#### League Manager's Report

The 1989 season was a most remarkable year indeed. So much has been achieved in the last twelve months, that it is difficult to analyse in a few short words what has happened in that time.

Undoubtedly, the Executive Committee's decision to embark upon a program to construct a new office administration complex for the League is the most progressive step the league has taken since the formation of the Fourth division.

It has been said by some, that it is a "Taj Mahal" building, however, it is NOT. It is one that is badly needed for the League to be effective in its management for future years. Many of the clubs have remarked how difficult it appears to operate in. For the League to remain in the current building, it would need to undertake major repairs, which in my opinion is wasting hard earned money. The League Executive commissioned in April, a debtors system to improve the debtors system for the benefit of the clubs, and that has proved to be a major success to the administration, and was appreciated by all clubs. To be able to receive a monthly statement enabled the clubs to follow their yearly accounts. Our next task is to develop a ledger system to enable us to access our reports quickly and accurately.

I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the following for their assistance during the year, which made my performance to the tasks a lot more enjoyable.

Mr. Bob Tregear, President, in his first year as President and the Executive Committee for their guidance, support and understanding in a year of rapid development. It was a most challenging year indeed and one worthy of comment. Director of Umpiring, Mr. Greg Sidebottom, John Eastwood, Secretary of the Umpires Board, members of the board and observers for their contributions during the year. Certainly our umpires have gained a great deal through Greg's leadership qualities.

The Tribunal who have a difficult task. Chairman, Don Hall, Secretary, Bob Matthews, and the members for contributing their time to the League to adjudicate on all reports.

To the V.F.L./V.M.F.L. for their support of the E.D.F.L.

#### The Year in Review

On reflection, Season 1989 was one of many changes. At League Level, the election of a new President, the introduction of 2 new clubs (Knox and Noble Park Bears), expansion of the computer system to include administration of debtors, and the consolidation of the Junior Sub-Committee under new Chairman Rod Burgess, all held the promise of changes to come.

At Club level, new Committees, players, and coaches carried fresh enthusiasm and ambitions into a new Season. It is to the credit of all involved that most clubs were able to record some measures of success, even though the Premierships may have proved elusive.

The successes of Season 1989 were tempered by 2 tragic events experienced on the field. Early in the Season, Warrandyte player, Garry Allsop was left a quadriplegic after a collision in play. In the mid-Season, Mitcham player, Greg Pimm died of a heart attack during the course of a game. These two tragedies were felt by everyone associated with the Eastern Districts Football League, and it was encouraging to note that the speed and willingness with which all Clubs rallied in support of the families and friends of both Garry and Greg. These events transcend even the deepest rivalry between Clubs, and the sincere condolences of all members of the league are extended to the Warrandyte and Mitcham Clubs, and to the families and friends of Garry and Greg.

Whilst most Clubs will be satisfied with their efforts in 1989, it is disturbing to note that a few continue to struggle back financially and administratively. On field success can only be achieved with the backing of strong administration, and it is an unfortunate fact that a few Clubs have been unable to attract the required mix of skills. There is no secret formula to the successful make-up of a football administrator, just the application of common sense, experience, and a willingness to serve. Those who believe that success can be purchased, and that football is a stage for self-promotion, are usually short lived and remembered only for the problems they leave behind.

The year commenced with the election to the Executive Committee of Bob Tregear (President) and Geoff Auton. Key areas of administration were assigned to Executive members as follows:

The commitment required of Executive members is substantial, and all members served the League with distinction during Season 1989.

Formal announcement of the major sponsorship attracted to the League this year was made at a function for Sponsors, the Media, and Club Presidents at the Dorset Gardens Hotel in May. Guests included V.F.L. Executive Commissioner, Alan Schwab, Clarke Hansen and Peter Booth from the A.B.C., Steven Quartermaine and Eddie McGuire from ATV 10, and Sponsors' representatives.

