The time 1865 and the scene, 15 miles east of Melbourne. The Shack was a stopping place for the Cobb and Company Coaches, and a resting place for the foot weary, miners on their way to the goldfields. This trough shelter corned itz own name becoming the "Coach and Horses Hotel" and around this site grew the township of 7 Hingwood.

8 Bullock waggons blazed the trail known for many years as Whitehorse Road now proclaimed Maroondah Highway. 9 Bushland

was transformed into orchards and Ringwood became a thriving orchard district.

Rapid development now has made this orchard land of great value for subdivisional purposes both residential and "industial, so the town has everything to make us urban yet suburban maintaining glorious views the natural bushland and the Dandenong Ranges as sour "background. No matter where you live a walk of five minutes will take you to these open spaces.

Our interests may be centred on sports grounds of over 40 acres or bushwalking in the parts and reserves throughout our city. Down busy main street, shoppers crowd gossip, and talk about the weather, about the rain or lack of it to make pastures grow and gardens bloom for in our

a train journey of 38 minutes will take us to Melbourne our state capital situated on the Yarra River. Sightseeing boats operate on this waterway, and from its banks the lawns and garden's you view the city skyline.

The central business section of our city, is one mile long and half a mile wide this centre is busy and crowded with tram cars running in the centre of our broad streets. Collins Street flined by trees is the pride of the city bringing a touch of the old world with its gay tables and agumbrellas.

Boulevards, shaded by wide-spreading leafy trees and adorned by shrubs and lawns, lead from our city to the

suburbs Well known 5th Kilda Road planted for its tentire length with English trees, is one of the most beautiful thoroughfares in the Commonwealth. Near here Government House residence of the state governor, nestles in the Botanical Gardens where we feature the wonderful flowers for which this land is famous.

On the foreshore of Port Philip Bay, two miles south of the city large joverseas liners berth at Port Melbourne while smaller vessels both overseas and interstate berth at the shain of wharves constructed on the Yarra River Our most popular seaside resorts within easy reach of Melbourne are situated along the eastern shores of the Mornington Peninsula, these "endless beaches, offer a wide range of aquatic shouts

Melbournes eastward teature is the Dandenong Ranges. The ranges, are perhaps at their best in spring and autumm. In spring and early summer the truit-tree blossom stands out vividly against the toliage of beech, sassathas and eucalrift trees. During autumm the sunsett colourings of the deciduous trees, are set against the unchang ing green of the surrounding Australian The Dandenong's are also notable for the variety of bird life, Sherbrooke for example is the haunt of the lyre-bird, the finest of all bird mimics Healesville also nestles I'm a valley, completely encircled by these ranges Three miles from Healesville at the foot of Mi-Riddell is the Sir Colin Mackennie Sanctuarry for Australian Hauna and Flora, where in their

natural surroundings Koalas, Emus, Kangaroos Wombats and Possums live in a state of Semi-captivity So with the changing of the tide and the closing of the day time goes by
