The E.D.F.L. showed its strength in metropolitan football by winning the V.F.L. Senior Grade Championship and completed the double with the Under 16's winning the Caltex Cup for the fourth consecutive year. To the players, coaches, officials and supporters the League offers its congratulations and best wishes for the future.

Overall the League has had a fairly successful year, the finances remain sound, thankfully fines have decreased but marketing will need to improve if administrative charges to the Clubs are not to increase. The League has now grown to thirty nine senior clubs and should provide a much better competition in Fourth Division. A big welcome is extended to the Knox and Noble Park Bears Football Clubs. It is hoped that a further club will enter the League by 1990.

To the many people who have assisted the League in 1988 my sincere thanks and I hope we can continue to receive your assistance in future years.

With the large number of grounds required for our final series there is always a problem in obtaining those with a good playing surface and the required facilities for both players and spectators. This arises every year, especially as the grounds must be selected in June to enable the host clubs to obtain the required permits and arrange for catering and other services. This year all grounds were in good condition when allocated and with one exception stood up well during the finals. Overall, the grounds and club facilities have been greatly improved over the past few years and the League thanks the Clubs and respective Councils concerned for their efforts in improving the standards within the League.


Our thanks are also extended to the V.F.L. and V.M.F.L. for their continuing support of local football and for the financial assistance given to Clubs and this League.

### LEAGUE MANAGERS REPORT

As peace and tranquillity descends upon the office at the end of the season and one can sit back and soak up the summer sun, it allows us to reflect upon the 1988 season and ponder on those issues that are necessary to ensure the long term policies and continuance of our League.

The E.D.F.L.'s future is quite stable despite what other persons outside the League are claiming and attempting to achieve. Our four divisions are operating successfully. The League's finances are sound, its policies are committed with the proviso that the League is prepared to change those policies to suit the environment at any given time.

Computerising the League's register of all players, the umpires fees and the ladder system proved to be a huge benefit for the League. Whilst it took some time to be completely confident in the use of the computer, it no doubt will enhance the League's ability to service its clubs.

We are in a diminishing market with clubs and leagues struggling to maintain themselves. In the E.D.F.L. the problem is not quite as precise as in other leagues. None the less it is important for all clubs to stick together and determine their future as they see it which it is important for us all.

The establishment of a new body ir this area is not needed and will only cause unrest in what is essentially a stable and successful operating area.

The establishment of the junior committee with its terms of reference was a major benefit for the League. The alteration of the Under 16 competition to Sunday proved to be indeed highly successful and clubs appreciated the Under 16's being grouped with the other junior sides. The junior committee was instrumental in having the Victorian Football Development Foundation adopt the job specifications for their development officers as determined by the E.D.F.L. The junior committee have met regularly to discuss those matters important to junior football and are open to any suggestions that may assist them in the performance of their duties.

The outstanding success of the E.D.F.L. Senior Grade Squad in the 1988 V.F.L. senior grade championships was an enjoyable experience. A new approach to the players by the officials provided the impetus on which the success was built. Our win against the strong combination of the Diamond Valley was impressive as it was only the last ten minutes of that game that determined the result. To see our kids climb off the floor when they were about to take the ten count and bounce back and win the game by seven points had to be seen to be believed, commitment at its best.

There are those who criticise the League's junior policies, however with our junior element currently, those criticisms, in my opinion, are totally unfounded.

Our umpiring fraternity this year was the most enjoyable yet. The securing of Greg Sidebottom as Director of Umpiring was indeed a "coup" for our League. Greg brought to the League and the umpiring fraternity an attitude of professionalism but above all, a smile and a determined wish that all umpires enjoy themselves with their involvement with football. It worked well as it was apparent that the majority were gaining under Greg's skill as Director. Our congratulations are extended to Greg, Secretary - John Eastwood, Rod Makin, Bernie Fewster, their observers and to our umpires for their performance during the year.

