



To use the photograph in your article, you will need to seek permission from the copyright holders. Stoke-on-Trent City Archives has physical custody of the Minton Archive and a wide-ranging licence of the Intellectual Property Rights in order to help people research, display and enjoy the archive. However the IPR in the collection as a whole and in the trade names of the company (Minton, Doulton etc) were retained by WWRD United Kingdom Ltd., the former owners of the archive. WWRD is now owned by Fiskars.

You should therefore contact Åsa Hedström (<u>asa.ericsonhedstrom@fiskars.com</u>), part of the legal team of Fiskars plc, for the permission you require. I have copied Åsa into this message to reply to you direct.
