With a league as large as the E.D.F.L. the demand for grounds on which to play our finals was once again quite a problem. Our sincere thanks to the Councils on whose grounds we played our finals. Our thanks also to the Councils who had problems with their grounds and we sincerely hope that your grounds will be available in 1981 to once again serve the players and the community in the staging of our great game of Australian Rules Football.

Because our numbers have once again increased, the demand for our services has increased and to this end, the E.D.F.L. has entered into new fields of service demanding a much larger working area. We have also purchased a property in Scoresby Road, Boronia — the development of which will enable the League to render an even better service to all.

Our wholesaling of goods to our clubs at very attractive prices now includes Soft Drinks, Foodstuffs, Footballs, Umpires' Equipment, Jumpers, Shorts, First-Aid Supplies, etc.

SECRETARY'S REPORT — SEASON 1980

Season 1980 is now complete and we can look back on another successful year for the League.

They are the supremely successful clubs, but we must not forget all the other teams who won flags, competed unsuccessfully in the finals, and the clubs who did not make the four, who played each week in the home and away games. Every club and player is necessary for our League.

Weatherwise, the season was reasonably good to us. Some grounds, of course, were not up to standard, and there's not much the League can do except talk to Councils and try and improve conditions. We must have done something good for the weather we had in our Final Series. Each week, the sun shone and if the wind was rather strong, it was something we just had to take.

The Final Series were well fought out. Games were played hard but fair, and our thanks go to the Umpires Board for providing such a high standard of umpiring.

Season 1980 had its problems administration-wise with yours truly taking over the position of Acting Secretary midway through May. I wish to thank Judie Taylor and Stephen Mason for the way they rallied round and helped me and the League over a difficult period. We agreed that the League must go on and that the situation was bigger than us; there were too many clubs and players depending on it.

I wish to thank all the club secretaries who rang and pledged support and all those who offered help. It was most pleasing to us and we really appreciated it.

This year the Lightning Premierships for Under 10 and Under 12's took on a new look with Under 10's and 12's playing on the same day for their club. We had very few complaints and a lot of praise for this change of play. Yarra Glen was once again the host club, and are to be congratulated on the way they did their job on both the Sundays. Playing off games in this way also meant that four flags instead of two were won, and this spreads the success.

There has been mixed feelings about the changed age groupings to Under 14, 16 and 18. Most clubs agree, however, that it should be given a good chance to survive and stress the importance of keeping these age groups for a least another year.

The Under 14 age groups — East and West, seem to have been a trifle top heavy this year with the four well away from all other contestants. Hopefully, something can be done to even up the competition for the coming season. It's hard to judge in this age group who is going to be successful until the season starts. A team finishing last in 1980 may have all the ingredients for success in 1981.

The Marketing Division of the League progressed well with nearly all clubs participating. Of course, the more participation the more success we can have in this division. It requires a great amount of office time and it must pay for wages and make a profit into the bargain, otherwise it's not worth the effort.

Presentation Night this year was staged at Rembrandt's Restaurant at Wantirna, and by the number of phone calls we have received at the office, it must be judged the best Presentation Night ever. Thank you to all who took the trouble to ring or come in and tell us. A great deal of time and effort goes into a night such as this, and it's a bonus when it is a success and well received. Particularly, I would like to thank my husband, Rick Barclay for his part in the staging and compering the evening.

On this particular night, we made a Presentation to our President, Mr. Kenneth Wright, M.B.E, J.P. who completed his 25th year of office with our League. Twenty-five years! There is not many among us who can boast of such service. He has led the League through stumbling beginnings into the large, successful organisation we now enjoy. I think his success has been his complete impartiality. He has never been a member of any football club, and each club appearing before him knows that they will receive a good hearing. I know I echo you all when I offer him our congratulations on his Silver Jubilee.

Finally, thanks must go to all those people who work in a voluntary capacity, and give of their time so that the League may flourish and prosper. I refer to the Independent Tribunal, Permit Committee, Umpires Appointment Board, Players Accident Fund and most important, the Executive Committee of the League. Without these bodies of men, the League would perish.

Now that this season is over, and the worries diminished — I must admit I rather enjoyed it!

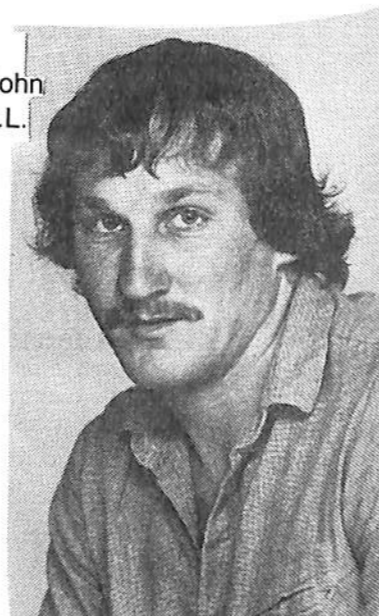
