# **Student Association**

The Student Association Board at the University of Ballarat consists of ten student directors, elected annually by the students in October, who govern and determine the policies of the Association. The Student Association provides services, activities and facilities in the interest of students which include: the Campus Shop, SA Cafe, Zoo Club Games Room, Creche, "The Room and Pillar Bar" jointly with the University, storage lockers, Association bus for hire, clubs and societies, UNIJOBS - casual employment service, equipment hire, Student Accident Insurance, a regular newspaper – "Bootleg" and the student diary. The Student Association also provides assistance, in the form of advocacy and advice, for students in need of help dealing with the requirements of University studies.

### **CAMPUS SHOP and BALLA ART**

The Campus Shop is located on the first floor of the Union Building and is open during each semester from 8.30am Monday to Friday. You can buy groceries, ice-creams, hot food, clothes, drinks, confectionery, stamps, movie discount cards, phone cards, office supplies, University souvenirs and greeting cards. EFTPOS is available. Balla Art is the Associations art supplies shop that is located in the Camp Street Campus complex. Balla Art carries a

wide range of art supplies specific to the needs of students and is open Monday to Friday.

#### SA CAFÉ/ RELAX INN

The SA Café is on the ground floor of the Union Building. It is an eatery specialising in fresh sandwiches, cooked foods, pies and pastries, and a wide range of drinks and snacks, including weekly specials. It is open Monday to Friday. As well as offering take-away meals, customers can also enjoy a sit-down meal in the relaxing atmosphere. On offer in the Relax Inn are café style meals, cappuccino, hot chocolate, herbal teas, iced coffee, milk shakes, cakes and many more delights.

#### STUDENT ASSOCIATION CRECHE

In a friendly, caring and safe environment, your child can have experiences that promote independence, creativity and increase self-esteem. Taking into consideration your child's physical, social, emotional development, and cultural background, your child will be approached as an individual with respect and due care. The crèche is open from 8.20am-5.30pm Monday to Friday, February through to December each year. Bookings are essential as places are strictly limited.

#### **ACTIVITIES & O'WEEK**

The Student Association organises the extensive program for O'Week and encourages new and returning students to participate and interact. In addition to O'Week, other social activities organised by the Student Association include band nights, comedy nights, pub-crawls, Disorientation Week, BBQ's and much more.

#### STUDENT LOUNGES AND MEETING AREAS.

The Student Association provides areas where students can relax, study or just catch up with friends. A refrigerator, microwave, boiling water and kitchen facilities are available. Additional meeting and lounge areas are provided at both Mt. Helen and Camp St. that can be used by students.

# **CASUAL EMPLOYMENT SERVICE - UniJobs**

The Student Association operates UniJobs, a service that offers students the opportunity to obtain casual employment whilst they are studying at the University of Ballarat, and can also assist students in preparing their resume and applications. An employment notice board is situated on the first floor of the Union Building and usually has a number of jobs for consideration.

#### **CLUBS AND SOCIETIES**

There are a variety of clubs and societies, both sporting and cultural, which operates on campus. Information about these clubs can be obtained from the Student Association Office on the first floor of the Union Building.

#### **SPORT**

The Sport department of the Student Association provides a variety of sport and recreation opportunities for students endeavouring to encompass all interests. Campus sporting activities such as the annual netball challenge, paintball, and fun runs are held throughout the academic year. Students wishing to compete for the University of Ballarat in the AUS South Championships and University Games should contact the Sports Officer in the Student Association office.

#### **UNISPORTS**

Each year the Student Association contributes to UniSports in order to discount student use for facilities such as the pool, gym, aerobics, weights and Toning Point. In addition, the Student Association is able to provide a limited number of UniSports memberships to students who are disadvantaged or suffer financial difficulties.

#### **APPEALS**

Any student can appeal against a grade for any part of a unit or against the final grade for a unit. Assistance with lodging an appeal is available from the Student Association.

#### **INSURANCE**

The Student Association provides insurance cover for all students when participating in University events or activities. If you are injured during your time at the university contact the Student Association to find out what benefits you may be entitled to.

#### REPRESENTATION

There are a number of University and community committees and forums that representatives of the Student Association participate on. If you feel there are issues or concerns that need to be raised we are eager to hear from you.
