Season 1981 proved to be a challenging year for the League. The decision to affiliate with the newly formed Victorian Metropolitan Football League was one of the most important decisions the League has made over recent years, just as important as the one made many years ago to withdraw from the now defunct Victorian Football Union.

The requirement for all players entering or leaving the League to gain a clearance, threw a heavy burden on Club Secretaries and the League Office. It was a credit to all concerned that these clearances were handled with a minimum of hassle. Full credit should go to Stephen Mason of the League Office in the way he quickly became familiar with all the clearance rules and the efficient manner in which he controlled over 2000 clearance applications.

The V.M.F.L. has a lot of obstacles to overcome and it is a credit to their Board that a number of ambitions were accomplished so early in its life. Our own Bob Tregear and later Bruce Holmes, played an important role in formulating V.M.F.L. policy. I personally hold the view that eventually the V.M.F.L. will need to be divided into major and minor Leagues, similarly to the Victorian Country Football League, but in the meantime our League should offer full support and leadership in this very sincere effort to bring some sanity into football administration and control.

The League's move to its own headquarters in Scoresby Rd in February marked the end to many years discussion, proposals and counter proposals. Whilst the property is inadequate in size for the League's requirements, all Clubs and officials should get behind this venture and ensure that, with the necessary extensions, the property serves their needs for years to come. It is probably in as central a position as possible in the League's vast area and certainly deserves to be given a chance, even by the knockers.

The playing of our interdivisional championships over the Queen's Birthday weekend was a new innovation which had mixed success. Congratulations were (and are) extended to the First Division for winning the Senior Championship and to the Third Divison for the Under 18's Championship. Serious consideration must be given by all Clubs of the League as to whether these Championships are to be an annual fixture. The raffle conducted in association with the Championships, to aid the "Yarra Me' Quadraplegic Centre, also received mixed support from the Clubs and should not be conducted again unless ALL Clubs guarantee their support.

The season proved to be a very wet one, resulting in many grounds being not fit to be played on. That Clubs did in fact play on them, under extremely difficult circumstances, proves the great love of the game in our area. Congratulations are extended to all Premiership teams, particularly the Divisional First XV111 teams:

A special mention to the Mitcham Club who won premierships with their First, Second and Third XV111's.

Big decisions have to be made by the League as far as its future is concerned. Some of these are sure to be controversial but if the League is to prosper they must be faced and all Clubs must support the eventual decisions to make them work. Some of the questions to be asked and resolved are:

Should some Clubs amalgamate?

Should promotion and relegation continue and if so, in what form? Should it continue to be a requirement that all Clubs field 4 teams? Should the present junior age limits continue?

There are many important decisions to be made. Although I have already announced my retirement as Secretary, I will watch with interest the League's progress and its decision making process.

Finally, I extend my own personal thanks to Stephen Mason and Andrea Newson for the valued support they gave me during the year. Andrea's support with the scores on Saturday afternoons and evenings was beyond the call of duty and I hope she remains with the League for many years. Stephen Mason was very willing to learn football administration and I am confident that football in general and the E.D.F.L. in particular, will benefit from his devoted efforts in the years ahead.

To members of the Players Accident Fund, the Independent Tribunal, the Umpires Appointment Board I express my own and the League's most grateful thanks. In their individual capacities they do a wonderful job for the League which, without them, could not function.

Members of the League's Permit Committee, together with their fellow members of the Executive Committee, performed their duties loyally and efficiently. As in most organisiations these members do not get enough credit for the devoted time they put in honorary for the League. A special mention to Graeme Morgan who willingly donated his time with a paint brush when the League moved to its new headquarters.

A note of appreciation to all Club officials who made my return to the League so enjoyable. Old and new acquaintances alike were very helpful and I value your friendships.

The Executive Committee met nearly every alternate Monday evening throughout the year. excluding January, and dealt with many difficult and controversial matters.

Members of the Committee are all very experienced in football administration in most cases having served their apprenticeship with Clubs. Their time is given quite voluntarily without thought of reward.

In addition to their duties at meetings they also acted in many other capacities during special events during the season. They performed various duties at the Interdivisional Championships, the V.M.F.L. Champiosnhips and the Junior Lightning Premierships and members also officiated at Finals matches. Mr. Bruce Holmes acted as ground manager at the First Division Finals at Boronia, Mr. Gordon Parker at the Second Division Finals at Ferntree Gully and Mr. Graeme Morgan at the Third Division Finals at Coldstream. They were ably assisted by other members of the Executive Committee and League Staff.

Messrs. Cliff Tomkins, Gordon Parker, Jim Elmer and Graeme Morgan served on the Permits and Disputes Committee which met on every Friday evening during and before the season. Whilst their decisions must of necessity displease some parties, it must be conceded by all that their decisions are made only after exhaustive enquiries and they are to be congratulated on the diplomatic manner in which they perform their duties. As the Permit Committee their main object is to give all parties a "fair deal" and to keep players playing. In acting as "Umpire" in disputes their duties are onerous and at times distasteful and every effort should be made by Clubs to settle their differences, whether it be over a players clearance or some other matter, before involving the Permit and Disputes Committee.

P.A.F. COMMITTEE

With the recommencement of the Players Accident Fund, following the steep increase in premiums by Insurance Companies the League was most fortunate in gaining the services of Dr. Ken Twiddy (General Practioner), Mr. Bob Doreian (Pharmacist) and Mr. Craig Allingham (Physiotherapist) as members of the Committee. The two first named served the League in a similar capacity for many years in the past and Mr. Allingham was a valuable "recruit" to this most important Committee.

From the financial accounts it is guite obvious that amendments must be made to the operation of the Fund and members of the Committee are fully cognizant of the fact. Every effort must be made by the League to retain the services of these gentlemen whose time is donated in an honorary capacity.

PUBLICITY.

The League's appreciation is extended to all sections of the media for the publicity given to scores and ladders and other items of interest. The coverage given by local papers is excellent and it is to be hoped that these papers are aptly rewarded for their efforts.

VICTORIAN METROPOLITAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

Appreciation is extended to Mr. Ed Biggs (President) and Messrs Alan Schwab and Stephen Harrington (Secretaries) for their assistance during the year and their efforts towards furthering our great game.

The Tribunal met on 22 occasions during the season and dealt with 284 cases, most of which were most unpleasant. Too much gratitude cannot be bestowed on the gentlemen of the Tribunal.
