

The Deep-Sea Angler fish lives at the bottom of very deep oceans where it is too dark to see. This fish has a lamp on his top jaw.Small fish swim up to this lamp and soon get eaten up.

In the warm waters of the South Atlantic lives a peculiar fish called the mudskipper. Not only can it walk on land, but it even climbs trees when chasing insects. Able to breathe out of water, the mudskipper

uses its fins to crawl, like a lizard.

The name <u>Emu</u> comes from the Portugese word meaning large bird. There is another Australian large bird which is is much more colorful than the brown, black and grey emu. Its name begins with c.

Emu dads do much more work than
Emu mums. In summer, male Emus eat
too much and become quite fat. In
April the mother Emu begins to lay
the first of about 25 eggs. Three
father emus look after about 8 eggs
each. For eight weeks, the father Emus
have nothing to eat while they sit on
the nest. By the time the eggs have all
hatched, they have become quite thin again.
The father emus then look after the chicks
for nearly two years.

The Australian Emu is often mixed up with his African cousin, the Ostrich. How are these birds different to most other birds?


There is an old saying-don't bury your head in the sand like an ostrich. What does it mean? Yet ostriches and emus don't really bury their heads in the sand. When these birds are sitting on their eggs, they lay their head and neck



flat along the ground.

This makes them look like a small bush. Why do you think they do this?

Emus live in most parts of Australia (except the cities). Their feathers stop them from getting too hot or too cold.