Our involvement this year in the V.M.F.L. Series was extended for the first time to Under 14 level. Squad organisers, Chris Lobb and Anthony Giles-Peters, and Coach Peter Baker, together with John Higgins worked hard to mould a representative team of which we were all proud. In our first game we were soundly defeated by a most accomplished Essendon Districts Football League team, but improved dramatically to win against the Dandenong Junior Football League in the second round of the competition. It was a great disappointment that any chance of the Under 14 representative team playing in the Finals was lost because of the late withdrawal of the Hawthorn District Junior Football League from the competition.

Our Under 16 team was more successful finishing Runners-up in the Grand Final. Thanks must be extended to Noel Bosch (Coach) and all his able assistants for their untiring work with the clubs.

#### The Year in Review

The Senior Squad unfortunately were unable to win back to back premierships, going down to Diamond Valley in the Grand Final by 16 points. Again thanks to the Coach, Bruce Tempany, for an excellent job.

The Trainer's Association is sincerely thanked for their effort to all teams competing throughout the competition. Without their help and assistance I am sure our teams may not have fared so well.

This year the League's First Division ladder at the end of the home and home games was extremely close, even though it differed littled from 1988. The final four teams who played off for the Flag were Boronia, Ringwood, Vermont and East Burwood. Vermont Football Club became the Premiers of First Division (this was their 39th win in succession).

The Second Division Flag was won by a very impressive North Ringwood Club. All spectators of this game were treated to a very spectacular performance by all players.

The Third Division Premiership was contested between Norwood and Lilydale Football Clubs. Both teams were very even throughout the Season. Norwood were the victors on the day after a titanic struggle.

The Fourth Division Grand Final was possibly the Grand Final of the Series with Bennettswood/Blackburn South being fully extended by a gallant Heathmont team. The final result of a 2 point victory by the Bennettswood/Blackburn South Football Club was indicative of the closeness of the game.

To all Clubs who hosted our Finals Series for all Divisions, we thank you most sincerely. The schedule of possible close games, together with perfect weather, provided the best possible conditions for a wonderful Series. Attendance figures were up throughout the Series and everyone enjoyed the good hard games.

This year the inaugural Grand Final Luncheon was held. Guests included Presidents and their wives, members of the Tribunal, Umpires' Board and the Junior Committee.

The Under 14 Essendon/Nubrik Cup Lightning Premiership was again very keenly contested. The Grand Final was played between the Bayswater and Mooroolbark Football Clubs, with Bayswater being victorious by the small margin of 4 points. Congratulations must be extended to all teams who competed for their sportsmanlike manners in which the games were played. Our appreciation must also be extended to the Nubrik Company, together with the Essendon Football Club for their continued sponsorship of the Series and also to Mr. Noel Bosch of the Essendon Football Club for his support and guidance throughout the Series.

This year the Junior Committee conducted a Junior Presentation Night. Guest Speaker for the night was Mr. David Parkin, State Director of Coaching, who gave an inspiring address on the fundamental enjoyment of our great game. Over 200 people enjoyed the night and we hope this night will be continued in the future.

The Junior Committee, under the guidance of Vice President, Rod Burgess, continues to meet on a regular basis to develop strategies for the development of youth in the eastern areas through participation in the game.

At the moment the League is discussing with the Builder the new premises for the Eastern District Football League. We are hoping that the specifications will be available in the near future and that the premises at 256 Scoresby Road should be in use by late 1990.

The last 10 years have seen the E.D.F.L. grow in size. The potential of this Football League is only now being tapped with the introduction this year of sponsorship, new rules and a new Junior Committee. The advancements within this organisation are endless.

The 1990's should be one of continued growth, responsible sponsorship and an exciting period which will realise the opportunity for the E.D.F.L. to position itself uniquely within the sport and to advance upon its program of providing a service to the community which will be appreciated by all.

#### 1989 Junior Sub-Committee Season Report

For the past two seasons, one of the vital concerns of the Eastern Districts F.L. Junior Sub-committee, under the chairmanship of Bob Tregear (now EDFL President), has been the active promotion and development of Junior Football in the Eastern region of Melbourne.

