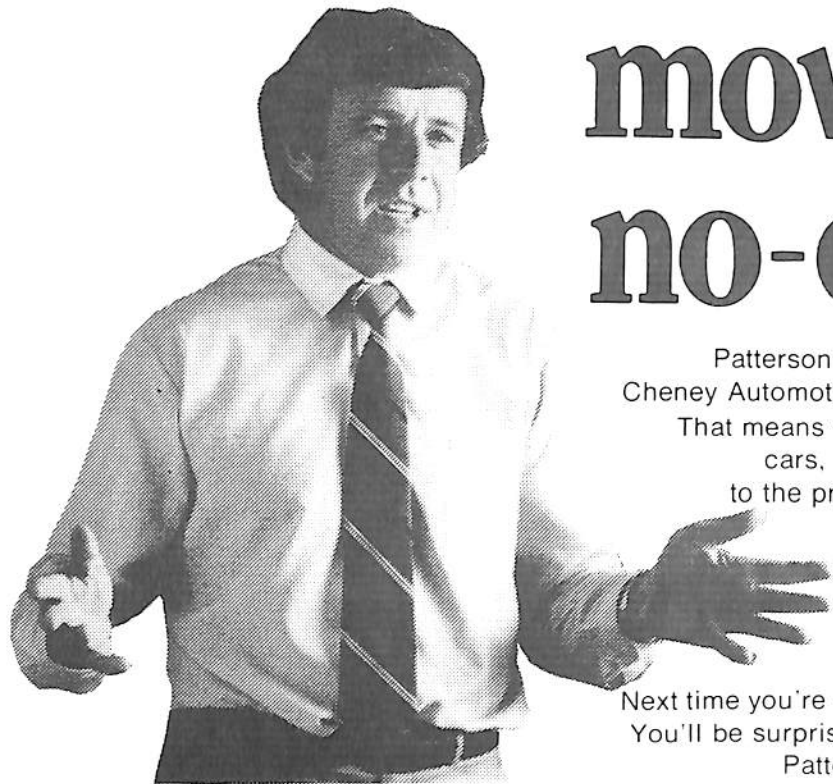

# SECRETARY'S REPORT

1984 proved to be one of the most challenging years that we have experienced for some years. However, it did show that the League continues to enhance its role and its activities amongst its affiliated clubs.

At the time of compiling this report, late October, it does allow us to sit back and think clearly about the 1984 competitive season.

The commencement of the season was marred by a Supreme Court Writ and threat of a strike and made our start to the season less than complimentary. However, the problems were quickly overcome and the season settled down and proved to be quite competitive.

I am pleased to report that our financial position is sound and indeed it is a credit to the Finance Committee who meet every month to review our overall finances. I believe that the league operate on two values -

- (1) Don't buy what you can't afford,
- (2) Don't spend what you have not got.

These two rules have enabled us to achieve the above situation.

Our involvement in the 1984 V.F.L. Senior Grade Championships quickly brought us back to earth when we were bundled out of the series after a thrashing from the Footscray District Football League. It was a disappointing loss mainly because of our attitude. If we are to continue participating in the series then we all must approach it in a totally professional manner. Our sincere appreciation is extended to Graeme Jacobs, our Coach, who spent many hours in coaching the side. Our selectors Jim Elmer, Russell Read, Phil Dack and John Harrop should also receive our thanks along with our officials and players.

Similarly the U/17s were unfortunate not to make the semi finals when they were beaten on the last kick of the day by the W.N.D.J.F.L. However, they did experience a great win over the Diamond Valley F.L. in a game that will be remembered for a long time. Our congratulations are extended to Coach George Gislingham, Selectors, Graeme Morgan, Bruce Kerr and Peter Steele for a job well done and of course all the U/17 players who participated.

At the end of the 1982 season I made the comment that the clubs should recognise that their League requires their active participation to ensure the League's continued success, nothing has changed except in this respect, the members of the League value your participation and you should respect other peoples commitment to the League.

Every club should recognise that the League must grow in an orderly fashion and to achieve this, clubs must have full confidence in the League's Executive to manage its affairs.

On behalf of us all I must extend our appreciation to the Executive who devote many long hours to the league to ensure the enjoyment of all its participants.

I have long held the view that the strength of any establishment or building rests with the foundations. The President of the League represents this foundation and its through this strength displayed by the President, Gordon Parker, that the League has been able to achieve its standing and financial stability. The Executive ably support the League through involving themselves with other duties and I refer your attention to the Executive report.

At the completion of the 1983 season Mrs. Melanie Farley was promoted to the position of Assistant Secretary and handled all clearances and registration during 1984. It was an immediate success, Melanie adapted herself to her new role and demonstrated the ability and qualities that reinforced the faith that the E.D.F.L. has in her. I'm sure I speak on behalf of us all when we say thank you to Melanie for her outstanding contribution.

Mrs. Barbara Blair joined the League in February and proved to be a valuable employee. Unfortunately, Barbara will not be rejoining the League in the 1985 season as she will be commencing her family and we extend to Barbara our best wishes.

The future of the League looks extremely encouraging with new clubs wanting to affiliate with the E.D.F.L. obviously because of the image of the League and its professional attitudes, clubs should realize that they are the cause of this attitude.

