



THE END OF THE DINOSAURS



The most puzzling question of all is why did the dinosaurs disappear completely? There have been many theories put forward but none provides a fully satisfactory answer

1 CATASTROPHES. Perhaps great earthquakes, tidal waves, volcanoes, etc wiped them out.

These things might kill them all in a small area, but not all over the world.

2 EPIDEMICS. Perhaps some disease or plague killed them all. An epidemic could destroy the population of one area or even a country, but not all over the world.

3 CHANGES. Perhaps the atmosphere or vegetation changed and the dinosaurs, unable to adapt, died out. Such changes would be very slow, over millions of years and if other creatures adapted to the changes then the dinosaurs could perhaps have adapted also.

4 MAMMALS. A new class of animal arose which was better equipped to compete for food and space, thus forcing the dinosaur out of existence. But the mammals did not rise in importance until after dinosaurs died out.





These activities by man bring lots of problems.

THEY UPSET THE BALANCE OF NATURE

The lovely alpine areas are very easily damaged by careless acts.

The delicate mosses that grow there help to control the run-off water (from the melting snow) to streams. They are easily ruined by people walking on them.

IN ALPINE PARKS -- KEEP TO THE TRACKS

That way you will protect the plants and you will not get lost either!

Ernie and Bruce always go out prepared for sudden bad weather by wearing suitable water resistant boots. Rainproof clothing, caps and woollen gloves. Only wool stays warm when wet.

HERE ARE SOME IDEAS THAT WILL KEEP YOUR PET HEALTHY AND HAPPY.

CHOOSING A TORTOISE

1 Don't collect one from the wild.

WHY NOT?



2 Buy the tortoise from a good pet shop.

HOW COULD PET SHOPS HELP TORTOISES TO SURVIVE?

3 Pick an animal that



- has bright eyes.
- is alert
- does not smell 'fishy'.
- has a clean mouth.
- has a shell that is not damaged.
- is not too small (young).

THE TORTOISE ENCLOSURE

(We covered this last month but here are a few more hints.)

If you have an indoor enclosure and some heating your tortoise will be active all year. It will not need to hibernate if it has enough food.

Heating: a light globe over the dry land (make sure that the tortoise can move away from the warm spot.)



: a fish tank heater for the water in very cold weather (not more than 24'C).

Pot plants, stones and bark make the enclosure look good.

Make sure the tortoise can get in and out of the water easily.

FEEDING

Your tortoise will need to feed

in the water. FOODS : chopped meat (not fatty) fish, worms, snails.

HOW OFTEN? About every 2-3 days. If you watch your tortoise you will be able to tell.

ALWAYS take out uneaten food quickly - otherwise it will rot and make your tortoise sick.

CALCIUM. Tortoises need calcium to keep their shells hard and healthy. Fish in diet will help. So will a lump of "Plaster of Paris" in the water.





HEALTH PROBLEMS

- 1 SHELL ROT this is the one reason for never drilling a hole in the shell.
(It also hurts the tortoise!)
- 2 EYE FILM
- 3 COLDS - with runny nose and eyes - VERY dangerous for tortoises.
- 4 SOFT SHELL
- 5 MALNUTRITION - right diet is important.
- 6 FUNGUS

A book like "TORTOISES" by George Warren can help with treatment of tortoises but if you are not sure, take it to your local vet.



AT THE HEALESVILLE SANCTUARY...

... we have a vet.

The vet does not just treat sick animals. He tries to make sure that the animals remain healthy by working out the best diet and making sure that they are checked each day to see if they are well. Later this year we will talk to our vet in Nature Probe.

Some Animals Create Problems.

Cockatoos (which include Galahs, Long Billed Corellas, Sulphur Crested Cockatoos, and the Little Corella) are sometimes responsible for feeding on freshly planted crops.

What do you think farmers should do about this ?



