

## The animals on our coins . . . the Lyrebird

The <u>male</u> lyrebird, with its beautiful fan of green and blue feathers, is found only in Australia. Many years ago, shooters were allowed to kill lyrebirds and sell their feathers. People used the feathers to make their houses, hats and clothes look prettier. To you think the shooters and their customers were right to do this? Why?

Today it is against the law to harm or kill lyrebirds. Many people today want to make sure that uncommon animals like the lyrebird do not disappear altogether from the Australian bush.

Female lyrebirds look quite different to male lyrebirds. They are smaller and their feathers are greyishbrown.

Sherbrooke Forest,just out of Melbourne,is a place where you might see tame ones.

> Now the shooters have been stopped, the lyrebird has new problems. Many of them are killed by foxes and cats. These cats (called feral cats) have been bought to the bush by people who are sick of feeding and looking after them.

Mother lyrebirds lay only one egg.About the size of a hens egg,it is grey with purple blotches.

The 10 cent piece





Can you remember the names of the animals on the 1c.,2c. and 5c. coins?

Lyrebirds have strong clawed feet which they use to rake through the leaf litter on the ground.Worms and insects are good lyrebird food. Often a Pilot bird follows the lyrebird around, eating scraps.

In early autumn, the <u>male</u> lyrebird begins to sing and show his beautiful feathers. This means that he is looking for <u>female</u> lyrebirds to become mothers.

Ants, flies, beetles and snails crawling around the plant slide down the smooth sides of the pitcher or 'jug'and drown in the juice at the bottom. Then the Pitcher plant eats them up.
