THE PRESIDENT

The time has once again arrived for us to offer our most sincere thanks to our President Mr. Kenneth Wright. Ken has again guided us through a difficult year. We again encountered the inevitable problems which are common to Football Clubs, but Ken never shirked the issue and thanks to his strong Leadership, lead us once again into calm waters. A leader of lesser ability would have succumbed and left us foundering. Ken's hours of dedication to this League are the more meritorious this year because of his Wife's serious illness. We extend to Mrs. Wright our wishes for a speedy recovery and look forward to the days when she can again take her place at Ken's side.

SEASON 1974

The 1974 season is now safely written into the records and as such we can look back and reflect on our achievements both on and off the field.

Now that the battle clouds have drifted away we again reflect on some of our failures. The age old problem of how best to administer our Juniors. Thanks to the foresight of our Executive Officers some of the unpleasant duties of our Tribunal have been erased. The behaviour of a small number of our Juniors still leaves a lot to be desired. However the introduction of the order off rule to the under 17 sections has proved a worthwhile addition and has reduced the attendances at the Tribunal hearings.

One of the great mysteries is that in the main Juniors are under good control and one can be assured that good Leadership is given within most of the Clubs, however there are still Clubs within our ranks who as it appears leaves the running of their Juniors to one or two stout hearted supporters and by the end of each season they have lost interest and as such the Juniors are left to fend for themselves. The sooner all Clubs realize that the Juniors of today are the Seniors of tomorrow the better our League will be and also their own Clubs.

This past season was a particularly damp one with the wet running right through to the final series. Great credit must be given to the Councils who control the grounds for the way they have faced the unenviable task of keeping the grounds in some way playable. Particular thanks to the controlling bodies who prepared the grounds for our Finals. On most occasions Councils had staff available, weather permitting, to prepare the grounds early on Saturdays and Sundays as the case may be.

Attendances in general have been down a little on past season and again we ponder to find a reason for this. We cannot lay the blame for poor attendances on Local News Media (or can we). The coverage given to our League in the Local papers is very sparse and in this light our would be local supporters are not receiving the encouragement to identify themselves with their local teams. Another aspect is the continued use of filthy language both on and off the field by a minute section of players and supporters. Some so called supporters appear to take great delight in upsetting their immediate friends or rivals and it seems immaterial to this small section that women and children are within their hearing. The gaudy rule accepted by a large number of junior spectators that you cannot watch sport without having hard liquor appears to be predominant and as such is spoiling the image of our great game.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The time has arrived for me to compile the Secretary's report for 1974. Whilst I am honoured to present same I feel that your past Secretary Mr. M. Carroll must take the honours for yet another successful year for the E.D.F.L. Prior to my appointment Mick had carried out all the spade work and laid the foundations within the Office for this season for which I am most grateful.

The age old problem of Unregistered Players playing in Clubs within our boundaries again raised its ugly head. This gave your Executive Officers and Members some sleepless nights and forced them to advance some unpopular penalties. Likewise I took no delight in having to check the records and submit the results to the Committee.

I, like my predecessors, felt very unhappy in having to write out fines to Clubs for failing to comply with the rules which you all have helped to frame, however let us all pull together and thus avoid these fines.

This year the E.D.F.L. hosted an under age team from the Gold Coast and the boys were billeted out in private homes throughout our area. We played two games against the visitors and although the conditions were very bad, the visiting team showed that our great Code of Football is making good progress in Queensland. The host team won both games by a big margin but from all reports all enjoyed the venture.

It was very disappointing the lack of interest by a large majority of Clubs in this venture but I feel sure that the few Clubs who did participate in this trial venture had nothing but praise for the boys.

Thanks to the Ringwood Football Club for the assistance given in making their Ground and Rooms available, also the Lilydale Football Club for the use of their Ground, and in particular to all those kind people who took the visiting boys into their homes.

At this point I would like to pay special thanks to Mrs. Judy Taylor, my assistant in our office. We were both new chums to the Office and to have this tour thrust upon us was a little out of the ordinary to the every day routine but not be be defeated Judy mastered the situation and without her efforts the tour would not have been the success it was

The locations for our final series in all Divisions received some criticism but some of the Councils who control the grounds in the district appear to have been affected by inflation as shown in the Rent they were asking for their Grounds. One Council wanted in excess of \$1,000.00 for the use of their ground to stage one of our finals series. Your Executive resolved that this amount was well beyond the capacity of this League to bear, and other locations were arranged at a much cheaper rate. This in turn will help all Clubs as eventually they would have had these increased costs channelled into their Clubs Coffers. Requests for admission to our League continue, and we have refused two clubs this season. In one case the necessary four teams were not available and in the other the Club was outside our area. The general thinking was that we should restrict our League to our own area and consolidate within. One of the main reasons for the refusal was that the bigger the League the higher our administrations costs would be.

The Eastern Districts Football League may again take pride in the fact that although outside costs are increasing daily they have again successfully completed another season without having to increase fees to Clubs, how long this can continue is anybody's guess. Most other leagues have been forced to increase their charges. A big problem facing every League next season is the increase in Postage and Telephone Rates. How best to overcome these increases - we will just have to wait and see.
