ANNUAL REPORT EAST RINGWOOD PROGRESS ASSOCIATION

PRESENTED AT ANNUAL MEETING 25th JULY, 1960

The 1959 Annual Meeting was held on Monday, 28th September with a good attendance and favoured by a visit from the Mayor of Ringwood, Cr. Lavis and Mr. Manson, M.L.A.

A membership of about 35 was enrolled for the year and attendance has been regular at the Meetings but the Committee has been disappointed at the small attendance during the last few months.

Several successful functions were held through the year. In November, a successful Community Fair was held and supported by the various East Ringwood organisations and all reported a satisfactory result. Ea

In connection with the Fair, the Progress Association organised a Junior Art Competition and over 250 entries were received. The Art Instructor of the Burwood Teachers' Training College, Gordon A. Speary, Esq., judged the Competition and in his opinion the standard was exceptionally good. Expressions of interest were received from many people hoping that the Competition would be repeated in November, 1960. Great interest was shown by parents and residents in the display of entries at the Community Hall and Cr. Lavis, Mayor of Ringwood, distributed the prizes.

This year saw Ringwood proclaimed as a City and at the invitation of the Council, the East Ringwood Progress Association decided to co-operate by entering a float in the Procession and also to put on some entertainment in the Community Hall on Proclamation night. Great enthusiasm was shown in the Float by local residents and both donations of money and flowers were generous given towards the float which was named "Lovely East Ringwood" and beautifully decorated by voluntary helpers. The cost of preparing the float was £16 which was covered by donations from various local organisations and the Association funds.

At the request of the Association, the East Ringwood Play Reading Group presented two one-act plays in the Community Hall on Proclamation Night and played to a capacity audience. The public were invited & supper was served. The entire evening was free of charge.

Early this year a Junior Drama Group was formed and this is now actively in progress with ten teen age members who meet every second Tuesday. The Association donated £5 towards the purchase of books to form a play library for the group and a further £5/5/8 was donated at the June meeting of the Association.

At the <sup>June</sup> July meeting it was decided to form a Garden Group and Mr. J. Frost, of Eastfield Rd. will be the convenor at its first meeting. Mr. J.L. Kirby was the speaker at the July Meeting and he showed interesting slides and gave a most firmative talk to those interested in forming a garden group.

The Infant Welfare Centre has started building on the ground provided for it in the Community Centre and the Association is glad that such a big step forward has been taken.

During the year several amenities were obtained for East Ringwood including the grading and improvement of Alexander Rd. At the July meeting donations amounting to £25/13- were made to the following organisations - Infant Welfare, 3rd & 4th E.R. Scouts, Children's Library, Junior Drama Group, Hall Management & Girl Guides.

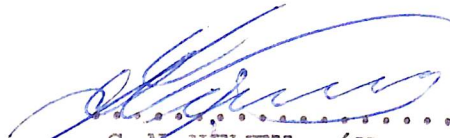

ANNUAL MEETING HELD IN SEPTEMBER, 1961.

BROUGHT FORWARD FROM JULY

The Association was unable to conduct its Annual Meeting in July as required by its Constitution as a quorum was not present. A Special Meeting was then called for Sept.

Mr. Enting opened the meeting with a special welcome to the Councillors and particularly to Mrs. Penny on her first visit to the Progress Association meetings. He explained Mr. Green's absence due to his transfer to Sydney.

Mr. Enting read the Annual Report which had been prepared by the Secretary .. and this was accepted.

Mr. Enting invited comments from those present after the reading of the Annual Report and asked those present whether they wished the Association to continue... and discussion followed.

Mrs. Francis asked what purpose would there be in retaining the Association. Mr. Enting pointed out some of the amenities that have been brought about by the Association and that the Association has been found a valuable support to East Ward councillors throughout the years: providing a focal point for the Community Fair.

Mr. Horman spoke on the difficulties of the Council at the present juncture in making any forward moves but assured those present that the East Ward Councillors are vigorously pursuing the committee's interests. He believes that there will be a need in the future for a Progress Association such as this to act on cultural activities.

Mr. Poynter asked whether there were any activities such as plans for sports ovals that an Association could support. The local Chamber of Commerce would be prepared to convene a Community Fair if the Association disbanded.

Mrs. Corbett pointed out that the pattern of living in the community has changed and that the Hall Management Committee now functioned as a focal point for local bodies wishing to use the Community Hall for bookings.

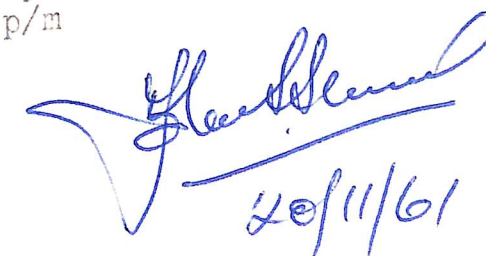
Mr. Vergers pointed out that the various local committees do gradually take over the community functions, and in reply to Mrs. Corbett's query as to whether the Association had any real value to the Council, stated that the support of such a group is always stronger than coming from an individual.

Open discussion was vigorously maintained, Mr. Chapman, a newcomer to the meetings expressing his view that it seemed a pity for such a group to disband. It was suggested that perhaps the local Chamber of Commerce could be a voice for various organisations. The matter of parking in Railway Avenue was discussed .. this being a point that could well be taken up by both an Association such as this and the local Chamber of Commerce.

Finally, Mr. Enting called for a resolution, having heard many interesting opinions ..... to test the feeling of the meetings and to see whether sufficient people were interested enough to take office. He suggested that if three people could be found to take the office of President, Secretary and Treasurer, sufficient support could probably be found to make up a committee of five and two Vice Presidents.

It was resolved on a motion put forward by Mrs. Francis, that the meeting be adjourned for one month to give those present the opportunity to enlist more support for the Association before its future should be decided. It was suggested that Mr. Shum or Mr. Campbell be asked to chair the meeting. Meeting to be held 20th November. Motion seconded by Mr. Chapman. carried.

Discussion then followed on the Community Fair. The East Ringwood Chamber of Commerce had made the offer to Organise the Community Fair which was eagerly approved by all present.