The League's prestigious Under 14 Lightning Premiership - Essendon Nubrik Cup has gained in stature and we extend our sincere appreciation to the Nubrik Company for their continued support for the development of youth and the Essendon Football Club for their interest in the Eastern Districts Football League.

Our finals this year were financially disastrous due to the poor weather conditions at the time, however, it should also be remembered that costs are increasing rapidly. Venues were in most cases very good with facilities being at their optimum. Because we live in a rain belt area it is difficult for us to ensure the grounds that are selected are kept dry. The only way we, as a League, can ensure that grounds are in good condition is to have tendering clubs consider changing their venue or transferring to the second oval if they have one. The League will always endeavour to discuss items such as these with the respective Councils and Shires.

No doubt litigation brought by clubs against their various leagues in 1988 created serious problems for Australian Rules Football. It appears that enjoyment and fun in football is no longer the primary interest, but total success by winning and only that. The V.M.F.L., E.D.F.L., V.F.A., V.A.F.A. and S.E.S.F.L. will adapt themselves to the changing environment, however if legal interpretation is what clubs

want then so be it. It has become a sad day for football.

Currently, in association with the V.M.F.L. and our legal representatives, discussions are being conducted to uniform all leagues and associations with standard rules in order that players and officials alike will not be confused with rules that are diametrically opposed.

At the time of compiling this report the Victorian Football Development Foundation have interviewed, selected and appointed their field Officers to their various areas. The officer appointed to our area is scheduled to be commissioned on February 6th.

The major projects for the officer is to increase the Vic Kick program in the schools and to assist the local clubs in the recruitment of junior players and coaches through to various programs that the field officer will undertake. It is important for us as a League and clubs to support This officer in the performance of his duties as he will become a major benefit to this League.

I would like to record my personal thanks and appreciation to my assistant Kathy Grover, whose dedication to the performance of her duties should not only be acknowledged but applauded.

Kathy's quick adapation to the responibilities in her new role in 1988 will hold her in good stead for many years to come and typified that trust the leauge extended to her.

I would like to extend my appreciation to the executive committee who are a very hard working bunch and are often misunderstood, but always willing to contribute at all times.

On behalf of us all I would like to extend our appreciation to the Chairman of the Tribunal - Don Hall, Chairman Secretary - Bob Mathews and the members of the tribunal for the diligence in assisting the League in performing what is considered an enorous task.

To all clubs who were successful in winning premierships and to all individual trophy winners I extend my personal congratulations with special mention to Geoff Cooper on winning two successive Gilbert Chandler medals, a remarkable achievement.

To the V.F.L. and V.M.F.L. we appreciate and thank them for their support of our League.

To the clubs and officials who have supported their League without question I extend my appreciation.

In closing this report, I would like to make this comment. Your League is only as good as you are prepared to make it. The stability and longevity of the League is entirely in your hands. If clubs stick together and support their League then there will be no problems. But if we allow distrust, sow the seeds of innuendo, and aggressiveness then the future is not bright. It is our decision, lets make sure we make the right one.

## EASTERN DISTRICTS FOOTBALL LEAGUE Junior Football Sub-Committee: Season 1988 Report

The JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE evolved from a select committee, appointed in December, 1986, to address the ever increasing list of problems and conflicts affecting the conduct of the game at under-age level. Despite the inevitable set-backs which appear sent to plague any worthwhile effort, it is pleasing to report that the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE in season 1988 achieved many positive and enduring improvements which would have seemed impossible just two years ago.

Season 1988 began with the tabling of the select committee's controversial Report at the Annual General Meeting of the League in February. Despite the controversy surrounding some of the recommendations contained in the Report, most of the recommendations were finally adopted. Notable amongst these were the fixturing of Under 16 matches on Sundays, and the modification of fixtures to keep all junior teams of a given Club together at the same venue; and the formation of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE as a permanent arm of the League's administration.

