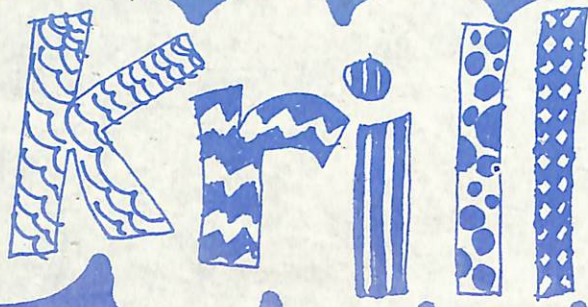

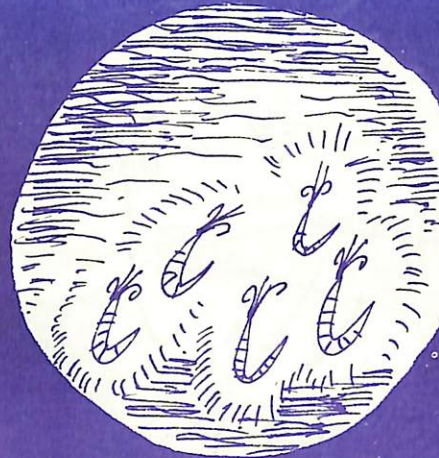

water.

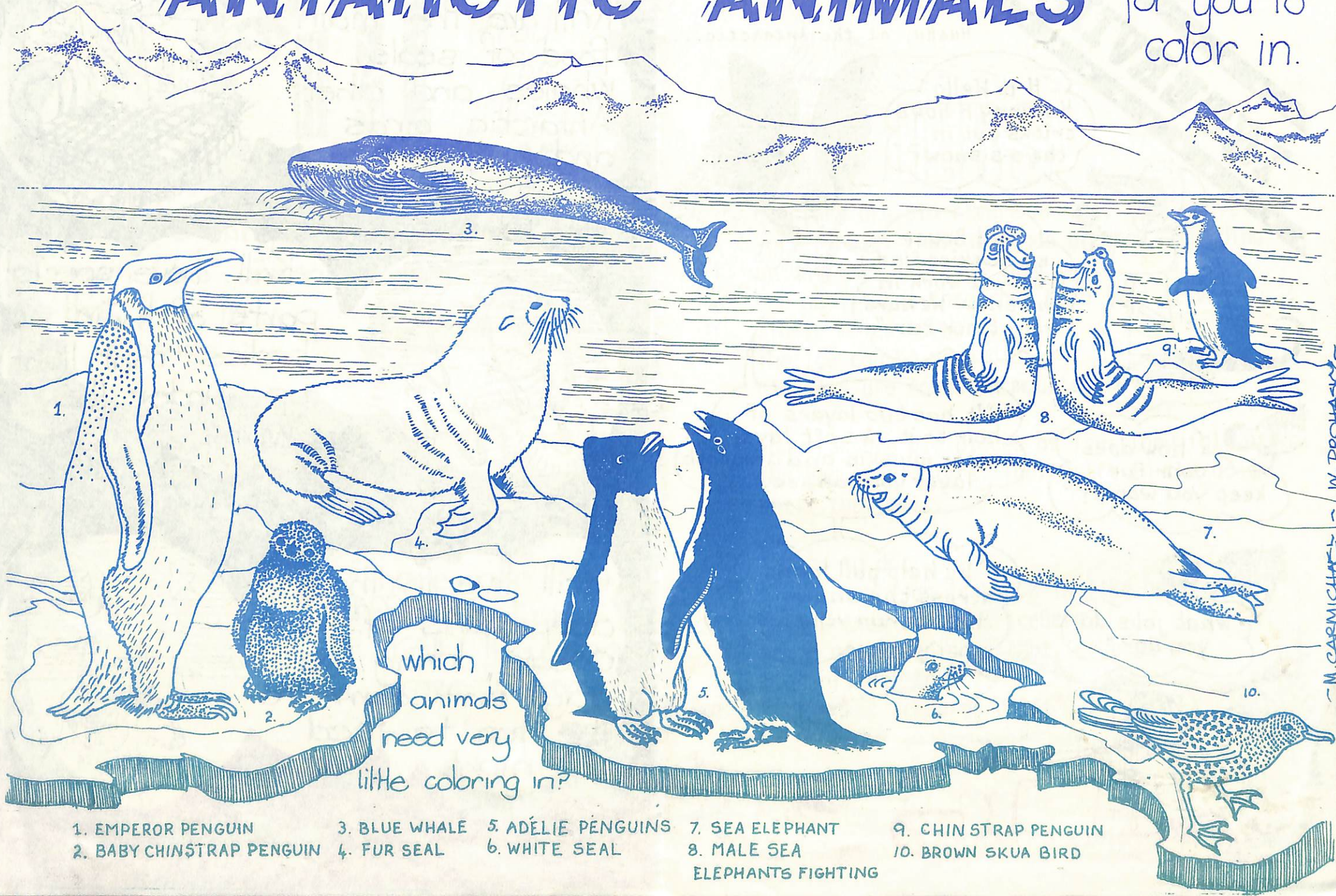


Krill live in the

at night.



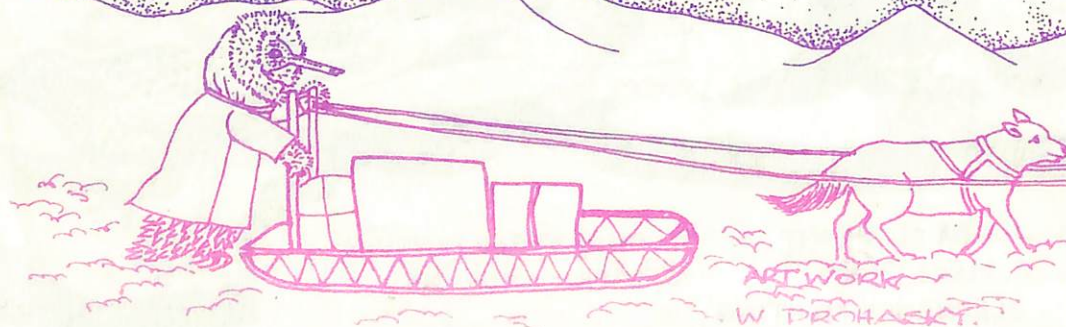