Similarly the start of the 1989 EDFL Junior season saw the role of the EDFL Junior Committee expand, with my appointment as EDFL Junior Development Officer and Secretary of the Junior Committee, in conjunction with the Victorian Football Development Foundation, until recently a football organization unfamiliar to most people.

Sponsored jointly by the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, and the V.F.L., the V.F.D.F.'s primary role is to promote and develop Junior Football in Victoria by providing an attractive and comprehensive "player pathway" for young footballers.

Consequently, one of my major responsibilities as V.F.D.F. Eastern Region Field Officer, is to ensure every junior footballer, (regardless of ability), has access to their own "player pathway" starting with the Vickick and Aussie Footy Skills Program, which introduces primary school aged children to football through a fun program of skill development and non-competitive "Aussie Footy" games.

The next progression is for a young footballer to become actively involved with a local Junior Football Club, not an easy task with more than 39 sports available to today's youngsters.

Understanding these problems, the E.D.F.L. Junior Committee's primary goal is to ensure Australian Football continues to remain a most attractive sporting option for all youngsters and their parents.

Recent introductions such as fixturing all junior games, (U10-U16), on a Sunday, and non-competitive U10 and U12 sections has resulted in junior football numbers stabilizing in the past three years. In 1989, twenty-seven clubs fielded 81 junior teams, (U10-U16), including the pleasing return of the Surrey Hills F.C. U16 team for the first time in many years.

It is also very pleasing to discover that nearly all E.D.F.L. clubs are now recognizing the real worth of promoting and developing their junior teams. Already, several clubs previously without juniors, are now indicating they will be fielding junior teams in 1990.

Some of the more positive highlights of the 1989 E.D.F.L. junior season included:

- ★ The appointment of E.D.F.L. Junior Development Officer.
- ★ The pre-season U14 Nubrick Cup Lightning Premiership, culminating in one of the best U14 Grand Finals seen in recent years between Mooroolbark and Bayswater.
- ★ The highly successful U10 and U12 Lightning Premierships held this year in May.
- ★ The E.D.F.L. U16 Representative Squad playing in its 5th consecutive V.M.F.L. U16 Grand Final.
- ★ The introduction of the E.D.F.L. U14 Inter-League Squad, which quickly developed into a formidable unit for the V.M.F.L. U14 Championships.
- ★ The establishment of closer links with the Knox Junior Football Association through amalgamation discussions.
- ★ Five different Junior Premiership teams in 1989.
- ★ The excellent response by Junior Clubs, parents and junior players to the inaugural E.D.F.L. Junior Presentation Night.
- ★ The collation of an E.D.F.L. Junior Questionnaire, from which several innovations will be implemented in 1990.

As always though, there were several negatives during the 1989 season, including isolated incidents of negative adult behaviour at junior games. Hopefully, through correct coach, administration, and parent education, more adults will begin to understand that junior football is for kids, where the emphasis on winning is secondary to the enjoyment received in playing the game.

Looking to the future, the E.D.F.L. Junior Committee will be aiming to instigate several recommendations from the 1989 Junior Football Questionnaire for the 1990 season, including:

- ★ Increased coach and administration education course.
- ★ The introduction of a "Best Conducted Junior Club Award".
- ★ Voluntary restrictions on alcohol at junior games.
- ★ Increased communication between the E.D.F.L. Junior Committee and Club delegates.
- ★ The establishment of an E.D.F.L. Junior Tribunal, thus catering for the discipline requirements of junior players.
- ★ Renewed discussions with the K.J.F.A. on an amalgamation package for 1991.
- ★ Closer liaison between E.D.F.L. Clubs and local Vickick Clinics.

Finally, the organization and administration of the E.D.F.L. Junior Football Season does not just happen by accident or luck. It takes many hours of hard work and attention to a myriad of details by a controlling body dedicated to the promotion and development of junior football.

Starting at E.D.F.L. Executive level, thanks must be extended to E.D.F.L. President Bob Tregear, and League Manager Bruce Holmes, both fierce supporters of E.D.F.L. Junior Football for their involvement and feedback with the Junior Committee on many projects and ideas in 1989.