It is disappointing to record that two of the key recommendations made in the select committee's report were not adopted. After many years of vacillation and procrastination at all levels, the issue of compulsory fielding of Under 18's has still not been tackled in any meaningful way. Consideration of the select committee's recommendation that all 1st division Clubs be required to field Under 18's from season 1988 onwards was deferred at last year's Annual General Meeting, and despite several communications from both the select committee and the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE, the matter has still not been addressed by the Executive It is considered vital that this divisive issue receive urgent attention, and be resolved once and for all.

The second recommendation of the select committee which was not adopted at last year's Annual General Meeting was the appointment of a full-time JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT OFFICER. It was recognised that funding assistance was required for the proposed appointment, and considerable effort was devoted by members of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE in lobbying potential sponsors. Whilst positive and enthusiastic encouragement was received from the Dept. of Sport & Recreation, the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, and the Victorian Football League for the merits of the proposed appointment, our approaches to those organisations were set aside in favour of the establishment and funding of the VICTORIAN FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION.

Although the failure to secure the appointment of a full-time development officer was disappointing, our quest for funding at that critical time placed the E.D.F.L. in a unique position to influence the fundamental direction of the new VICTORIAN FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION. With a total annual budget approaching \$2 million, the V.F.D.F. will be a powerful force in all levels of football throughout the State. It replaces the former Junior Football Council of Victoria, and is the ONLY conduit for major funding assistance to Australian Football from the Victorian Government.

Input provided to the Victorian Football League by the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE resulted in a fundamental change in policy from central control of all under-age football throughout the State by the V.F.D.F., to a recognition of the importance of a network of strong, viable local Leagues and Clubs to develop a pool of talented players for the emerging National competition. It also resulted in a decision to deploy five full-time METROPOLITAN DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS, fully funded by

the V.F.D.F., into the headquarters of major local Leagues, and to dedicate part of each officer's time to programs directed by the respective Leagues. It is significant that the very first of these appointments will be housed at E.D.F.L. headquarters, and will be available at the direction of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE for specific E.D.F.L. projects.

In summary, season 1988 was one of challenges, many highlights, and some disappointments. Prominent amongst the highlights were:

- \* The almost universal enthusiasm for the change of Under 16 games from Saturdays to Sundays;
- \* The evenness of the revised Under 16 and Under 14 competitions:
- \* The winning, for the fourth consecutive year, of the Caltex Cup for metropolitan Under 16 champions:
- \* The instigation of regular meetings of junior Club delegates, and the establishment of formal communication links direct to Club personnel involved in junior grades.

#### Disappointments included:

- \* The fixturing and grading problems caused by Clubs withdrawing teams after the start of the season, and often after earlier repeated assurances that "all will be well":
- \* The violence and aggravation, often involving adults and officials, which continues to mar an otherwise constructive activity:
- \* The forced abandonment of the Under 12 lightning premiership due to bad weather.

The future holds the potential for many new and exciting achievements in junior competition within the E.D.F.L. The prospect of amalgamation of our junior competitions with those of the Knox Junior Football Association is very real, and will be achieved in short order given good will and a commitment from all involved. Integration of the functions of the new Development Officer with those of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE will create opportunities for Clubs to develop new under-age teams, and for others to strengthen existing teams.

It must be recognised, however, that the E.D.F.L. does not and cannot operate in isolation from both the general community and football community around us.

If we are to succeed in fielding more junior teams, then demand for more and better facilities must result. It is a sad indictment of both sporting organisations and the major provider of facilities, Local Government, that closer bonds of communication and mutual respect have not been forged. Without a concerted effort to win the active support of Local Government, already over-worked and second-rate grounds will not continue to satisfy even current demands, let alone provide for growth. Football officials must respond to this challenge, and in so doing must recognise the ever-growing and diversifying demands made on Local Government. For its part, Local Government must recognise the immense social benefit arising from local football activity, and be prepared to set this against the so-called "user pays" principle which threatens the viability of many invaluable community programs if applied unfettered.

