The Company has not provided for depreciation on buildings and this is a departure from a Statement of Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Society of Accountants and the Chartered Institute of Accounts in Australia. In my opinion, depreciation should be charged to the Profit & Loss Account to absorb the cost of the building over it's economic life. The Company has not calculated the effect of this departure and it is impracticable for me to estimate it.

3. A copy of the 1983 Financial Accounts was not forwarded to members 14 days before the Annual General Meeting, which contravenes Section 274(1)

4. With the exception of the President, it appears as though the Executive are acting ultra vires, in that they have ceased to be members of the Company as defined in Article 3 (a) and therefore pursuant to Article 12 (h) their office as Executive Committee Members is vacated. I understand that this occurred quite some time ago and has been followed as a matter of practice by the Company and action is to be taken to