Similarly, my thanks and admiration goes to E.D.F.L. Junior Committee Chairman, Rod Burgess, (who also doubles as E.D.F.L. Senior Vice-President), for his dynamic and thoughtful chairmanship of the 1989 Junior Committee, plus his enormous contribution to the E.D.F.L./K.J.F.A. Amalgamation committee.

Likewise to the members of the E.D.F.L. Junior Committee, I extend my deep appreciation and thanks for their sincere and diverse contributions to E.D.F.L. Junior Football in 1989. Members of the 1989 Junior Committee were:

#### **Umpires Board Report**

#### THE MAN/WOMAN IN WHITE IS USUALLY RIGHT!

The 1989 football season is now well and truly etched into the history books with only the Premier teams being recorded. So it is also with the umpires, only those achieving Grand Final Status are remembered. However, in the E.D.F.L. umpiring ranks, for every Grand Final umpire there are at least five others who worked just as hard and yet missed out and should be remembered for their support and service to our football during the year.

Once again the Umpires Board apologizes to any club that may have been inconvenienced by our shortage of umpires. Every week we were approximately 35 umpires short, but thanks to the dedication of the Umpires Association members, through doubling up on Saturdays and Sundays, we were able to cover most matches.

An example of this dedication to the game was shown by two of our youngest umpires; Aaron Doutch (Age 14, Boundary) and Shane Donovan (Age 16, Goals) who took the initiative to control a senior game at Upper Ferntree Gully when the field umpire, Rob Pickett, broke his ankle early in the match.

Another umpire John Eastwood, broke his arm in two places after tripping during a match and yet with the understanding of both teams completed the game before going to hospital.

These two examples and the countless other umpires who kept running with torn muscles or the flu, in order to complete matches are genuinely recognized and appreciated by Umpires Board.

Two aspects of the game were the subject of a crackdown by umpires this year;

- 1. SWEARING
  2. UNDULY ROUGH PLAY
- Under direction from the Executive and the Umpires Board umpires were required to report all instances of both obscene language and abusive language. This resulted in many cases for

the Tribunal to adjudicate on, however, we believe the game itself will be the winner as a result of this action.

During the past five years in VFL football alone many young players have had their careers terminated by deliberate indiscriminate tackles. It was stated to the coaches at the commencement of the season that the tactic of unduly rough play would not be tolerated. Hence any attempt to tackle players after disposal, tackle players in/or immediately after the act of making, or head high tackles, was penalized accordingly. This will continue in the future.

In Junior football the send off rule has been effective in curbing youthful aggression, however, there were far too many multi-offenders. A record was kept of all send-offs this season and based on these figures the executive may consider automatic suspensions for those multi-offenders.

The EDFL football teams may have been

umpires to reach the finals.

- 2. The success of Andrew Wheeler as a boundary Umpire in his first year with the VFL (2 VFL Senior Games and the Under 19 Grand Final). Andrew was a boundary umpire with the EDFL for some years before joining the VFL this season and continued to support our umpires acting as an observer for the Umpires board whenever his VFL commitments allowed.
- 3. The performances of all umpires observed by the VFL recruiting officers were outstanding, with a number of our umpires being invited to trial with the VFL ranks next season.

#### **Umpires Board Report (Continued)**

4. The number of new umpires to have joined the EDFL Umpires Panel.

However, this has now been offset by the number of retirees; unfortunately age has caught up with some of our most experienced umpires.

Although we can appreciate the Umpire is not always right, we were very pleased with the quality of umpires who officiated during the season, particularly in the finals.

The friendship extended to umpires after a match by most clubs was greatly appreciated and demonstrates that sportsmanship is alive and well.

No provision has been made in the accounts for depreciation on buildings other than freehold improvements which is a departure from Australian Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia and the Australian Society of Accountants. In our opinion, depreciation should be charged in the accounts to absorb the cost of the building over its useful economic life. The League has not calculated the effect of this departure and it is impracticable for us to do so.


