Resolution of Council — Reply thereto

Interview — Permission being given Mr Phillips
 attended, and desired this Council to consider

- 1st That he had not been instructed in writing
 to refuse instructing Pupils who had not paid
- 2nd That he declined accepting the responsibility
 sought to be imposed on him by Resolⁿ of Oct. 30.
- 3rd That he would if desired prepare a Scheme
 for teaching different subjects at various times.
- 4th That it was important he should take the
 Pupils into the "field" once a week at least &
 suggested that those who did not choose to
 attend him, might occupy themselves meanwhile
 in the Laboratories
- 5th That he had invented a new and improved