My thanks and admiration are extended to all official, players, parents and supporters who have contributed through their participation to the

success of our under-age competitions in season 1988. Special thanks are extended to the Umpires, who endure the blunt end of many ill-directed criticisms in pursuit of their important role.

I record my thanks to the League Manager, Bruce Holmes, for the valuable assistance and additional time devoted to the affairs of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE.

Finally, to the members of the JUNIOR FOOTBALL SUB-COMMITTEE, I extend my deepest appreciation of, and thanks for, a singular devotion to the often daunting tasks taken-on in season 1988. Members of the Committee during season 1988 were:

## **ANNUAL REPORT DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING**

The 1988 football season is now well and truly part of League History; having all it's own stories, problems and results that differentiate it from all other years.

For everyone in the Umpiring fraternity it will always be tinged with sadness after that day in May when Ken Myles passed away. He was officiating in his 200th game as a Goal Umpire. Ken was a true gentleman and a friend to all; the perennial smile on his face (as captured in that first photograph) will live forever.

In umpiring it is difficult to quantity the effectiveness of a person or board's efforts. We therefore assess ourselves by the quantity and quality of criticism, a sad fact but true. During 1988 we were pleased to have only received minimal criticism about umpiring performances and behaviour. This quantity of criticism was apparently far less than that generated in previous years; based on this premise, Umpires have improved in their decision making and demeanour.

Every individual umpire, goal, boundary or field, is to be congratulated on this improvement, because it is one thing to be instructed what to do, but it is definitely another to go away, practice and then perform on match days.

#### GRAND FINAL UMPIRES

Umpiring being the individual sport that it is, we strive for our equivalent of a footballer's premiership and that is to umpire a Grand Final.

During the season umpires were assessed on their relative ability in performances under all conditions, culminating in the best performed being appointed to finals. The finals series was generally incident free, with most exhibitions being above average despite some poor ground conditions.

I hope clubs give plenty of thought to who they appoint to these positions and don't fall for the trap of appointing any "Could-havebeen-champions" who seem to use the position as a means of venting their frustrations on not only the umpires but also their young players.

#### THE FUTURE

- Consistent umpiring performances
- Full complement of umpires in all competitive grades
- Representation in V.M.F.L. Grand Finals
- Even more emphasis on enjoying the sport of umpiring
- Good dry grounds for Season 1989.

The first four items above are the aims of our Board for 1989, and these are within our control; the last one is more wishful thinking than anything else and is as likely as 'Jacko' umpiring a VoF.L. Grand Final.

In my first year as Director of Umpiring I have been very fortunate to have had great support from an experienced Board, making my transition from umpiring to advising relatively easy; for this I am very appreciative and look forward to an even more fulfilling year in 1989.

## VICTORIAN METROPOLITAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE 1988 REPORT

## ESTABLISHMENT OF THE VICTORIAN FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION

During season 1983 the number of teams registered with the Victorian Metropolitan Football League peaked at 2,092. In the short space of five years this number has reduced to 1,573 teams - an alarming decline in the participation rate in metropolitan football.

As a result of these disturbing figures, and the apparent inability of the major football controlling bodies within Victoria to collectively and effectively address this problem, an Executive Committee of the Junior Football Council recommended the establishment of the Victorian Football Development Foundation. It was felt that an independent body would be better placed to assess the current situation throughout Victoria and then evolve policies and programs which would be implemented in a co-ordinated and controlled fashion.

VMFL Leagues and associations, along with all other major controlling bodies throughout Victoria, very conscious of the need to present football in a manner which satisfies the needs and expectations of both participant and spectator, have overwhelmingly supported its introduction.

The Foundation officially commenced operation in September, 1988, superceding the Junior Football Council. The Foundation members - appointed by the VFL Commission and approved by the State Government - are: Messrs. Alan Schwab (Chairman), Ed Biggs, John Dillon, Bill McGrath and Graeme Richmond. Mr. Kevin Sheehan has been appointed as General Manager of the Foundation, with Mr. Michael Daniher as his assistant.

