The squad was very fortunate to obtain the services of Paul Stewart as coach and Paul was ably assisted by a great support group of helpers. To you all the League says thank you.

The other success story for 1986 must be the results of the creation of the 4th division. Sides which had not won games for many years, not only won during the season but took part in the finals. This of course meant more success off the field as well as supporters grew in numbers and club finances improved.

During the season the Executive lost a very keen and hard working member with the death of Graeme Morgan. Graeme was especially involved in the activities associated with the Caltex Cup squad and junior football. It is pleasing indeed to report that the League's year was extremely competitive in all grades in all divisions. Games were hard to win and places in the four were always in jeopardy and in this regard congratulations are extended to the following clubs:-

These clubs were the eventual winners of their respective grades which were deservedly fought and won.

I must pay tribute to our councils. Despite the atrocious weather conditions that prevailed during the year our councils undertook programs to ensure that the grounds were kept in reasonable order so that our games could be played. As a result I believe that our club affiliates should support their councils and their endeavours and foster a relationship that should develop a concept of mutual understanding and support.

Our entry into a fourth division proved to be very successful, clubs who participated in that division were appreciative of the competition it gave them. To see the success they enjoyed was encouraging for us all in the League. The financial position of the League again is sound and viable and has been for some considerable time. The League is currently investigating the purchase of the land at the rear of the League's property in order to increase our parking for the member clubs.

Participation in this years V.F.L. senior grade championships was most encouraging in that we were successful in reaching the grand final and whilst we were beaten by a strong South East Suburban team the game itself was keenly contested and well conducted and our players should be proud of their effort.

We should acknowledge the hard working efforts of our coach, Graeme Weatherley, his assistant, Ray Gale and the efforts of Jim Elmer and Barry Raymer who produced many hours of effort to ensure the teams competitiveness. The players who committed themselves to the series are to be congratulated on their performance.

The Under 17 combination produced a back to back championship, with our former coach, David Quinn accepting a senior coaching position the procuring of a coach became an important issue. To secure the services of Ringwood's Paul Stewart proved a great find for the League. Paul's enthusiasm and committment provided the impetus for us to win the 1986 championship.

Our sincere appreciation is further extended to the selectors, Bruce Kerr, George Gislingham, and Alan Barr for their personal assistance, Dale Hudson for his efforts as our team manager and the great personal efforts of all the Under 17 players who made their committment to the series. Don McBain, one of our experienced umpires, acted as both runner and training supervisor. Don's enthusiasm was also contagious. Trainers Keith Potter and Brian Day's contribution should also be acknowledged.

Again the junior age group presented a problem with some clubs believing that juniors were not necessary to the League whilst a vast majority were equally, if not more committed to the overall establishment of a firm base status for juniors. I do believe that some clubs experience serious difficulties in obtaining juniors whilst others adopt an arbitrary attitude or indifferent approach.

The strength of your League has always been with its youth from the Under 10 and Under 12 non competitive groups to the Under 14 - Under 18 competitive divisions. Without these kids coming on to play senior football it can only mean League affiliates will have to compete for less and less players not withstanding the fall in talented players available.

I would like to express my thanks and appreciation to my assistant, Mrs. Maurneen McBain whose outstanding contribution to the League was important. Maurneen's enthusiasm to her responsibilities indicated that the League made a wise choice indeed when employing her.

Our receptionist, Miss Kathy Fagan joined the League in May 1986 and has established and entrenched herself in the football world.

Both ladies are appreciated by all and we wish them both long and successful careers.

At the beginning of the year the League appointed Noel O'Brien as their Director of Umpiring. Noel quickly established himself, gained respect from the umpires and instituted a board of observers to review umpires performances and this indeed was welcomed by all umpires.

It would be remiss of us not to recognise the valuable contribution of the chairman of the tribunal, Mr. Laurie Beniot. Laurie has decided to retire from this most exacting position and on behalf of the League we extend to Laurie our best wishes and sincere appreciation for a job well done.

TRIBUNAL REPORT 1986

1. Quality of player's advocates and their lack of knowledge.
2. The tribunal will accept video evidence (the club must provide equipment) but this facility is not used by clubs although it is brought up in evidence on numerous occasions.

Why? Will it be only used when it makes your player look good.
3. Some appeals have been brought to the tribunal. This cannot or should not happen under the E.D.F.L. Constitution.
CLAUSE 17D.
4. Non-attendance of reported players etc.; this is causing deferring of cases and inconvenience to all concerned.

