SEASON 1975

The 1975 season is now history and the achievements have been written into the books. We can now look back with pride and reflect.

The battle clouds have again drifted away, allowing us to reflect upon our achievements and or failures. Once again the Junior competition has been a problem with teams scratching from the draw.

This year a total of 6 Junior sides withdrew. 3 under 17 teams, 2 under 15 teams and 1 under 13 team. How best to administer this competition with the Junior remains somewhat of a problem. A small minority of these players behavior still leaves a lot to be desired.

The Order off rule in these grades has again proved worthwhile and has allowed Juniors to continue playing football each week, to say nothing of the reduced attendances at the Tribunal.

Over all the Juniors are well behaved but their Sportsmanship is marred by a few over zealous players who unfortunately give a bad name to the majority. Good Leadership is given by most Clubs and they are being rewarded for this. However some clubs are still not putting enough effort into their Juniors and unfortunately these Clubs have to remember "The Juniors of today will be their Seniors tomorrow and later their Clubs Administrators".

When this has been adopted throughout the League great benefits will be reaped by all. If all Clubs placed as much importance on their Junior Coaches as they do for the Senior Coach then and only then will they have the numbers necessary to field strong Junior teams.

This past season was reasonably dry with very few wet days for our great game with the exception of the finals when at times one could not be blamed for thinking that we should have been playing "Water Polo". Once again our humble thanks go out to Councils and the Clubs hosting the finals. Without their undaunted help we would have been left lamenting. How some of the grounds on which we played our finals were at the least playable is nothing short of amazing. To all who assisted in the preparation of these grounds we are most grateful.

Attendances throughout the year showed an increase over the previous seasons and this is most probably attributed to the dry weather during the season, thus creating great interest in the finals.

We commenced the 1975 season in a blaze of glory from the Newspapers with good publicity. However as the year progressed the coverage diminished and at times reports on our games were very hard to find. The coverage given overall to our League was rather sparse, thus depriving a large number of residents in the area in which we operate the opportunity to identify themselves with their local teams and so become involved. As was the case in past years a minute number of spectators again identified themselves with filthy language, usually after having embibed in intoxicating liquor.

To these so called supporters the only way to barrack is to abuse all players and the umpire alike. Thanks to a number of the Clubs Officials this type of behaviour was not as prominent as in the past years and hopefully will be further reduced in 1976.

Overall 1975 was a most successful year and we look forward to 1976.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

We can now look back upon 1975 Football Season with few regrets. After the completion of the 1974 season a number of alterations were made at the Office, with the most important change being the location of the General Office. With these alterations came a new safe to store what could be termed irreplaceable documents all helping to improve the efficiency.

This year as in past years, the old problem of players being unregistered or ineligible again raised its ugly head.

This gave your Executive Committee and Permit Committee some sleepless nights and forced them to announce some unpopular decisions. It is not an easy task to deliberate on Clubs misfortunes and then have to penalise them in some way. The Executive Committee can only make decisions after hearing all the facts and I can assure all that it is not easy to put forward damaging evidence. I was most gratified with the way the Clubs accepted the Executives decisions. To me this showed the calibre of people who administer the Clubs within our League.

One of the inksome tasks within the Office is having to issue fines to clubs for failing to comply with directions laid down in the Rule Book.

If the League is to continue to be a success all clubs have to adhere to the Rules. Unfortunately some clubs are only prepared to adhere to the rules after fines have been issued. To avoid further problems let us all try and stick to the rules as laid down by the Club Delegates and work as one happy family. After all we are striving for the one thing and that is to provide good clean healthy winter sport for the Boys and Young Men in the Eastern Districts.

It was very disappointing the lack of interest and support shown by clubs when they were invited to nominate an U/15 player for the proposed trip to the Gold Coast during the 1975 May school holidays. Only 12 nominations were received and as football matches had been arranged, it was easy to see that the 12 players nominated were not sufficient, thus the tour was cancelled much to the disappointment of the Queensland boys.

The Junior Competition this year again saw teams dropping out. 3 teams from the Under 17, 2 teams from the under 15, and 1 team from the under 13 competition withdrew giving the inevitable bye to teams each week. The Under 13 competition finished with 14 teams but in 3rd Division Under 17 there were 3 teams missing and this caused problems with Clubs fielding the full compliment. The Under 15 competition in 2nd and 3rd Division both had a bye each week until Norwood asked for and was given permission to field a second Under 15 side in 3rd Division part way through the season eliminating the bye in this section.

The Executive Committee again this year came in for criticism over their choice of venues for our final series.

Reflecting back on these games I believe their choice was correct as each Division was most successful. When making arrangements for these games the Executive do not have many alternatives. There are only a limited number of grounds available and we have to make the best of what is offered. Many Councils are unwilling to allow Football on their grounds after the Home and Away games are played. They believe that if the weather is wet much damage is done to their grounds and that Cricket is somewhat set back whilst they are repairing the alleged damage.

Again this year we have had inquiries from two Clubs outside our League to join our ranks but unfortunately both Clubs could not field the necessary 4 teams and they were advised to make applications in other quarters. When one of these Clubs was asked why they wished to affiliate with our League they replied, "Your costs are lower than other Leagues both administration and Umpires".

This year our League was forced to increase their charges to Clubs to help bridge the gap caused by increased charges for stationery, printing and communications. At the start of the 1975 season printing and stationery costs had risen by at least 30% and postal charges by 33¹/₃%.

We were able to operate on an increase of 25% overall, thus absorbing at least 5% of the rises in goods supplied to the League. With the ever increasing cost outside this League it is hard to imagine that we will be able to continue on with our present scale of fees. The biggest problem facing the office, cost wise, is the high cost of postage and somehow this item will need careful thought as to how best the interests of all clubs can be served with a minimum postage.

I would be remiss in this report if I did not pay tribute to the work performed in helping to run this League by my assistant Mrs. Judie Taylor. Judie as she is known to all, has been a tower of strength to me and her willingness to co-operate at all times has been most appreciated. Likewise the assistance given to clubs by Judie has been gratefully received. Thanks Judie.

The Best and Fairest vote counting night and the Annual Presentation night this year were two of the biggest events that this League has run. Both of these evenings drew in excess of 580 people and this speaks volumes for mixed company. After all if the Ladies were not available to help at Club level we would not have Clubs attending and likewise would find it difficult to form a League.

To all Clubs Officials, Delegates, Players and supporters who have assisted the League in any way, my sincere thanks, for had it not been for your forbearance I would not be compiling this report. To our Umpires Board, Umpires, Tribunal, Permit Committee, Players' Accident Fund Committee and Trainers, we thank you all for a difficult job well done and may you all be back in 1976 to assist the League when we, with pride, provide sport for the boys and young men in the Eastern Districts.

Before closing this report I would like to pay tribute to one of your Executive Committee members who has found it necessary to retire.

I am writing of Mr. Viv Bidstrup who was your Senior Vice President. Viv has served this League well for 10 years and was always a willing worker. His untiring work within the League was done with little fuss and very rarely did he look for credit. On many occasions he saw something needed attention and went and rectified the position before most people knew that attention was required. One only had to ask him for assistance and it was given. This League is the richer for having had Viv on our Executive and it was a sad blow to us when he tendered his resignation. To Viv I say on the League's behalf "Thanks for a mammoth job well done" and may you have the success desired in your business.
