Mr. Singleton being present (by invitation) offered to classify and arrange the whole of the specimens now in the Museum for the sum of £12.10.0 being the equivalent of a monthly rate @ £150 p annum: he hoped to be able in 4 weeks to have the specimens in due order, and would as far as possible prepare permanent records of same

That Mr Singleton's offer be accepted and that he be requested to commence duty at once
