My Dear Mr. McCaskill

I was disgusted (absolutely
disgusted) at the attitude
adopted by the Ringwood
Council in regard to the
request of the Trustees of the
Tintern Church of England
Girls' Grammar School to
make Knarth & Alexander
Roads "reasonably trafficable"
on the occasion of the official
opening of the new School
in June next by His Excellency
the Governor.

What an inducement it was
for the Trustees to build the
School let alone anybody else
to build a house in the particular
Roads referred.

Mr. Pinner was correct when he
said, "the School would be a
benefit to the whole of the
Borough" & some of your Councillors
seem to think otherwise.

"Private Streets" or no "Private Streets"; it would be a gracious act & for the sake of decency, money paid by the Ratepayers of East Ward should be expended in the area under discussion.

Not one single objection would be raised by East Ward Ratepayers, & an adjustment of the amount spent could be rectified later.

The public attitude adopted does not do justice or credit to the Ringwood Borough Council.

The School Building when completed and valued would bring in considerable financial assistance to your Council.

I do not know what the Trustees of the School thought on receipt of the Council's ~~request~~ reply to their request.

I sincerely hope you will arrange to have the matter raised again in the Council, & if the request to have the roads "made trafficable" is not approved, that the Grader & some screenings spread over the Roads concerned so as to make them trafficable, thereby proving to the School Trustees

That your Council is willing
 to assist them to allow the
 Visitors being present at the
 official opening of the School
 to travel on roads in comfort
 & make easy access to the new
 School, which is very essential.