The only comment I have to make about the future is that the members elect an Executive to manage, direct policy and institute any programs for the benefit of the League. When the Executive embark upon any program it is not done without a great deal of thought and consideration and in all cases they are instituting the program for the benefit of your League. Clubs should respect the right of the Executive to bring about change and should adapt themselves to that change for their benefit.

The 1984 year was again one of intense activity and 1985 should be no different. It was enjoyable after our start and settled down to be a good season. My congratulations are extended to all premiership teams and trophy winners and I look forward to your valued support in 1985.

It has been ascertained that Trade Creditors of \$9820 were not taken into account in the Financial Statements for the year ended 31st October 1983. This had the effect of overstating the surplus for the year which was reported as being \$41639 instead of \$31819.

5. COMPARATIVE FIGURES FOR PREVIOUS FINANCIAL YEAR

The comparative figures for the previous financial year have not been shown, as required by the Companies (Victoria) Code Schedule 7, because of a change in the method of reporting. Many items in the Profit & Loss Statement for the previous financial year were the net surplus or deficit of an income and expenditure item. These include umpires, insurance, presentation night etc. and the amount shown as received from marketing was, in fact, the gross profit. Therefore, if the comparatives were shown, they would be misleading. This situation should not occur in future years.

## AUDITOR'S REPORT

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF EASTERN DISTRICTS FOOTBALL LEAGUE

I have audited the Financial Statements set out on pages 20 to 23 in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and report as follows:

1. In my opinion, the Accounting Systems employed by the Company are inadequate and have contributed to the incorrect surplus having been reported in the previous year (refer Note 4)
2. The Company has not provided for depreciation on buildings and this is a departure from a Statement of Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Society of Accountants and the Chartered Institute of Accounts in Australia. In my opinion, depreciation should be charged to the Profit & Loss Account to absorb the cost of the building over its economic life. The Company has not calculated the effect of this departure and it is impracticable for me to estimate it.
3. A copy of the 1983 Financial Accounts was not forwarded to members 14 days before the Annual General Meeting, which contravenes Section 274(1) of the Companies (Victoria) Code.
4. With the exception of the President, it appears as though the Executive are acting ultra vires, in that they have ceased to be members of the Company as defined in Article 3 (a) and therefore pursuant to Article 12 (h) their office as Executive Committee Members is vacated. I understand that this occurred quite some time ago and has been followed as a matter of practice by the Company and action is to be taken to rectify the situation.
5. With the exception of and subject to the effects, if any, on the Financial Statements of the above matters, in my opinion:-
  - (a) The accompanying Accounts being the Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss Statement of the Company (together with notes 1 - 5 thereto) which have been prepared under the Historical Cost Convention (As stated in note 1) and the Statement by Directors thereon are properly drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the Companies (Victoria) Code so as to give a true and fair view of :-
    - (i) the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st October 1984 and of the profit of the Company for the year ended on that date; and
    - (ii) the other matters required by Section 269 of that Code to be dealt with in the Accounts.
  - (b) The Accounting records and other records and the registers required by that Code to be kept by the Company have been properly kept in accordance with the provisions of that Code.

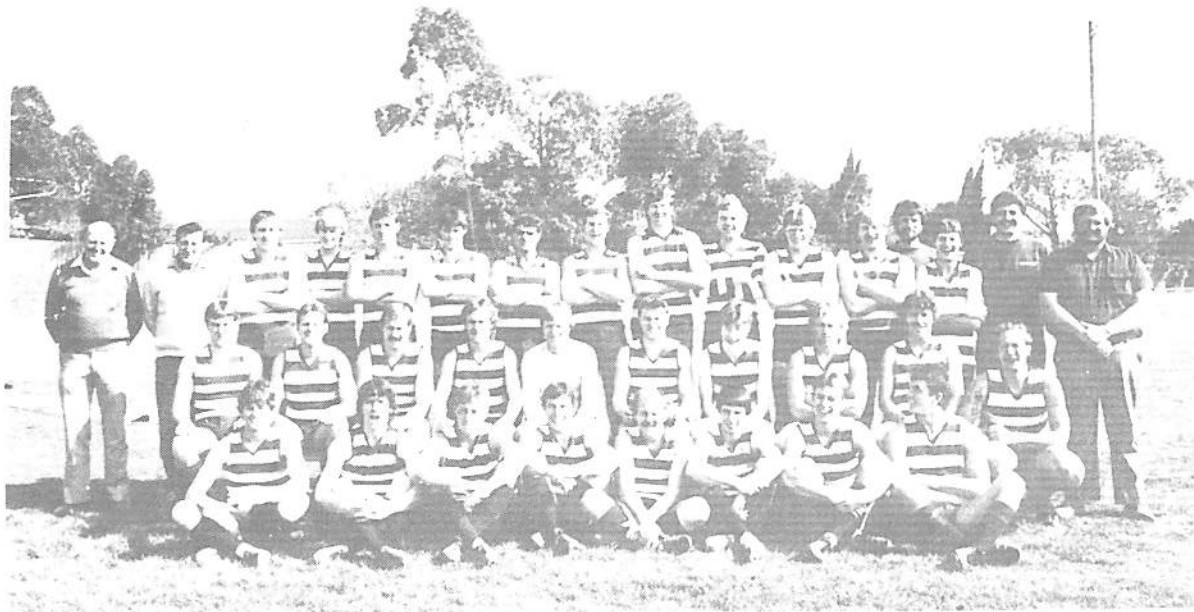
