



#### **PRESIDENTS REPORT**

In my first report in 1982 T was pleased to be able to state that the League had completed a most successful year; again in 1987 the same position applies.

To the winners of the premiership, best and fairest, Patterson Cheney goal kicking, Club Championship and other awards, congratulations on your well deserved wins. From the Leagues point of view it was most encouraging to see several clubs winning flags after so many years of competing but without achieving the success that goes with winning a grand final.

The season also saw a superb effort from our Under 16 V.M.F.L. Team, who convincingly won all their games to repeat their successes of 1985 and 1986 and again win the Caltex Metropolitan Championship. To Noel Bosch our thanks for all the time and effort you spent as coach of these players and I am sure that all the parents and players would concur with these words of thanks. It was a great team performance and on behalf of the League, to all the players who were in the squad, officials and helpers, thank you again and we look forward to your continuing support in 1988.

However, we were not so fortunate with our senior side, despite the services of a dedicated and experienced coach in David Quin, a very keen band of players who elected to put the E.D.F.L. first, a well organised and keen team of officials, playing on local grounds and the opportunity to show other Leagues and our own supporters our true strength we were not the winners. This in no small way was due to several Clubs and players who saw fit not to give the League their full support. If we are going to continue playing in these championships we will need to take much stronger action against those players who make themselves unavailable for selection and those clubs who direct players not to complete.

The financial statements will show that the finances of the League improved in 1987 and the League is in a very sound financial position. This is in no small way due to the controls in operation and a dedicated office staff. With further support to our marketing section by those clubs who currently are not giving us their business our position will improve even further and allow the affiliation charges to remain as is or even be decreased in future. In respect of marketing it is worthy of mention that Lilydale Football Club who are in 4th Division purchased goods to the value of \$12,359, a great effort and they have really set an example to the clubs in higher divisions.

Continuing on financial matters, it continues to amaze the Executive that Clubs that work so hard to raise funds then throw them away by incurring fines that they could easily avoid with little effort involved. I refer to fines for simple things like not escorting umpires from the field, not supplying Club notes for inclusion in the Football Record, or fielding unregistered, over-age or ineligible players. With money so hard to raise, surely more attention could be given to preven'ing such a waste on fines. The report and recommendations from the Committee investigating junior football will be finalised in the near future and thanks to all those members for the time and effort you have so far spent on this most pressing problem.

With the purchase of a computer this year we will be in a position to give better and more efficient service to Clubs and eventually offer our facilities for a greater range of information and records. As this is our initial venture into the computer age any constructive suggestions to assist in developing our programs and performance would be most appreciated.

At this stage it appears we will be unable to purchase the land at the rear of the office and parking of cars has become a major difficulty, especially on tribunal nights, when it becomes a real danger with cars parked on the nature strip and the heavy traffic in Scoresby Road. Several accidents have already occurred, luckily without serious injury to the occupants of the cars involved. In view of this the Executive is currently looking into the feasability of purchasing alternative office accommodation with suitable parking facilities.

We again extend our thanks to our Patrons and Donors for their continuing support, without their financial assistance we would not be able to retain our current level of fees to the Clubs.

I am sure that those who attended our Presentation Night must have been most impressed by the organising skills displayed by our office staff, Bruce Holmes and Miss Kathy Fagan; a most successful evening.

To members of the executive, all officials, players and supporters - best of luck for season 1988.

## **MANAGER'S REPORT**

There is no doubt that 1987 was a most significant year for your League. Many decisions that have taken place will determine the future direction of your League in the coming years that will be of major benefit.

Our high priority of developing, fostering and promoting our code indeed allowed us to approach these decisions with the confidence and integrity they deserve.

Computerising the League in 1988 will be a major step for the administration. It is an important one and one that will enable the League to administer its affairs with a high degree of efficiency.

