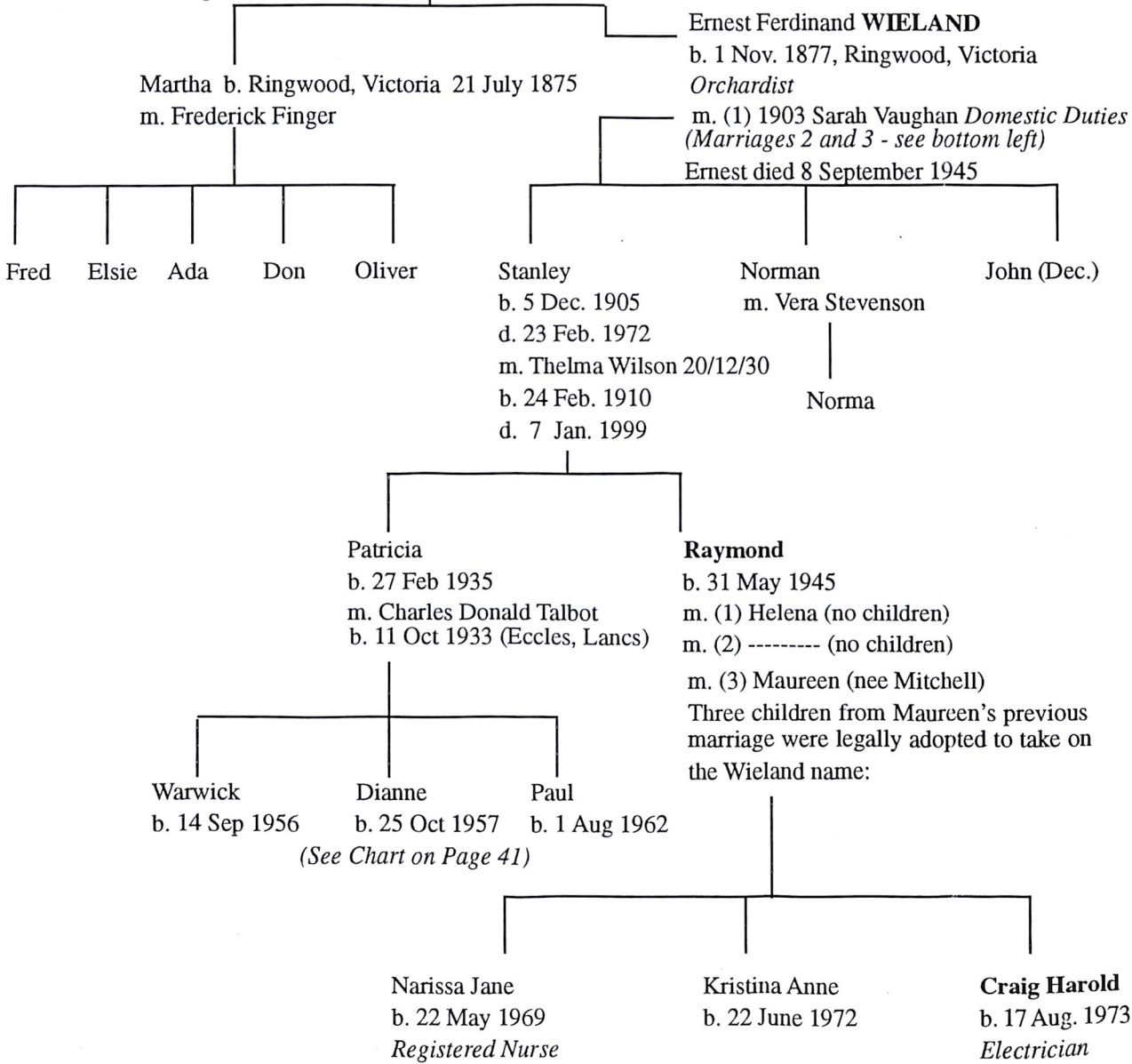

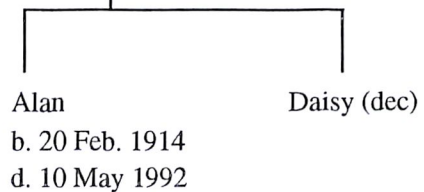

Whereas in accordance with the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the fifty-fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, numbered 1063, intituled "An Act to Consolidate the Law relating to Aliens," Carl Ferdinand Wickland of Angermunde in the Colony of Victoria, Gardiner has presented to me in Council a Memorial, signed and verified upon oath in the form and manner prescribed by the said recited Act, praying that Letters of Naturalization may be granted to him, such Petition being accompanied by a Certificate, as required by the said Act: And whereas I, the Governor of the said Colony of Victoria, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council of the same, have thought fit to grant such Letters of Naturalization to the said Carl Ferdinand Wickland and the said Carl Ferdinand Wickland having taken the oath prescribed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor

aforsaid, do hereby grant unto the said Carl Ferdinand Wickland all the rights and capacities within the said Colony of Victoria of a natural-born British subject, except that of becoming a member of the Executive Council of the said Colony, and subject to the provisions set forth in the said recited Act.

## Raymond Stanley Wieland

Ray operated Pyramid Garages at Stanley Park, Withcott.

In November, 1972, he and his first wife, Helena, and his mother went to the Gold Coast to visit Don and Marian Talbot.

In January 2, 1973, Ray and Helena returned to Melbourne where Helena favoured an office job rather than working on a farm.

Ray arrived at Stanley Park with workmate 'Little' John on December 22, 1973, and Ray moved into our house at Stanley Park in February 1974.

He put an advertisement in The Chronicle, Toowoomba seeking a female companion and the result was Carol, who worked at the Toowoomba Telephone Exchange.

In August 1974, he was in partnership with W. 'Bill' Cunningham operating Pyramid Garages from Gittins Road, Withcott.

Ray moved out of our house on December 20, 1974 and into his own six-berth caravan.. It cost \$2000 with annex.

In June 1975, Ray was advertising double garages priced from \$1150 and single garages from \$790, with erection \$220 extra, and carports from \$600 with \$150 extra for erection. Finance was available on no deposit.

In October 1975 Ray's mother began working with him at Pyramid Garages. The families were not getting on and Mrs Wieland left Stanley Park to live firstly in Toowoomba in November 1975. She later moved to New Zealand and then back to Australia to live with Ray and his new wife, Maureen, in Victoria.