The fundamental philosophy of the Foundation is to develop a properly organized pathway to introduce youngsters and their parents to football via an attractive and exciting Vickick program — designed to enhance skill levels in a fun filled environment — prior to progression into club under age and then open age competitions.

Although in its very formative stages the Foundation has already shown that it will be of tremendous assistance to metropolitan leagues and associations. Already the Foundation has approved the appointment of five Field Officers who will work closely with metropolitan football administrators developing football at grass roots level. Where appropriate these Foundation Officers will operate from the full-time administrative offices of VMFL bodies. It is expected that the duties of the Foundation Officers will include the following:-

- \* Conduct the Vickick Association program in conjunction with officials in the Vickick administration structure. This would include the recruitment of schools to the program and arranging the flow-on of players to junior clubs.
- \* Conducting school hours Aussie Footy program at primary schools, including the organization of in-service courses for teachers.
- \* In liaison with metropolitan leagues and associations and clubs, arrange for all primary and secondary schools to be linked with clubs to provide fostership of school programs.
- \* In consultation with VMFL area committees introduce specific

recruiting initiatives at secondary schools to ensure the continued viability of present teams and clubs and the growth of new teams and clubs in developing areas.

- Assist VMFL junior clubs in the organization and conduct of training nights and promotional visits.
- \* Arrange and conduct courses of education at Vickick and club level in accordance with the state coaching plan for coaches, administrators, umpires, and sports trainers.
- \* Act as executive officer to VMFL area committees.
- \* In liaison with local VMFL leagues and associations assist in the co-ordination of under age representative programs.
- \* Liaise with VFL promotion officers to ensure maximum benefit is derived from VFL player clinics conducted at local schools.

In addition to these duties the Foundation Officers will also be available to assist the administration of VMFL leagues and associations in other appropriate areas of promotion and development.

The Foundation has also appointed ex Carlton and Fitzroy coach, David Parkin, as the Victorian State Director of Coaching. The benefits of this appointment should quickly flow through to VMFL leagues and associations as extensive coaching course programs become firmly established at all levels of football throughout Victoria.

There is no doubt the establishment of the Foundation is an exciting development in metropolitan football. The VMFL through its member Leagues and Associations looks forward to working closely with the Foundation to ensure that football continues as the major sporting and social recreation in this State.

Quite apart from the establishment of the Foundation there were other positive features of the VMFL throughout the year. The metropolitan championships again proved to be an outstanding success. Conducted at the magnificent facilities of the East Ringwood Sporting Club, a large crowd witnessed a fine display of metropolitan football. Congratulations are extended to the Eastern Districts Football League for its victories in both the VFL sponsored senior grade series — for the first time since 1983 — and the Caltex Under 16 series for the fourth successive year. The performance of the Eastern Districts Football League in the prestigous Caltex competition is outstanding and reflects the importance placed on junior development programs in that area.

Another highlight of the metropolitan season was the participation in the inaugural Under 19 challenge series which was conducted as part of football's contribution to the Bicentennial celebrations. The carnival, which for the first time ever brought together the VMFL, VCFL, VAFA and VFA in a round robin series of matches, was played at the Melbourne Cricket Ground and produced some exciting football throughout the day. The carnival was opened by the Premier, The Honourable Mr. John Cain and VFL Executive Commissioner, Mr. Alan Schwab.

The winner of the carnival, the Victorian Country Football League, was not decided until the final match of the day when the VCFL defeated the VMFL which tired after outstanding performances earlier in the day by defeating both the VFA and VAFA. It is hoped that the carnival continues into the future as it not only provides players throughout Victoria with the opportunity of participating in representative football at an elite level, but it also sees the major controlling bodies of Victorian under age football working together for the betterment of Victorian football.