The Under 16 Caltex Cup produced one of the best combined teams our League will ever see. Our Under 16 team amassed an amazing 50 goals and 50 behinds whilst restricting the opposition teams to a collective total of 7 goals and 10 behinds, a percentage of 566. Our congratulations are extended to coach, Noel Bosch who's tremendous input into the series provided the impetus for the success of the series.

At this time we should recognise the players outstanding determination to the game and to the clubs who were fortunate in having representatives in the squad. They should be very proud of their players involvement and certainly their achievement. They represented your League and your club with distinction.

The senior grade squad's performance, this year, was disappointing, not from the players position, but from the disastrous run of injuries experienced to some of the top line players. #### **TRIBUNAL REPORT**


#### **EDFL UMPIRES BOARD REPORT**

The Tribunal, despite it's efforts, regret to report that statistics this year have risen compared to season 1986.

The Tribunal is an independent body and therefore, although appointed by the Eastern District Football League, is not responsible to any other body or person for it's verdicts and rulings. During the later part of the season it was brought to our notice that the delegates had ruled that video evidence was not acceptable but, as stated in previous years, this is not so. The Tribunal will accept any evidence be it visual, written or verbal and presented in a proper manner that may assist in arriving at a fair and just decision, so video evidence is acceptable and may be brought before

Clubs are again advised to look closely at firstly the rules and by-laws of the league which do invlude a full set of instructions relating to the procedure of a Tribunal Hearing and secondly, at the quality and knowledge of their player's representatives as this can make such a difference when the case is presented.

This Season a number of cases were deferred for one reason or another. The Tribunal advises clubs and umpires that all cases will proceed on the Wednesday night following the report unless notice from the Tribunal is received, via the E.D.F.L. that a change has been made. If for some reason a reported player, witness or umpire is unable to attend, a statutory declaragion setting out the reason for non-attendance and the full evidence of the person making that declaration as would have been presented if they were in attendance must be lodged at the E.D.F.L. offices no later than office closing time on the day of the Tribunal hearing. Under Tribunal rules a hearing can proceed even if some persons involved are not present. No appeal can be made on a Tribunal decision.



The E.D.F.L. Umpires Board for the 1987 season was responsible for the supply of umpires for 1367 official League matches. On average this meant appointing 170-180 umpires each week. This did not include a host of pre-season practise matches, the night competition conducted at U.F.T.G. and the U14 Essendon Nu-Brick Lightning Premiership. The Board would also like to acknowledge the assistance of the Umpires Association for the supply of their services free of charge during the U10 and U12 Lightning Premierships, conducted on consecutive Sundays at Pinks Reserve in Kilsyth, and the many player/umpire clinics requested by clubs during the season.

While it has been noted b-firm that with 180 umpires we are the 39th (and largest) club in the League, the difficult task of recruiting new umpires and retaining existing umpires remains the Boards No. 1 priority. My predecessor, Mr. Graham Parsons, was often quoted as saying "If we could get just one ex-player from each club within the League to take up umpiring, we would not have a shortage week to week." After just one year as Secretary, I can only agree. It has been my observation that our better umpires are ex-players.

The work of the Board does not stop at the final siren for 1987. Rather it is from that moment that preparation for season 1988 starts. On behalf of the Board, I wish to congratulate all clubs and umpires who enjoyed success at finals time.

### **EDFLUA REPORT**

The Eastern Districts Football League Umpires Association Executive appreciates the opportunity given to us by the League Executive, to be involved for the second time in the preparation of the League's Annual Report.

Our Association has a membership of approximately 170 Umpires, of which about 50% are field umpires and the remainder carrying out their duties on the boundary and in the goals. Unfortunately the turnover of umpires is quite dramatic with between 40 - 70 leaving our Association from one year to the next or throughout the season. The reasons for their turnover are wide and varied but the major concern is where umpires are discouraged by the abuse and non-co-operation from Club Members, supporters and players. All members of the football public must realise that umpires are necessary to enable our game to be played and that a little encouragement and support, instead of abuse, will assist in the promotion of Australian Rules Football.

