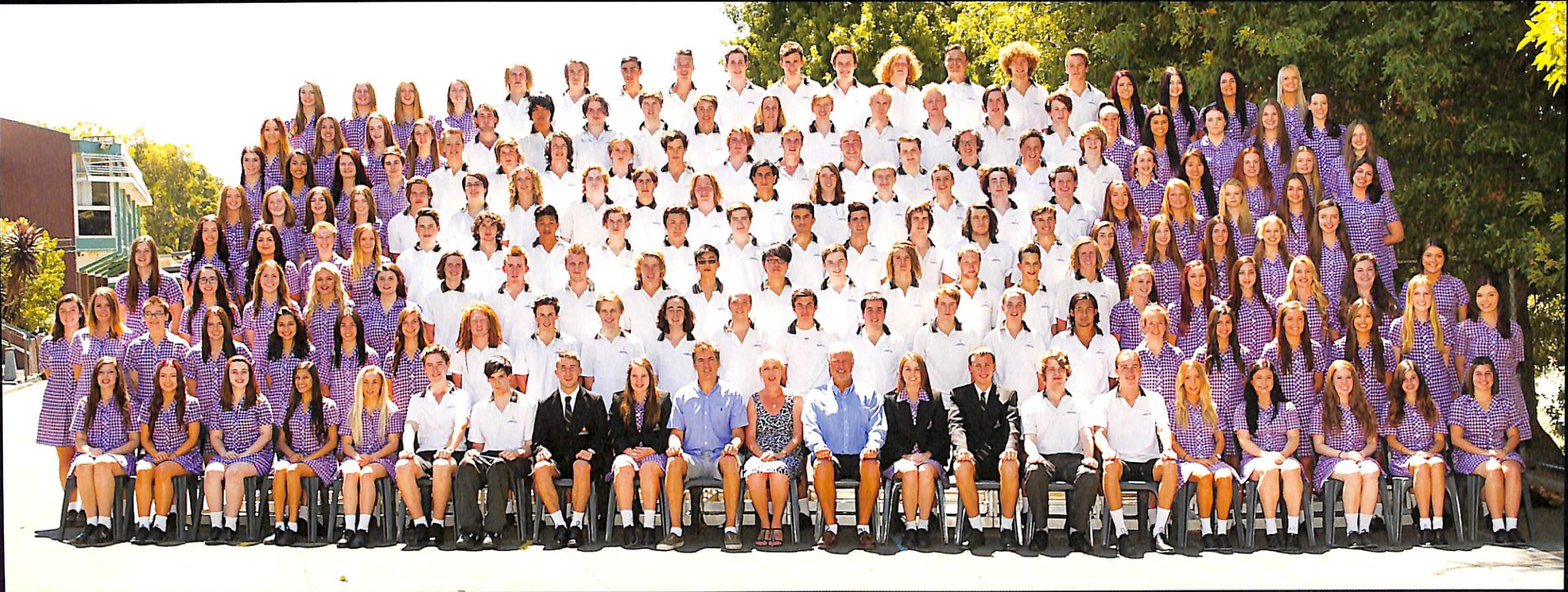

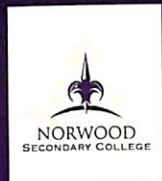
