The Government / Training Department / had obliquely forwarded two certificates to Sydney, and, were about to supply the School with four of these documents for future use.

The following Resolutions were carried:—  
 That Students in Telegraphy be allowed the use of Manipulators during Vacations on lodging as a deposit the value of the Instruments and paying a rent of 7% for the use of an Instrument for the period.  
 That the Registrar wait upon the Manager of the Union Bank and arrange for an overdraft pending receipt of subsidy.  
 That in view of the very serious difficulties arising from want of Funds, and to secure if possible a Grant in Aid commensurate with the growing requirements of the School, immediate steps be taken to urge the Government to a liberal fulfilment of the promises made by the Hon. the Minister of Mines in his place in Parliament on the 23rd June last when <sup>Question asked by Major W.  That the Registrar communicate with Major W. E. Smith M.A. with reference to the above and take such action as may be deemed necessary or advisable  
 That the Registrar write to the President, expressing the desire of this Council to assist the Trustees of the Melbourne Public Library in the matter of a collection of Rocks illustrative of the Geology of the Colony but regret that want of Funds has hitherto prevented the extension of the School's operations to a great degree and particularly as to the establishing of a Museum and the forming of Classes in Geology and Mineralogy, the Students of which subjects could be in the course of study / made to give valuable aid in the direction above mentioned