Our Association has an Executive Committee which is tasked with looking after the welfare of its members. We are a communication link with the E.D.F.L. Executive with whom we meet at least once a year and more often if required. The development of this link in recent years, has and will continue to be of benefit to Umpires and the E.D.F.L. Executive alike.

We also have a Social Committee to organise our social events including the "after training get together". This committee is headed by Faye Doutch who is ably assisted by Trevor Fyander, Jeanette Morgan and Andrew Wheeler.

Our end of season discussions were fruitful and thought provoking and closer co-operation in regards to umpires' facilities at finals grounds will, I am sure, be one result of our discussions.

In 1987 the VMFL continued to provide a central administrative facility for metropolitan football as well as pursuing promotion and development objectives.

In recognizing the importance of nurturing the game at local metropolitan level, the VMFL Full Committee, in February 1987, introduced an Area Committee system aimed at improving the working relationship between VFL Club Development Officers and VMFL affiliates in regard to all promotion and development programs.

Basically the Area Committee system provided that all VMFL leagues and associations be divided into four geographically suitable groups comprised of approximately the same number of senior age and under age teams. Each area then appointed a Committee responsible for conducting and promoting all development programs including coaching, administration and trainers courses. This system enabled these programs to be donducted in line with previously accepted standards, tailored to suit the individual needs of the area concerned.

Despite some teething problems there is no doubt that the Area Committee system was received very enthusiastically and contributed to a greatly improved communication network between VFL Development Officers and VMFL leagues and associations, ensuring the effective co-ordination of essential development programs.

Proof of this can be found alone in the Junior 4 and Senior 4 Coaching Course program which resulted in approximately 600 coaches receiving their 4 hour coaching credentials. The accreditation of coaches is viewed as a major objective and will continue to be emphasised in future years.

The Metropolitan Championships which concluded with the Grand Finals played at the East Ringwood Sporting Club were an cutstanding success. This series has developed into one of the showpieces of metropolitan football and the 1987 competition was certainly no exception. Congratulations are extended to the Essendon District Football League which were victorious for the first time in the VFL sponsored Senior Grade series, to the Eastern District Football League which comfortably won the Caltex Under 16 Grade Championship Series and to the Footscray District Footbal! League which were victorious in the VMFL sponsored Under 14 Championship competition.

Appreciation is extended to the Victorian Football League for their continued financial support of the Senior Grade Series, to the Caltex Oil Company for their valued contribution to metropolitan football and to all other sponsors for their support.

A first for the VMFL in 1987 was the implementation of a Combined Umpire Recruiting/Promotional Campaign. Conducted in conjunction with the VMFL Umpires' Advisers Group and with the assistance of the Victorian Football League, the campaign was aimed at attracting umpires from the secondary school system. Twenty five secondary schools throughout the metropolitan area were

extended an invitation to participate in the program which provided for senior VFL umpires to conduct clinics at the schools either during lunch time or at a specific classroom session. Interested students were then extended a personal invitation to join a local metropolitan umpiring group within easy access.

Whilst there were areas of the project that were disappointing it was felt that the 1987 'pilot scheme' was reasonably successful in comparison with other programs conducted by individual affiliates and it has been agreed to again conduct the scheme in 1988.

In detailing the various VMFL activities in 1987 it must be recorded that the Victorian Football League again provided substantial financial and administrative assistance to the operation of the VMFL. This support was sincerely appreciated.

In addition to the provision of full-time staff and office facilities the VFL again sponsored the Senior Grade Metropolitan Championships and provided a direct grant to individual leagues and associations for promotion and development programs undertaken at a local level.

This continued assistance, combined with the support and co-operation of many honorary metropolitan football officials, has enabled the VMFL to develop far more quickly than otherwise would have been possible. To all officials involved in 1987 we extend sincere appreciation, but in particular we acknowledge the contribution of the members of the Board of Management who devoted countless hours towards the management of metropolitan football.
