#### THE PRESIDENT

Once again we offer our sincere thanks to our President Mr. Kenneth Wright. Ken has brought us through a very tough period. This year we encountered many and varied problems, and a man of lesser strength would have thrown in the towel, but Ken as usual threw down the gauntlet and fought to the end, and we finished the season on a high note.

We must again extend our congratulations to Ken, on being made a Member of the British Empire. A title that has been hard earned.

#### **SEASON 1973**

The 1973 season I suppose, will go down as one of our most troubled years in the history of the League. I think if anything could happen in football circles, it happened this year. But now the season is over if we try to analyse the problems and find a remedy these problems will not face us again in the future, we probably will end up just where we started. One of the greatest problems in football, is not enough workers in a club. Everyone is willing to go on the committee providing someone else does all the work, and very soon the willing horse rebels and joins the watchers, and as a result the club soon finds itself in trouble and the watchers become critics and in most cases passes the blame onto someone else.

One solution would be for clubs in close proximity to unite and form a strong club with double the amount of workers. Strong clubs will attract a better class player and have more support all round.

The major problem most clubs faced during the year was water logged ovals. True we had a particularly wet winter, but most of the grounds effected are the same every year. These clubs should approach the council concerned during the summer months and keep on their backs until proper drainage is installed.

We again experienced far too many problems in the junior ranks, mainly in the under 17 age group. Possibly the biggest problem here is that at 17 some of these fellows consider themselves to be men, and indeed men they are (sporting beards, driving motor cars and drinking beer) they have very little consideration for the younger boys playing in the opposing teams. One solution would be to lower the age group to an under 16 competition.

Looking on the brighter side, I think most clubs found an increase in attendances this year. this was evident during the final series, as most gates were records. It was interesting to note that attendances at 1st Division grand final was only about 100 less than the V.F.A. 1st div. grand final, which goes to show how our League is growing.

For the coming season serious consideration should be given to the formation of a junior competition, similar to the S.S.B. Little League, which could be played during the half time break in the senior games. This could be a successful move, and would help clubs in future years to maintain the older junior teams, as many clubs are finding it hard to field under 13 and under 15 teams in opposition to teams which play on Sundays.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT

After the completion of my first year as Secretary to the League, my sympathy goes out to all league secretarys. Although I came through the season unscathed on the surface, my inner self has been badly bruised. There were many times during the year when I could have packed my traps and walked out without feeling any remorse whatsoever. I suppose it is the same in any job, one makes a certain amount of enemies through no fault of his own, but at the same time I made a lot of very good friends who helped me no end and the support they gave me through the year was invaluable.

One thing that upset me most was to repeatedly issue fines to clubs, as at one time I was a club secretary and I know how hard it is to have to raise money to support clubs. But if clubs keep doing the wrong thing there is no alternative but to resort to fines.

I would like to pay special tribute to my assistant Mrs. Barclay, who helped to carry me through the year and without her assistance I don't think I could have carried on.

We have heard numerous rumors through the season of clubs pulling out of this league and going into other leagues, we even had a number of clubs forming a break-a-way league, on the other hand we have had clubs not happy with the league they are in, making applications to join our league. But now things have settled down and we look like facing 1974 with the same clubs as last year, let us all try a little bit harder to do the right thing and get harmony back into the league and make it work as it should.
