so small animals and people have no need to be afraid of me.




I live by myself in a burrow. Sometimes my friends from other burrows visit me at home so I don't get lonely.

Those of you who visit the Sir Colin

Mackenzie Fauna Park this year may be lucky
enough to see the platypus tank. This is
not open all day because the platypus only
spends about two hours a day actually in
the water. While in the water he uses his
duck-like bill to find food in the mud
at the bottom. In one day, a platypus
living in a tank will need about 1,200
earthworms, 50

vabbies as

well as

yabbies and beetles.

Sometimes large goannas and pythons eat platypuses, if they can catch them.