We now come to a time when one of our most esteemed members Mr. Laurie Benoit is hanging up his boots and slipping into retirement after many years of dedicated service, but all is not lost for Laurie will be available in times of trouble. From the tribunal, Laurie a very big well-done and thank you.

So, players and officials, let's look forward to a peaceful year in 1987.

UMPIRES REPORT

The E.D.F.L. umpires are historically invited to present their first report in the E.D.F.L. Annual Report for 1986. For many years umpires and its administrators have held the view that not only are we an intricate part of the game, but with approximately 180 umpires, are in fact the 41st club, and as such League officials are entitled to a report from the umpires. Our first report will consist of a report from the Director of Umpiring - Noel O'Brien, some general comments and finally a list of all umpires who officiated in Grand Finals for season 1986.

DIRECTOR OF UMPIRES REPORT 1986

During my first season as Director of Umpires I was astounded to find a lack of depth in the number of experienced senior umpires and consequently an almost devoid body of junior umpires throughout all divisions in the E.D.F.L.

Our lifeblood depends on depth and in conjunction with the Umpires Appointments Board that situation was rectified, although the programme is only in its infancy. We were able to appoint 27 field umpires to their first senior matches throughout the 4 divisions, and 6 boundary umpires were appointed to their first senior game in 1st division. The Board will maintain the policy of promoting junior umpires to senior matches in order to build a strong senior panel of umpires. Unless we have a strong senior panel the standard of umpiring and ultimately football in this League will fall dramatically. To have depth means the Board will be able to exert pressure on the senior umpires to perform at their best each week by having available to it a strong selection of umpires in the lower and junior divisions.

It has been possible for the Board to appoint junior umpires to senior matches because of the "Two umpire system". In today's football climate, without the two umpire system operating in the senior divisions the Board would be unable to develop its objective of having a strong senior panel. It is because of the two umpire system senior umpires run longer and thereby pass on their experience to junior umpires. By maintaining this policy the Board can guarantee a strong and sound depth of umpires and a continuing highest quality in the standard of umpiring.

At no stage did the two umpire system deprive the lower divisions or junior football of umpires. It is also worth noting that in all 1st and 2nd division Grand Final games there were no reports in the six matches played. Whilst coaches and players should take some credit this fact was mainly due to the correct way in which the two umpire system was operated. As a result the football public were treated to fast play-on football where all the skills were displayed.

ASSOCIATION REPORT

Season 1986 has seen a number of changes in the E.D.F.L. and over the football year I have raised a number of issues both in the "Centre Circle", in the weekly record, and the article which appeared in the "Ringwood And Croydon Post". The most important of these issues was the "Critical shortage" of umpires and the continuation of the two umpire system.

It is vital for club officials to recognise that the standard of football, in the League, largely depends on the standard of umpiring. If weak inconsistent umpiring allows players to degenerate into football brawling and thuggery then the high reputation this League holds is at stake. There must be an energetic recruitment programme of which the clubs must play an important part. To ensure high quality in umpiring standards we must have enough umpires.

To maintain the standard it is imperative to continue to operate the two umpire system at all senior division levels. In today's football climate without it the whole structure to umpiring, recruitment, development and retention would fall apart.

Finally from all umpires let me congratulate Noel O'Brien in his first year as Director of Umpires. Noel's consistent theme throughout the season, to all umpires, was appointments will be based purely on performance. Umpires developed confidence on Noel's professional approach and the way he organised the Umpires Appointments Board.

VICTORIAN METROPOLITAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE

During the 1986 season, the V.M.F.L., in pursuit of its major objective to promote, control, manage, encourage, develop and foster the Australian game of football, expanded on various programs introduced in previous seasons, as well as incorporating some progressive and exciting innovations.

Recognising the importance of sound administration at both club and League/association level, the N.F.L. Basic Administration Seminar was again conducted to provide representatives from all Leagues and Associations with an outline of specific administrative matters relevant to metropolitan football.

The Senior four hour and Junior four hour Coaching Course program introduced in the previous season, was again conducted in 1986.

In response to the requirement of the V.M.F.L., that all coaches of teams in the Under 13 and below age grouping, possess a minimum of Junior four hour accreditation, these courses again proved to be successful with in excess of 200 coaches being in attendance. The Senior four hour course also proved to be most worthwhile with approximately 160 coaches receiving credentials.

The metropolitan championships, which encompasses the V.F.L. sponsored senior grade series, the Caltex Under 17 grade and V.M.F.L. Under 15 grade was again an outstanding success in 1986.

Congratulations are extended to the South East Suburban Football League for their first victory in the senior grade series, to the Eastern Districts Football League for successive victories in the Under 17 grade series, and to the Knox Junior Football Association for their exciting win in the Under 15 grade championship.

A real highlight in the 1986 metropolitan calendar, was the staging of the inaugural 1986 Tooheys Challenge Cup played between representative sides from the V.C.F.L. and V.M.F.L.

Although the V.M.F.L. side was, in the end, comfortably defeated by the V.C.F.L. team, the players and officials exhibited a great deal of commitment and desire to represent the V.M.F.L. which augurs well for representative matches of this nature in the future.

That many leagues and associations fully supported this concept and that individual clubs were prepared to release their players from domestic duties on the weekend of the match, was ample evidence that the V.M.F.L. is a body with "spirit" and "character".

The V.M.F.L. Board of Management re-elected, at the 1985 Annual General Meeting, again proved to be a hard working, efficient body which is essential to the success of any sporting organisation.

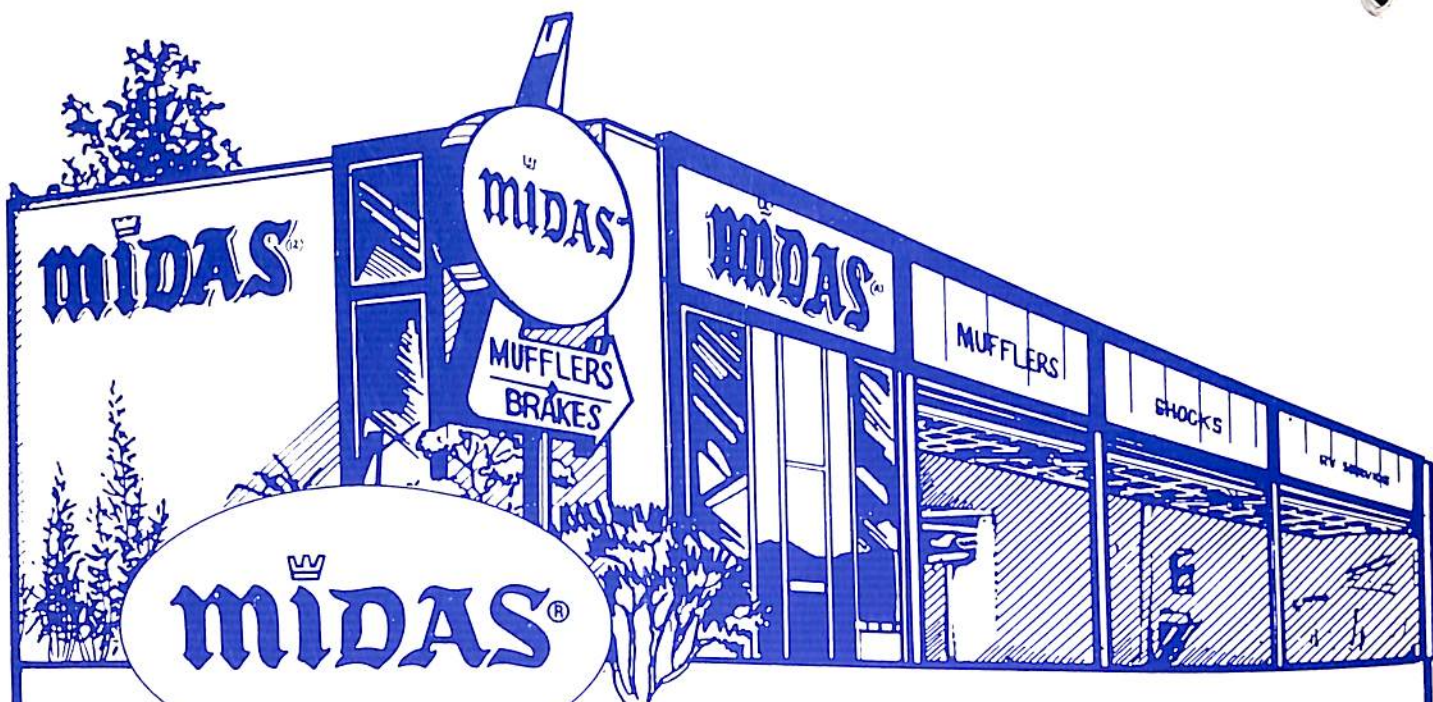
